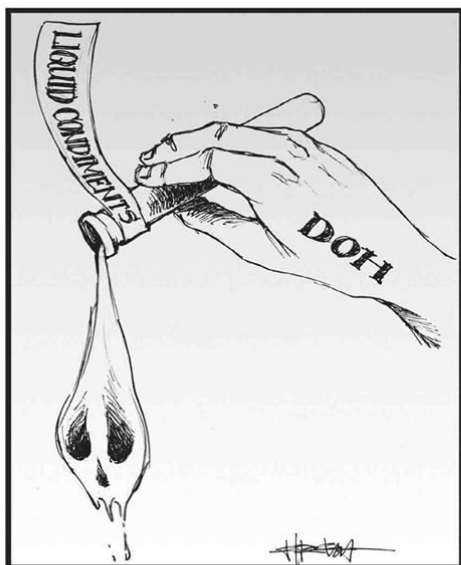

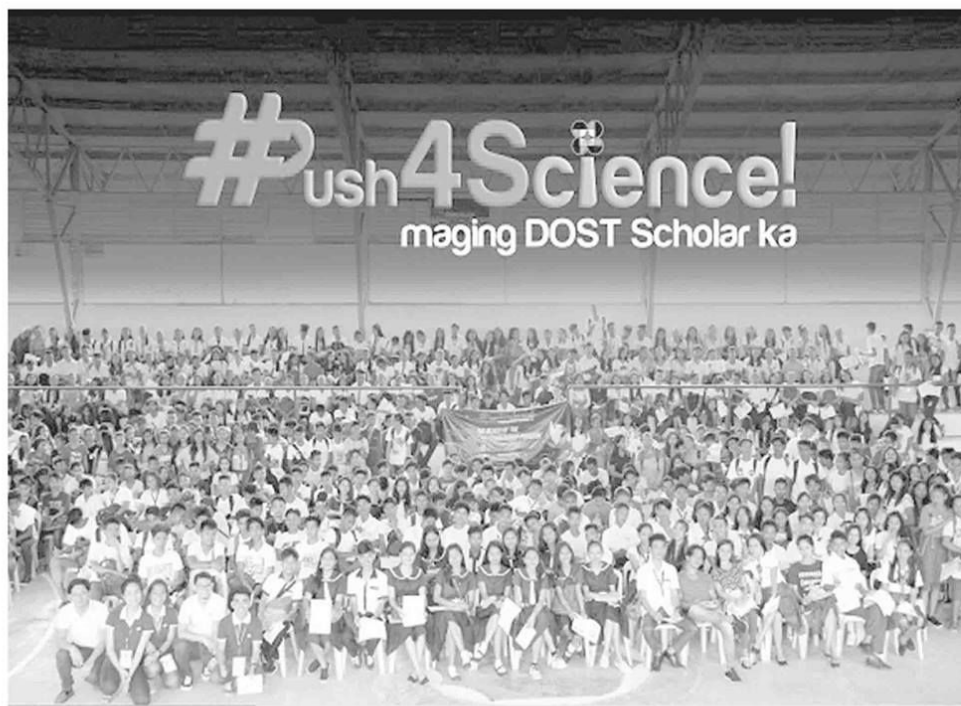

DOST-SEI invites Grade 12 students to apply for S&T scholarships

THE Department of Science and Technology-Science Education Institute (DOST-SEI) is now accepting applications for the 2020 Undergraduate Scholarships Program. Grade 12 students in Academic Year 2019-2020 are encouraged to apply and pursue careers in science and technology.



All applicants must be natural-born Filipinos with good moral character and good health. Application is open to students in the STEM strand but non-STEM students may also apply provided they belong to the top 5% of their graduating class.

Students who belong to families whose socio-economic information meet the cut-off values for certain socio-economic indicators may apply as RA 687 Scholars, while those who belong to families whose socio-economic information are above the cut-off values may apply as Merit scholars. RA 687 Scholarship applicants must also be residents of the municipality for the last four years.

To be able to enjoy the scholarship, applicants should pass the 2020 S&T Undergraduate Scholarships Examination and pursue at least a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree program in any of the priority fields of study at a state university or college or any private higher education institution that is recognized by the Commission on Higher Education as a Center of Excellence or Center of Development with EAAP Level III accreditation for the BS program that they intend to enroll in.

Students may submit the documentary requirements and accomplished application form to DOST-SEI Science and Technology Scholarship Division (STSD) office at the DOST Compound, General Santos Avenue, Bicutan, Taguig City or any DOST Regional Office or Provincial Science and Technology Center. The deadline for submission of application is on September 15, 2019. Date of nationwide examination is on October 20, 2019.

