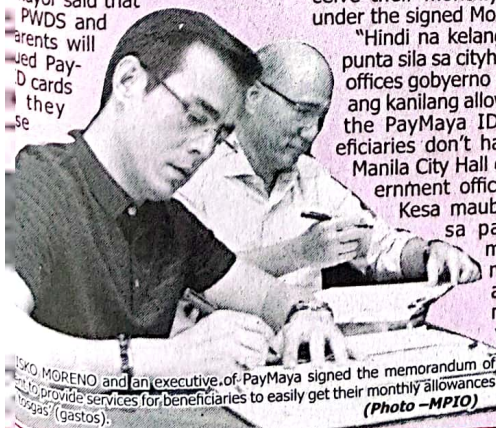

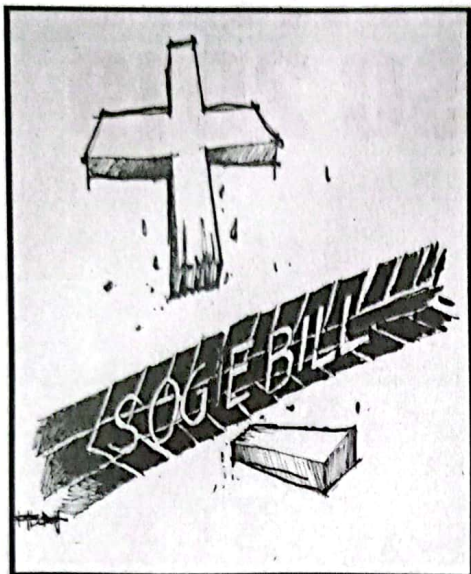

7 dragon boat team members dead in Boracay mishap

SEVEN members of the Boracay Dragon Force drowned when their boat capsized off Boracay Island on last Wednesday morning, September 25.

In an initial report, Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) spokesperson Captain Armand Balilo said the boat was carrying a total of 21 individuals, all members of the Boracay Dragon Force team, when it capsized around 7:40 a.m. Wednesday, in Tulubhan Bay in Barangay Manoc-manoc.

All the 21 persons on board the boat, 20 paddlers, and one steersman, have already been accounted for. Fourteen survived.

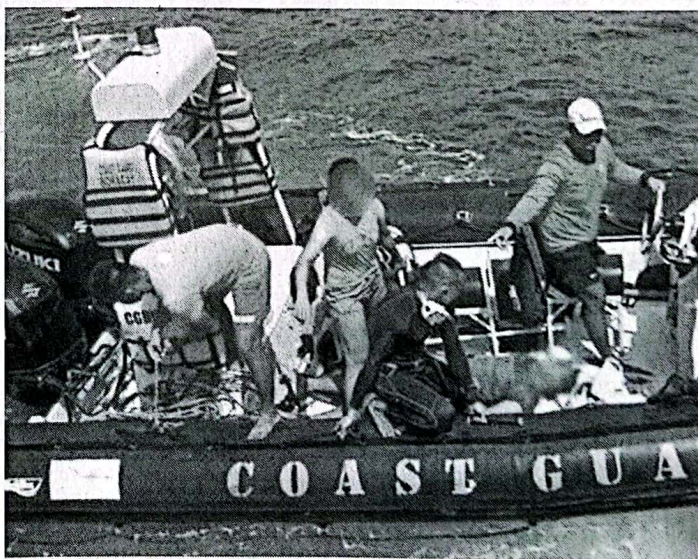
Based on the Boracay International Dragon Boat Festival social media post, the team has been training for weeks at the Bulabog Beach.

A report from the office of acting Malay Mayor Frolibar Bautista said the sea was calm when the paddlers left Bulabog Beach for the White Beach. They encountered big waves caused by a squall about 300 meters from the coast of Barangay Manoc-manoc.

The boat sank and yet the paddlers held on. But big waves and a strong current caused the boat to capsize.

The report said the paddlers were "not wearing life vests and one of the victims did not know how to swim."

