DOH-CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, Quezon) yesterday opened the first Botika ng Bayan (BnB) in the province of Cavite located in Magallanes, a fourth-class municipality located about 97 kilometers south of Manila and the third in the region.

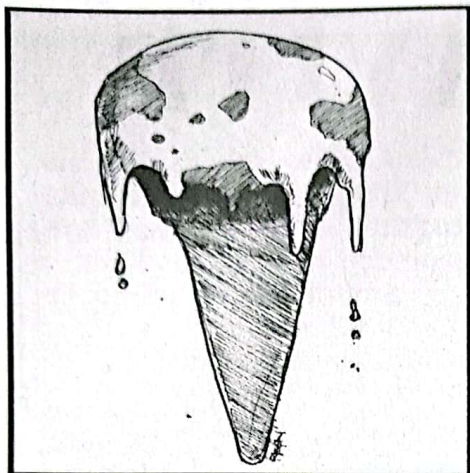

Editorial

Stifling the truth is retrogressive

Of course, the same problems plaguing the country today are the very same hitches that Filipinos have been bearing since decades ago. The perennial poverty, peace and order, pervasive corruption, the secessionist groups, patronage political culture and many more stud the litany of the sorrowful fate that the country seems to have been condemned into.

The perceived election manipulation aside, Filipinos have been seemingly hoodwinked into voting candidates to the highest office of the land believing they were the messiahs, or so they are promised during electoral campaigns, that could transform the Philippines into that relative greatness before the 14

years of Martial Law plundered both its resources and dignity. The country has been retrogressing as its citizens salivating at the progress that has been of their Asian neighbors that, forty or so years ago, were looking up to the Philippines.

Even more painful than the empty stomach of millions of Filipinos is the growing problem of disinformation and the government's seeming intolerance critical dissent. These being the signs that totalitarian governments are made of, making it even more worrisome. Totalitarian governments are centered and subservient to their leaders, not to their citizens, and, therefore, progress, if it happens, is vertical, not horizontal. History is replete with despots who ruled with greed and fleeced their subjects. The first thing that totalitarian leaders do is spread disinformation or propaganda then stifle opposition or critical dissent.

Disputable as it may seem, but there are strong indicators that the Philippines is heading to a future that is not so democratic. Filing charges inciting sedition to people who are telling the truth and critical to the present dispensation but uphold instead liars and con artists does not augur for better Philippines.

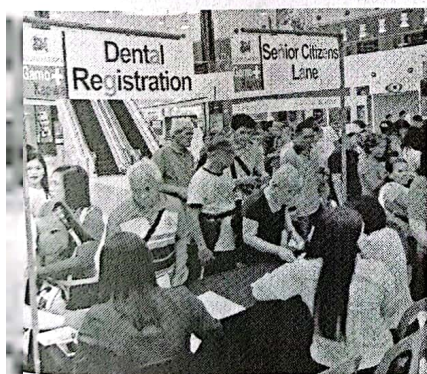

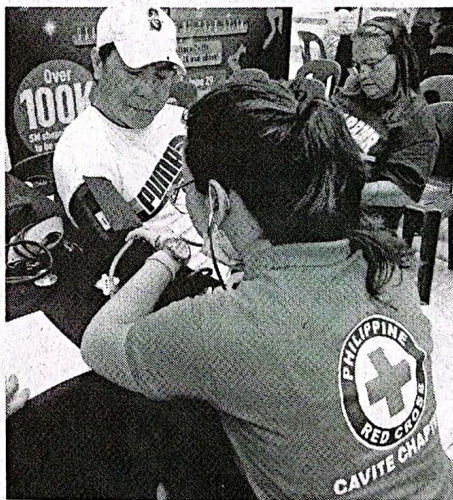

karamdaman. Aayusin natin ito sa lalong madaling panahon para mabigyan natin ng sapat at agarang panlunas sa kanilang sakit. Sa pamamaraan na ito maiwasan natin ang pagkakaroon ng kakulangan ng gamot," he assured the residents.

The regional office opened the first BNB at the municipality of Sta. Maria in Laguna and the second in Mauban, Quezon.