GRAND OPENING OF CAVITE TOURIST INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE CENTER (CTIAC)

THE Provincial Tourism and Cultural Affairs Office (PTCAO) opened the Cavite Tourist Information and Assistance Center (CTIAC) on last May 17, 2019 at RFC Molino Mall in the City of Bacoor to disseminate tourism-related information, promote the province's tourist destinations, and provide assistance to tourists and tourism enterprises. Provincial Tourism Officer Ms. Elinia Imelda Rozelle S. Sangalang and Owner of RFC Molino Mall Mrs. Estrella C. del Mundo led the ribbon cutting ceremony of the newly opened information and assistance center.



Inside the center, local products manufactured by MSMEs are also offered under the umbrella of the Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood and Entrepreneurial Development Office (PCLEDO) to continuously promote and showcase the food, delicacies and handicraft products of the province.

While plan for more strategic location is being undertaken, the temporary location inside the Cavite Local Economic and Investment Promotion Center in RFC Molino Mall, Bacoor City hopes to carry out the

objectives relative to tourist information and assistance. The said center is also one of the requirements to be qualified for the Seal of Good Local Governance Award.

Other guests who are in attendance were officers and members of Cavite Travel and Tours Association (CTTA) and National Association of Independent Travel Agencies (NAITAS)-Cavite Chapter; del Mundo Family, Owner of RFC Molino Mall; and PCLEDO Entrepreneurial Division staff. —(PICAD)

SSS taps local fund managers for P7B funds

STATE-RUN Social Security System (SSS) tapped nine (9) domestic fund managers to manage part of its Investment Reserve Fund (IRF) worth P7 billion to help improve pension fund's earnings from investments.

SSS President and CEO Aurora C. Ignacio said the pension fund deployed P1.1 billion each for three Balanced Fund Mandates, three Pure Equity Fund Mandates, and one Pure Fixed Income Fund Mandate. An investment mandate is an instruction to manage the pool of capital funds, using a specific strategy and within certain risk parameters.

Earlier, SSS opened the bidding to hire nine local fund managers to manage the P9 billion investible funds which are divided equally to three types of mandate namely: Balanced Fund Mandate, Pure Equity Fund Mandate, and Pure Fixed Income Fund Mandate.

Ignacio said the local fund managers underwent an open and competitive bidding and transparent evaluation process. After the bidding process, only P7 billion was deployed to qualified fund managers.

Under the Balanced Fund Mandate, SSS selected the Rizal Commercial Banking Corporation, BPI Asset Management, and Trust Corporation and ATRAM Trust Corporation who will each manage P1 billion investible fund. For Pure Equity Fund Mandate, BPI Asset Management and Trust Corporation, Metropolitan Bank and Trust Company, and Phil equity Management, Inc. will each handle P1 billion investible fund. Meanwhile, BPI Asset Management and Trust Corporation was entrusted to oversee P1 billion investible fund for the Pure Fixed Income Fund Mandate.

"The SSS management believes that it will benefit from the investment value-added services of the fund managers such as training, access to proprietary investment analysis and information and access to business analytics," Ignacio said.

Under the old charter of the SSS, the pension fund is allowed to appoint local or foreign fund managers to manage the IRF.

SSS' investment reserve fund as of the end of 2018 period stood at P495.6 billion wherein bulk of it, or 43 percent, is invested in government securities, 19 percent in equities, another 19 percent in loans to members, 3 percent in bank deposits, 8 percent in corporate bonds and 10 percent in real estate and 1 percent in mutual fund.

"The remaining P2 billion allotted for two local fund managers will be open for rebidding this year," Ignacio

DOH PROVIDES REFRESHER COURSE FOR CALABARZON DENTISTS

DOH-CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, Quezon) yesterday concluded a two-day "Refresher Course for Public Health Dentists" of Quezon province which provided training on the proper applications of fluoride varnish, pits and fissure sealants and glass ionomer cement held in Mandaluyong City from last June 10-11, 2019.

Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo, stated that the regional office will provide the best oral health care to those in need of dental treatment. "We must give our people the right oral care products and the highest standard of treatment for them to really feel that public health service is the best health care service in the country,"

"As public health specialists we must continue to improve our profession in order to protect and advance the welfare and interests of the people, especially those in the community,"

The Regional Office has already completed three batches of refresher course for dentists and is scheduled to conduct two more to complete the training of all public health dentists of CALABARZON.

According to Dr. Edwina I. Go, Regional Oral Health Program Manager, the two-day course aims to promote oral health in the community, provide intervention including the use of fluoride varnish, pits and fissure sealants and tooth extraction for the reduction of tooth decay, especially among children and prophylaxis and restorative treatment for pregnant mothers, high school students, senior citizens,"

Public health dentists likewise were orientated on the Universal Health Care Law including the role of the

public health dentist in the achievement of Universal Health Care and health promotion and preventive interventions for the planning of effective oral health programs.