Those who drowned were Mark Vincent

Navarrete, Comar Acob, Maricel Tan, Johann Tan, Michel Montoya, Antonette Supranes and John Vincent Natividad.

The Philippine Dragon Boat Federation, in a message posted on its Facebook page, expressed their sympathy for those who perished in the accident.

The federation said it advocates and gives utmost priority to safety given the perils that go with dragon boating, an extreme water sport.

"We encourage the use of personal flotation device during training and requires wearing the same in local regattas to make sure that we avoid incidents that lead to unnecessary loss of life. We also educate our member clubs (on) proper safety protocols in case of capsizing or sinking of boats," the federation stated.

The group said it is

offering its services for free to all dragon boat clubs in the Philippines, including non-members. The Boracay Dragon Force is not a member of the federation.

Last August, the team won a silver medal for the 300-meter mixed standard boat competition during the 4th Kadayawan Festival in Davao.

Heritage and urbanization, how an icon stood the test of time

KAWIT, Cavite -- The province of Cavite, with its plethora of historical sites (not to mention events), is being transformed as an investment hub in the greater capital region. With this changing landscape, how will history play in the backdrop of modernization and industrialization?

In celebration of Museums and Galleries Month this October, the National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP), through its Museo ni Emilio Aguinaldo (MEA), has mounted the exhibit "Emilio Aguinaldo Shrine: Identity on Shifting Landscape" from October 5 to November 22 to present the rich historical and cultural face of the iconic Emilio Aguinaldo Shrine amid recent developments and the influx of migration.

Cluster head of NHCP-Cavite and MEA curator Haidee Paulette Bedruz said Thursday that the theme came about as the construction of new establishments and the imminent completion of a business site offer a new face for the town.

"It gives people new things to see and visit in Kawit, unlike in the past where(in) visiting Kawit means visiting

the Aguinaldo Shrine," she said.

The NHCP has brought this concept to revisit the role the Aguinaldo Shrine played in the town's historical, cultural, and tourism dynamics.

By creating awareness of the significance of built heritage in perpetuating the ideals of the 1896 Revolution and the Proclamation of Independence in 1898 as relevant to the people in the present, Bedruz expressed hope that this would empower Kawiteños to see the value of the Aguinaldo Shrine, "amidst their current progress and continue to associate themselves in the identity of the house."

"As presented in its narratives, it will show how the Aguinaldo Shrine has been part of the larger community of Kawit, allowing it to remain a part of our national history yet relevant to the local perspective of the people," she said.

In recent years, cultural mapping engaged the community and saw the significance of other heritage sites, the Irasan, Pandayan, and the St. Mary Magdalene. In the past, these sites were visited not for tourism but for their actual purposes. Today, they are part of the cultural and historical narrative of the town.

The Museum and Galleries Month is observed in October by virtue of Presidential Proclamation 796 of 1991. This year's celebration theme is "Built Nation, One Exhibit at a Time".

The exhibit also forms part of "Project Bayani: South Luzon", a simultaneous exhibit among members of the Southern Luzon Association of Museums. The exhibit attempts to promote a museum route by creating an exhibit to capture in a single theme the thrusts of participating museums.

The MEA is one of the three NHCP-run museums in Cavite, along with Museo ni Baldomero ni Aguinaldo (also located in Kawit town), and the Museo ng Pambansang Andres Bonifacio (Bonifacio Trial House) in Maragondon.

The museum, located at the ground floor of the Emilio Aguinaldo Shrine in Kaingen village here, is open 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Tuesdays to Sundays.

DOH CONCLUDES BASIC WHEELCHAIR TRAINING FOR CALABARZON PWDS

DEPARTMENT of Health (DOH) – CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, Quezon) on Tuesday, September 17, 2019 started the four-day "Wheelchair Service Package Training Basic Level" for wheelchair users, Person with Disability (PWD) coordinators and caregivers of the province of Rizal held at Ciudad Christia Resort in San Mateo Rizal from September 17-20, 2019.