According to Ms. Helen C. Jariel, Pharmacist III and BnB Regional Outcome Coordinator, the regional office provided a total of Php351,752 worth of medicines which includes paracetamol, antibiotics, topical ointments, anti-thrombotic, anti-inflammatory, antihyperlipidemic, antihelminthic, oral hypoglycemic, vitamins, micronutrients, antacids and other essential drugs for asthma, hypertension, diabetes and dyslipidemia even for family planning.

She disclosed that CALABARZON is the sixth region that started the implementation and establishment of BNBs in cooperation and support of local government units.

The DOH aims to cover all 2,600 rural health units and other government centers to have Food and Drug Administration (FDA)-licensed BnB outlets that will provide quality outpatient pharmacy services by 2022.

Director Janairo assured residents of Magallanes, Cavite that their will be adequate supply of medicines at the BNB. "Hindi dito nagtatapos ang serbisyo namin sa inyo dahil ito ay simula pa lamang ng aming pagbibigay serbisyong kalusugan at kasabay nito ang pagpapalawak ng inyong health system kasama na dito ang pagpapalakas ng inyong primary health care system upang mabigyan pa kayo ng mas maunlad na serbisyo. Lahat ng ito ay makakaya natin sa suporta at pakikipagtulungan ng lokal na pamahalaan," he concluded.

PAGAYON GETS RECOGNITIONS ON HIS BIRTHDAY

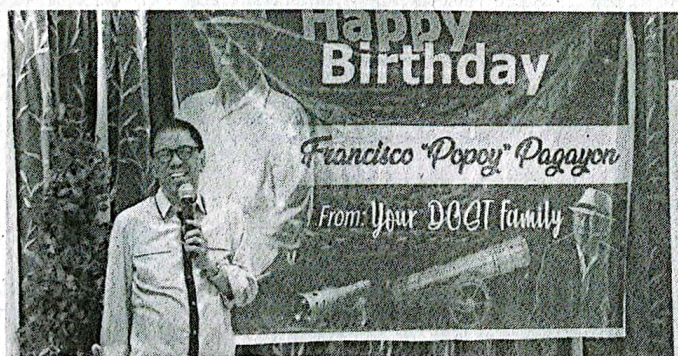

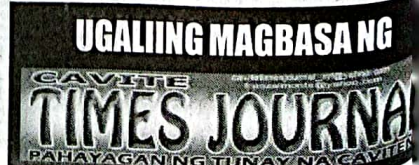

DOH Calabarzon forum promotes awareness to prevent child injury Tagaytay City, Cavite

THE Department of Health (DOH) in Region IV-A (Calabarzon), through its Center for Health Development (CHD), on Friday spearheaded a symposium and workshop at Viewpark Hotel here on child injury prevention in the home, school and community to spread awareness and prevent the incidence of child injury in the region. The Department of Health (DOH) regional office in Calabarzon, in partnership with the Philippine Ambulatory Pediatric Association, Inc (PAPA) and the Philippine Children's Medical Center (PCMC) organized the first ever forum-cum-workshop to broaden knowledge on averting child injury incidence.

"Injuries, just like some diseases, can be prevented if we understand the risks, hazards and we know how to pre-empt, adapt, respond to incidents," said DOH IV-A Child Injury Prevention Program (CIPP) Manager Evelyn C. Dela Torre. Dela Torre added the forum, held

for the first time, also serves as a launching pad for a massive information dissemination campaign to help bring down the number of reported cases of child injury in the region. "The Calabarzon (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon), tops among regions with

highest reported cases of child injury, but some have to be considered in terms of population," she explained. She divulged that of the five child indicators, such as fall, poisoning, burn, drowning, vehicular accidents, some of these incidents happen in the comforts of our own home, which most of us consider as the safest place to be in. She also highlighted the country with varying geographic circumstances, it is highly prone to natural disasters such as earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, tropical cyclones and floods. "We must be prepared," Dela Torre stressed.