"Tooth decay or dental caries can be prevented and as parents we must promote oral health care for our children while they are young. We must instill the importance of brushing and flossing daily after every meal," she emphasized.

During the training, participants were also taught on how to use and properly fill-out the revised oral health forms by providing the necessary information including patient's oral health status, services and medical history report.

The workshop also addressed concerns in the computation of intermunicipal multipliers/factors in the determination of national and subnational targets for the use of health sector in the generation of statistical reports.

The 2018 Regional Oral Health Annual Accomplishment report showed a prevalence rate of 26.4 for dental caries and 16.2 for periodontal disease in the region. Batangas province recorded the highest number of dental caries among its population with 88% followed by Laguna province with 84% and Cavite with 78%.

As for periodontal disease, the province of Cavite has

the highest incidence with 24% followed by Batangas with 20% and Quezon with 15%.

To prevent further increase of oral health diseases, Director Janairo provided the provision of surgical instruments (100 forceps) and hand instruments (100 sets of luxators), 30 units of portable dental equipment, 500 dentist's health kit, 5,000 dental hygiene kits, 5,000 adult dental kits, 100 sets of ultrasonic portable scaler, 300 gallons of sterilization and disinfection solution to various local government units. In addition, two dental vans were donated to Binan, Laguna and Camp Capinpin in Marikina, Rizal who will provide mobile dental service to remote areas of the region.

"Slowly but surely we will provide the needed logistics to our public dentists for them to properly provide appropriate preventive care and treatment to the community and also to address other issues and concerns such as the lack of equipment including dental chairs to cater to far-flung barangays and also augment the lack of dentists in other rural areas of the region," Janairo assured.

The Regional Theme for 2019-2020 is entitled "MaTAMIS na NGITI para Sa Lahat". MaTAMIS stands for Maayos na Pamamagitan ng Serbisyo and NGITI for Ngipin, Gamutin, Magatan at Bayan llo.

CALABARZON has a total of 262 public health dentists – 61 provincial health dentists, 29 municipal dentists, 70 city dentists and 102 hospital dentists.

The two-day refresher course was attended by 52 public health dentists from Quezon province.

Six technologies vie for best R&D paper in NSAARRD, awarding June 19

SIX finalists for both Research and Development Categories vied for the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places, with the winning entries to be announced and awarded on June 19, 2019 at the Philippine International Convention Center (PICC), Pasay City in time for the Council's 8th anniversary celebration.

In hopes of winning the Best Research and Development (R&D) Paper, the finalists of the National Symposium for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development (NSAARRD) presented respective entries during the NSAARRD. The NSAARRD was held on April 29, 2019 at the Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST-PCAARRD) Innovation and Technology Center (DITC).

Under the Research Category are "Enhancing Milk Production of Dairy Goats through Indigofera zollingeriana Supplementation" of the Central Luzon State University (CLSU); "Innovation of Boot Trainer Technique and Precision Grafting Technology for Rapid Propagation of Quality Planting Materials of Rubber" of the Department of Agriculture-Regional Field Office 9 (DA-RFO 9); and "Spore Bank Establishment, Propagation and Conservation" of the Central Mindanao University (CMU).

The CLSU study aims to address dairy goat's feed availability through its Indigofera-based pellets, which they coined "Sure Feed for Goats" or "SFEED." On the other hand, the DA-RFO 9 study seeks to provide quality

planting materials of rubber using the Boot Trainer technology. The technology speeds up the growth of seedlings in 5-6 months compared with the conventional method of sowing the whole of rubber seeds in added polybags, which takes 8-10 months. Lastly, the CMU technology aims to address the decline of ferns biodiversity in the country by populating the Spore Bank in the University. The Spore Bank already contains 270 collections of spores from 120 species of ferns.

On the other hand, entries vying for the top place in the Development Category are "CPAR on Integrated Rice-based Farming System Management: Approach towards Community-driven Agricultural Development in Ilocos Norte" of the DA-RFO 1; "Technology Demonstration and Promotion of Mechanized Rice Farming in the Lowland Irrigated Areas in Region 2" of the DA-RFO 2; and "Enhancing Mungbean Production in Ilocos Region" of the DA-RFO 5.

The DA-RFO 1 study details the results of its Community-based Participatory Action Research (CPAR), wherein farmers benefitted from an increased cropping pattern from 20 hectares (ha) to 40 ha and a high net return amounting to ₱3,727.91/ha (344.51% increase) in irrigated areas and ₱1,394.07/ha (164% increase) in irrigated areas. Meanwhile, the DA-RFO 2 study aims to

increase the level of rice production through the use of machines such as the Mechanical Direct Seeder and Transplanter. Lastly, the DA-RFO 5 study employs the strategy of crop diversification to maximize land use and increase income and productivity.

