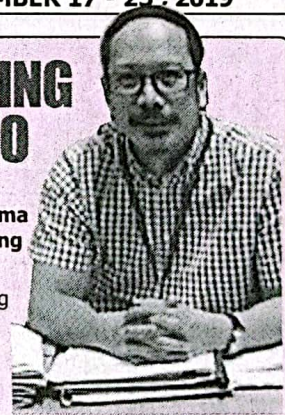



**PDC FULL COUNCIL MEETING**



FIFTY-FIVE members of the Provincial Development Council from different Local Government Units, civil society and private sector organizations convened at the Bayleaf Hotel in the City of General Trias for the 2019 Full Council Meeting held on September 10, 2019. The meeting was called to order by Provincial Planning and Development Coordinator Mr. Jesus Barrera upon determination of quorum by PDC Secretary Ms. Gloria Sarte. This was followed by the approval of the whole provisional agenda by Governor Juanito Victor C. Remulla. The Governor, as chair of the PDC emphasized the significance of working with the same vision to develop programs and grow in a more coherent and responsible manner. He also promoted sustainable agri-tourism in the upland part of the province, as well as shared possible solution to eliminate traffic which is to establish an accessible mass transportation system for the residents. During the meeting, Mr. Barrera endorsed to the body the Executive and Legislative Agenda (ELA) and Capacity Development Agenda (CapDev) 2020-2022 of the province as well as the 2019 Supplemental Annual Investment Program. Likewise, Engr. EnP Lorna Leyran endorsed the 2020 Annual Investment Program (AIP)/Provincial Development Investment Program (PDIP) 2020-2022. Resolutions endorsing the Geographic Sector Representative to the Regional Development Council (RDC), and Creation of PDC Executive Committee (ExeCom), Sectoral/Functional Committees, and Provincial Land Use Committee (PLUC) were approved.

Local government units are also directed to enact stricter ordinances that will strengthen and broaden existing health policies and implement effective programs that promote health literacy and healthy lifestyle among their constituencies to advance population health and wellbeing, reduce the prevalence of non-communicable diseases and their risk factors, particularly alcohol use lower the incidence of new infectious diseases, address mental health issues and improve health indicators.

"Health literacy will give everyone the ability to acquire, process, and understand basic health information and health care services needed to make appropriate health decisions. Kapag limitado ang

We only need to strengthen and enhance the effectiveness and value of the existing health courses and health programs already in place and ensure that proper information is conveyed clearly at the appropriate literacy level," he concluded.

## HEALTH INSURANCE OFFICE CONDUCTS PHILHEALTH ORIENTATION TO CAVITE FEDERATION OF SENIOR CITIZENS



THE Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO) with the Local Health Insurance Office Trece Martines City headed by Ms. Mercedita M. Loyola, OIC-Chief Social Insurance Officer conducted the PhilHealth Orientation for senior citizens on August 29, 2019 at the Provincial Gymnasium in Trece Martines City to impart the various benefits that they can avail from PhilHealth. Ms. Vanessa V. Agetano, Social Insurance Officer tackled the salient points of R.A. 11223, "Universal Health Care Act," while Ms. Aleli M. Ramento, Social Insurance Officer 1 presented the Expanded Primary Care Benefit Package (EPCB). Ms. Agetano pointed out that R.A. 11223 is intended to enhance the provisions under the old PhilHealth Act. One of the important developments was the introduction of system-based claim of benefits where the claimants are no longer required to present their PhilHealth ID or Member Data Record (MDR) for this purpose. Meanwhile, Ms. Ramento introduced different types of PhilHealth membership such as Formal Economy member, Informal Economy member, Senior Citizen Program member, OFW members and Lifetime members. To qualify for a Lifetime membership, the particular member should be more than 60 years of age at the time of application, no longer an income earner and has paid 10 years' worth of PhilHealth contributions. An open forum followed after the discussions and different questions and queries of the elderly were answered and clarified. A closing remark from Ms. Edelyn V. Rodil, Social Insurance Officer II concluded the event.