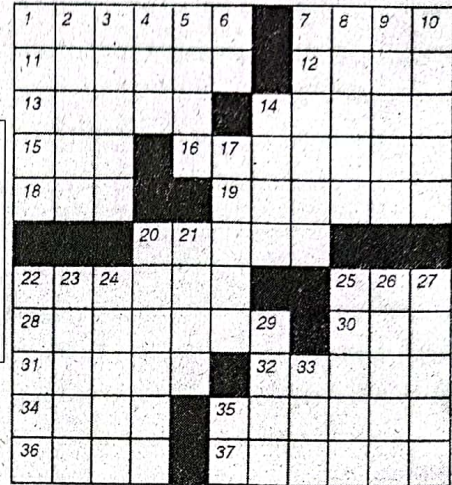

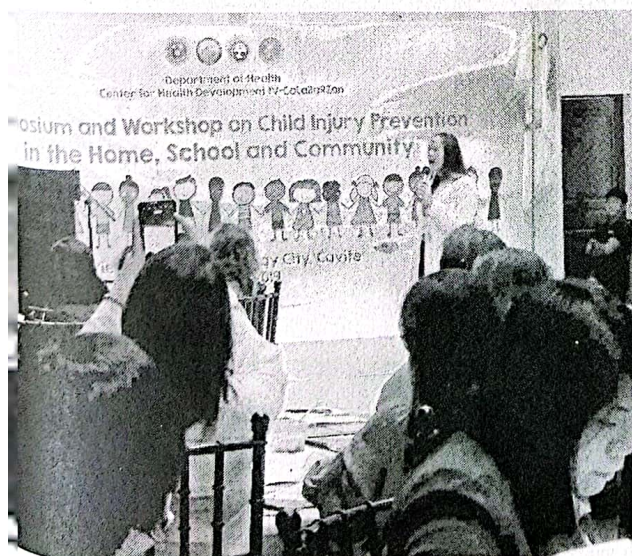

PCMC, DOH IV-A, including United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF) who alternately provided the overview of child injury prevention, identifying the high risk and child injury prevention strategies and in recognizing physical injuries in children and when to suspect abuse. The forum also tackled the use of injury prevention related tools for healthcare professionals, case identification of injuries whether abuse or not abuse and how to conduct effective fire and earthquake drills in school.

Participants representing various concerned agencies like the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Philippine National Police (PNP), private and public schools, and DOH municipal health officers (MHOs) also joined in the table-top exercises and workshops. Officials from the DOH Calabarzon have expressed optimism for the full implementation of the child injury prevention program

after the forum, with quarterly assessment monitoring to check on the strict implementation and

effectiveness of the child injury prevention programs of various concerned units.

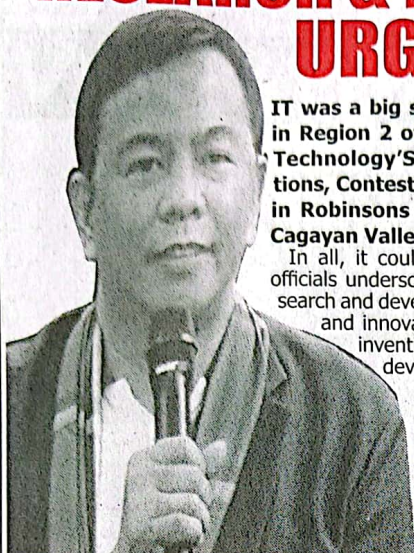

RESEARCH & DEVT. ON SCIENCE, TECH, INNOVATION URGED FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

IT was a big success for the celebration in Region 2 of the Dept. of Science and Technology's (DOST) Regional Inventions, Contests and Exhibits (RICE), held in Robinsons Place Tuguegarao City in Cagayan Valley, Aug. 26-29, 2019.

In all, it could be summed up that DOST officials underscored the need to intensify research and development in science, technology and innovation (STI), "because scientific invention is the mother of economic development."

Region 2 DOST director, Engr. Sancho A. Mabborang, who spearheaded the once every 2 years celebration, said that science has a significant role in the global economic development and stressed the need for more researchers, engineers and scientists, especially in the agricultural sector.

Winners from each category will qualify as finalists for the National Invention Contest and Exhibits (NICE) in 2020.

Mabborang further promised and assured that winners in the contest will be fully supported by DOST and their inventions "polished" to be commercially

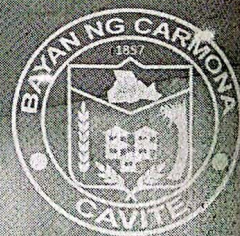