According to Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo, there are a total of 130 personnel trained from various provinces of the region. "Most wheelchair users are now equipped with the proper knowledge on how to effectively use their devices, render assistance to other users in the maintenance and repair and provide assessment and evaluation in selecting a wheelchair that is suitable for their needs," Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo stated.

"Some PWDs use wheelchairs as their only means of movement, that is why it is important for them to have a wheelchair that fits and properly adjusted to their own physique as soon as they get out of bed and use it and start their daily routine," he added.

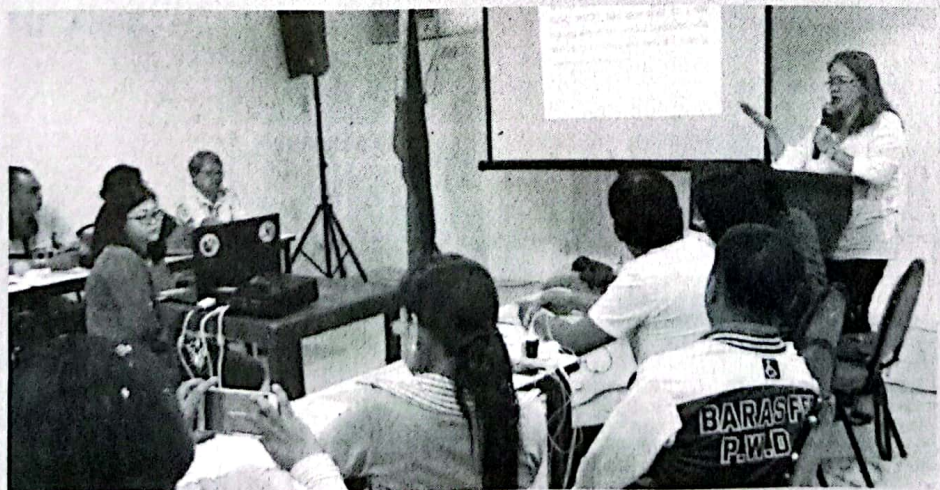
The WHO Wheelchair Basic Level Training includes an 8-step service-delivery process that includes assessment by professionals, the development of a wheelchair prescription with the involvement of the wheelchair user and family, proper fitting and adjustment of the wheelchair, training of the wheelchair user and caregiver in maintenance and wheelchair handling skills, and long-term follow-up for refinements, routine servicing and periodic replacement.

DOH Regional PWD Outcome Manager Paulina A. Calo said that using wheelchairs promote independence and social participation. "Ineffective use of the wheelchair by its user compromises independence and may result to unwanted accidents. Proper skills for positioning and doing pressure reliefs, driving the wheelchair on flat and uneven terrains including navigating in various obstacles, such as stairs, humps, curves and falling safely must also be taught accurately."

One of the participants, Mr. Emmanuel Jamisola, Federation Vice President from Cainta, Rizal and a wheelchair user for 23 years said, "napakaimportante ng training na ito sa aming mga wheelchair users dahil ito pa lang ang training na nakapagbigay ng mga mahahalagang impormasyon at naturuan kami ng iba-ibang pamamaraan sa tamang paggamit kasama na ang pagkumpuni ng wheelchair. The Wheelchair Service Package Training for Basic Level was conducted in partnership with the Philippine Society of Wheelchair Professionals, Inc.