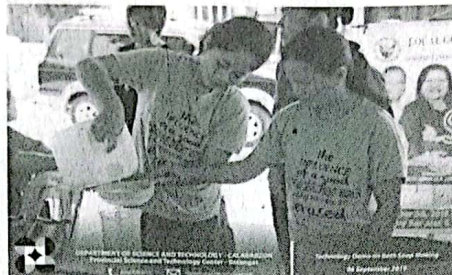

**EIGHT** barangays in Mabini, Batangas consisting of San Jose, Anilao East, Majuben, Solo, Mainit, Bagalangit, Ligaya, and San Teodoro received the technology demo on bath soap making conducted by DOST Batangas in partnership with Soroptimist International of Mabini and the local government held in two different sites, Brgy. San Jose and Solo, last Sept 05-06, 2019.



Recipients of the technology demo were DayCare parents and Brgy. Officials' spouses. The activity was pursued by Soroptimist International of Mabini and the local government to provide livelihood potential to the beneficiaries. On her message, Atty. Gerville Luistro, Municipal Administrator & President of Soroptimist International of Mabini, stressed her strong support to the sectors in need of livelihood. To her, the technology demo is just the beginning of the program support to capacitate the beneficiaries to establish a soap production in the municipality of Mabini. She also acknowledged the assistance of DOST for the implementation of the program and she remains assertive of the agency's assistance throughout the development of the group.

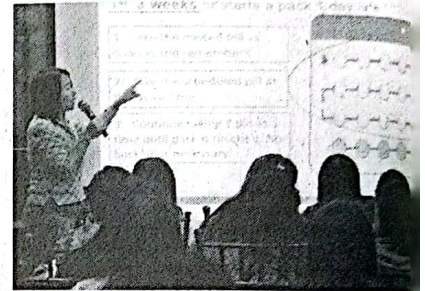
DOST Batangas spearheaded the technology demo through the assistance of Taliba Soap Manufacturing, SETUP beneficiary. Two of the manufacturing's skilled and experienced production workers, Mrs. Luzviminda

Bonsol and Mrs. Aida Marco, served as the trainers during the activity. Lectures which include concepts on bath soap, ingredients composition, formulation, and the do's and don'ts during production were discussed to the participants. Technology demonstration explained the step by step procedures of bath soap making while participants have the steps down on their notes. Hands-on was also conducted to test the learning of the participants. Based from the comments of the trainers, the participants have shown great potential as evidenced by the quality of their produced bath soaps.

Meanwhile, as part of the capacity building program in benefit of these beneficiaries, DOST Batangas in partnership with Soroptimist International of Mabini and the local government will pursue the registration of the group as a worker's association, facilitate community development, and conduct of further trainings. On the other hand, markets identified for the group include the resorts in the municipality of Mabini and community stores.

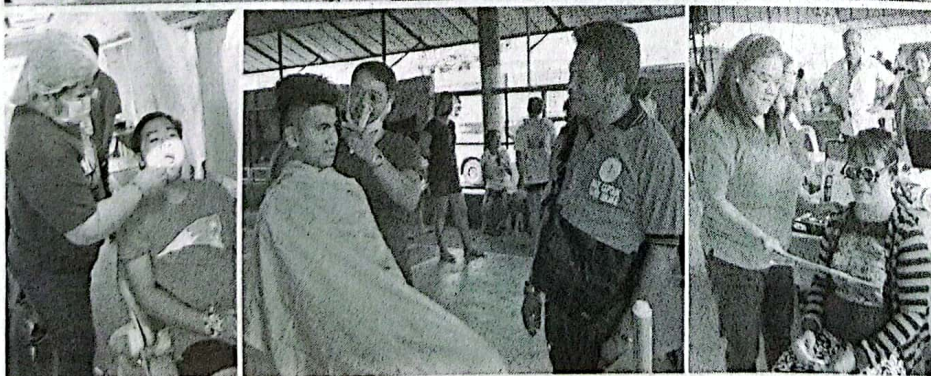
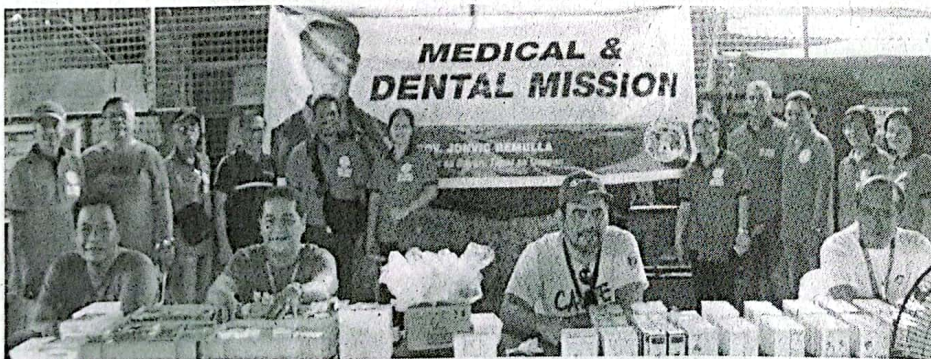