Organized by DOST-PCAARRD, the NSAARRD recognizes the outstanding contributions of individuals and institutions in improving the state of R&D in the country for the interest of the agriculture, aquatic and natural resources sector. (Philippine Press Club, Inc. (PPCI))

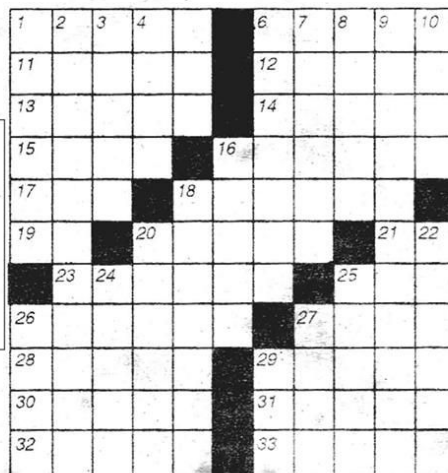

Drug campaign consistently gaining ground: NCRPO chief

MANILA — The recent arrest of a fake Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) employee is another evidence that war on drugs will continue to be relentless, National Capital Region Police Office (NCRPO) chief, Maj. Gen. Guillermo Eleazar said on last Saturday.

"The war on drugs has consistently gained ground against drug personalities, drug lords and even their coddlers. This is another arrest certainly takes part in the amassed successful anti-drug operations of the NCRPO," Eleazar said.

Eleazar said operatives from the NCRPO arrested a member of the 12th of 12th Homes, a cadena de amor in Pasay City, during a buy-bust operation in Las Piñas City on Friday (June 21).

He said the operation stemmed from a tip from a informant that the suspect often introduces himself as a member of the DILG and uses this firearm to

conceal his illegal drug activities.

The NCRPO operatives arrested the suspect while accepting P1,000 bill marked money for one sachet of shabu he sold to an undercover agent.

Seized from the fake DILG employee were seven pieces of small heat-sealed transparent plastic sachet of shabu weighing at least 10 grams and with street value of P68,000, a motorcycle, handgun, black jacket with DILG logo and a Philippine National Police bull ring with batch 2002 logo.

The suspect will be facing charges for violation of the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002.

DSWD help fathers become better "ERPAT"

RESPONSIBLE, great provider, protector. These are some of the qualities of a good father that comes to our mind. Yet in these times of uncertainties, some father unfortunately failed to protect or provide for their families because of circumstances or probably because of sheer ignorance.

The participation of fathers in the lives of the child are most often taken for granted because of the notion that taking care of a child is more like a maternal function than a paternal one.

According to Director Rebecca P. Geamala, DSWD regional director, educating fathers about their role and capacity in the upbringing of a child is crucial to the development of the society. Thus, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) included in the Family Development Sessions (FDS) of Pantawid Pamilya beneficiaries the program for fathers called ERPAT.

"Erpat" must like papa, itay sa Filipino term for father, but in DSWD this is taken more than just a slang word for father. It is an acronym for Empowerment and Re-affirmation of Paternal Abilities.

One of the fathers who benefited from the program is Mr. Rosalito Lisondra, ERPAT leader of Brgy. Kasambagan, Cebu City.

"Ang isa ka lamahan, modelo sa iyang pamilya. Siya ang mag-giya sa iyang pamilya nga natunhay ng mama'yong padulngan sa maganak (A father is a role model to his family. He makes sure that he guides his family, children in the right way)," pointed out Lisondra.

"Nine years old pang lalake, magkat-onako ng pangita ug kwarta (at 9, already knew how to earn money)," recalls Lisondra of his younger days.

The second child from a brood of 4, he used to do household chores in other houses on weekends so that he would have extra allowance to pay for his school expenses.

His parents who were both factory workers in a company earned only meager incomes which could not support the family.

At age 11 until college, he had been selling newspapers to support his schooling. Despite financial difficulties, he was able to reach up to 4th year of BSECE.

In 1990 at the age of 23, he met the love of his life, Grace who hails from Borbon. They got married and blessed with four children.

"Lisod and kinabuhi sa minyo, pero matag adlaw sa akong kinabuhi, magyud kayang sangpitan ng Ginoo ra gyud (Married life is hard, but always call on God every day)."

When ERPAT was introduced in Brgy. Kasambagan in 2009, he then Brgy. Captain and appointed Rosalito as the President of the organization in the community. "Nahimok ng president sa ERPAT madong time in Capt. Jun Jim."

"Akong nakita indot gyud kayang erpat (I observed and could say that ERPAT is really good). Sa ERPAT

orientation gi focus gyud ang pagka responsible nga papa. Ang kadako sa responsibilidad ngadto sa pamilya (ERPAT orientation focuses on how to be a responsible father and how big this responsibility is to the family)," remarked Rosalito.

Despite his busy schedule as a boiler keeper/sales consultant of Multicab Air conditions in a company in Cebu, he manages to attend ERPAT meetings and is never absent even once.