## ANOTHER HEALTH SERVICES FOR IMUSEÑOS



IN its continuing effort to provide basic health services to Caviteños, the Provincial Government of Cavite in coordination with the Office of the Governor-Extension conducted another leg of medical and dental mission at Narra Homes Subdivision Covered Court, Pag-asa 1, in the City of Imus on last September 14, 2019. A total of 226 patients have availed free medical check-up and tooth extraction performed by medical practitioners from General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital. Other services rendered include free hair cut sponsored by Guns and Brushes Beauty Services and Mhar's Barber Shop and free eyeglasses by Guce Optical owned by Dr. Filipinas B. Guce. Punong Barangay Raymond "Samboy" Camama warmly welcomed the medical mission team and expressed his gratitude to Governor Jonvic Remulla for providing quality health care services for his constituents. Officers and members of the Rotary District 3810, Barangay Nutrition Scholars and Barangay Health Workers were also in attendance who supported the event.

Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo stated that front-line care providers, especially those who are newly hired and in rural health units (RHUs) in island barangays must be trained because most of them have not undertaken competency-based family planning training. "We are now on the process of strengthening primary health care as mandated by universal health care (UHC) law and Quezon is one of the provinces where the law will be rolled-out. "Kailangan nating ayusin lahat ng mga mabigyan sila ng sapat na pangangailangan upang magkaroon ng wastong serbisyo pangkalusugan."

"Priority natin dito and mga remote island barangays, mga geographically isolated and disadvantage areas (GIDA), mga front line workers natin sa mga lugar na ito ang nangangailangan ng mga pamilyang nakatira dito upang magkaroon ng maayos na health system. They serve as the first point of contact for patients and families when scheduling appointments, patient follow up, and arranging transportation for patients from the nearest health facility," he stressed.

Janairo added that the regional office has prioritized the training of RHUs from island communities and hard to reach areas to address Zero Unmet Need for mFP as mandated by Executive Order No. 12. The activity will enable them to develop knowledge, attitude, skills and competencies fundamental for the provision of quality family planning services particularly in the area of prevention, client assessment, provision of FP methods (oral contraceptives, injectable contraceptives, and condoms), counseling, and management.

The 2018 DOH-Field Health Service Information System (FHIS) ranks CALABARZON in the 16<sup>th</sup> place on contraceptive prevalence rate (CPR) at 47.51%. CARAGA region has the highest

## GCTA EXCLUDES HEINOUS CRIME CONVICTS — ENRILE

**COVERAGE of good conduct allowance of Section 1 of Republic Act 10592 or the Good Conduct Allowance (GCTA) excluded detainees who committed heinous crimes.**

Former Senate President Juan Ponce Enrile said that the GCTA should not be amended since it was the implementing rules and regulations (IRR), which key Cabinet members of the previous administration created, that should be blamed for the mess that resulted from it.

The octogenarian former senator was referring to detained Sen. Leila de Lima who was then Justice secretary and erstwhile Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) secretary Manuel Roxas II.

In an interview, Enrile explained that the law excluded all detainees who have committed heinous crimes, but this was totally reversed through the IRR, crafted by De Lima and Roxas.

Enrile said that GCTA explicitly excluded among others heinous crimes coverage of the good conduct allowance.

The former senator said this in an ambush interview after the necrological service of the late Sen. Rene Espina at the Senate the other day.

He said that the problem that happened was that the implementing rules and regulations (IRR) of the law.

As far as he remembered, Enrile said, in Section 1 the law, excluded heinous crimes when they approved the law that was sent to Malacañang

to be signed by then President Benigno Aquino III.

But former DILG Sec. Roxas said that there was nothing irregular in the IRR of the GCTA Law.

Roxas added that Article 29 of the Revised Penal Code, which was amended by RA 10592, excludes from those who could benefit from the law recidivists, those who have been previously convicted twice or more times, and those who failed to surrender voluntarily.

Roxas said that Rule IV of Section 3 of the IRR disqualifies heinous crimes convicts from benefiting from the law is not missing in the IRR.

He added that in the IRR all of the said disqualifications may all be found in Rule IV, Section 6.

Enrile, who is also a veteran lawyer, maintained senators at that time reviewed all the provisions of the GCTA Law before they signed it.

He said that whoever included those charged with heinous crimes under the IRR is unconstitutional should answer for all of these problems.

As for former Bureau of Corrections Chief Nicanor Faeldon as an implementor of the law, he has to be guided by the IRR.

"He (Faeldon) is not a law one that should be responsible as those people made that IRR," Enrile explained.

Enrile suggested that amendment should be introduced in the Revised Penal Code which should include the Pardons and Parole (BPP) process of reviewing the prisoners who are eligible released upon the application GCTA.

He added that after the Office of the President should be the final approving authority the release of prisoners.

Enrile supported the President Duterte for the release of the 1,914 convicts released the GCTA Law.

They should surrender as considered as renegades a warrant of arrest is not needed since they were from the wrong application of

publications, Science: Cool Facts, significant dates in Philippine science history and new science articles.

On her message during the inauguration ceremony of the BOOKS program, Ms. Felina C. Malabanan, Provincial Director of DOST Batangas, said that about 3,935 schools across the country already has STARBOOKS as of July 2019. Moreover, to her, STARBOOKS is really suitable to modern-day teaching to help advance the Science and Technology performance of students.

Meanwhile, NBSFI provided 1,000 books to the school beneficiary as part of their Project Aklat and in support to PSFI's BOOKS program. According to Ms. Bea Torres, Executive Director of NBSFI, they are in pursuit of books donation for almost 14 years now. It was actually NBSFI's founder's, Mr. Socorro Ramos, vision to donate books to those who are in need across the country, she mentioned. As referred to their records, they have already donated books to 50 schools in the province.

PSFI Executive Director, Mr. Sebastian Quinones, on the other hand, has mentioned his high hopes that this program would be relevant enough to the students of AES. "PSFI has mastered the art of project implementation and we figure out ways how things are done that's why we make sure that all our projects give a big impact," he added.

As the school beneficiary, AES is thankful enough for having been chosen as the recipient of the BOOKS program with DOST SuperSTARBOOKS and NBSFI's books components. Ms. Darlene Eje, Principal of AES, stressed how these assistances from the three organizations could help their 628 student population. "We are very lucky and blessed to receive this kind of project," she said in Filipino.

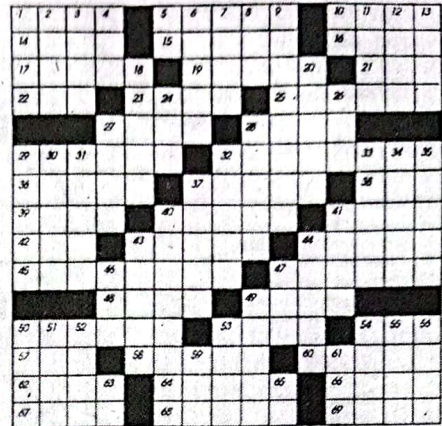

Moreover, the MOU 2019-2023 the partnership of the DTI 4-A and the PCCI is set to transpire to effect the change from government to stakeholder-led advocacy to conduct consumer advocacy and especially in promoting ethical business practice consistent with the provisions of RA7394 or the Consumer Act of the Philippines.

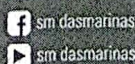