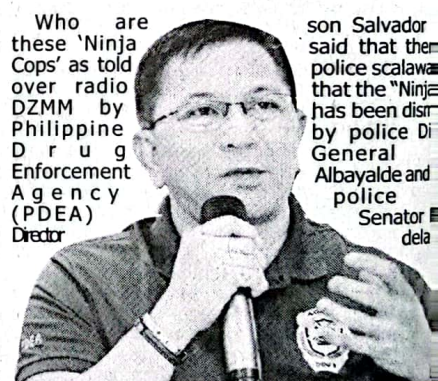

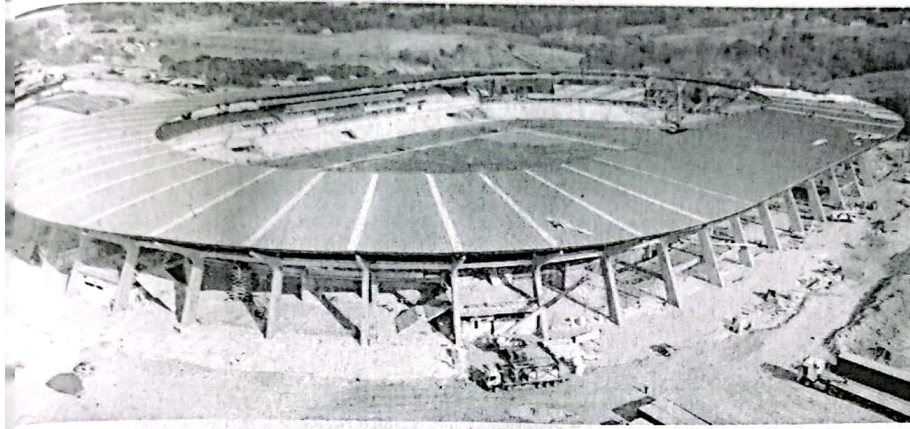

The 2020 ASEAN Para Games is an upcoming biannual multi-sport event to be held still in the Philippines for athletes with physical disabilities. Participants will come from 11 countries in Southeast Asia. This will be the second time the Philippines will host the ASEAN Para Games and its first time since 2005.

Cativo said the Aquatic Center will be the "permanent" venue for all aquatic sports in the Philippines. The same facility will be available for rent by foreign athletes, "who hate too much cold in their own country," for their training. "Their sort of conditioning will be in the Philippines."

The NCC facility will host swimming, water polo for the SEA Games. Other athletic sports like running, high jump, javelin throw, track and field, discus throw, will be held within the sports complex.

The Aquatic Center with a seating capacity of 2,000, is equipped with three swimming pools, a 10-lane Olympic-size pool, an 8-lane training pool and a diving pool. The competition pool has a dimension of 50 by 25 meters and has a depth of 3 meters. The training pool has a depth of 2 meters while the diving pool has a dimension of 25 by 20 meters and a depth of 5 meters.

The facility's entrance is

connected to the main road by a vehicle ramp while pedestrians including persons with disabilities can access the stadium through its side entry points. The lower ground floor hosts parking spaces for 26 cars and ten buses.

As of this writing, a jeepney terminal is nearly completed for public transport in going to and from the NCC.

It was apparent that the Philippines wants to impress the hosting of the 2019 Sea Games, with all workers doing their tasks even in the presence of media people and other guests at the Aquatic Center.

Landscapers were busy planting decorative plants at the center island of the paths leading to the Aquatic Center from the SCTEx or Subic Clark Tarlac Expressway in the newly constructed access roads. It is expected that on or before October 15, contractors working under BCDA will turn over their finished roads and facilities. The Aquatic Center alone covers a little over two hectares.

The JV (Joint Venture) Company will take over the operation and management of the Aquatic Center once all the sports events are over. Around 8,500 workers were hired for the construction of SEA Games facilities.

Aside from building the sports complex, the NCC will host various government offices as satellite branches in preparation for the

possible coming of "The Big One." The Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHILVOCS) earlier announced this year that the magnitude of this earthquake is estimated at 7.2 based on the length of the West Valley Fault, which is around 100 kilometers long. It said that the whole of Metro Manila, parts of Bulacan, Rizal, Cavite, and Laguna will experience an Intensity-Eight earthquake that is categorized as "very destructive."

Bondoc said that among the offices set to be backed up by satellite offices in NCC include Office of the Civil Defense (OCD), National Bureau of Investigation (NBI), Dept. of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), to name some.

The construction of the National Government Administrative Center (NGAC) in New Clark City also ensures the efficient delivery of services as national agencies seek to locate in a master planned metropolis that is also more resilient and sustainable.

NCC is envisioned to be the first "smart, green, and sustainable metropolis" in the country. The govt. does not want to paralyze the delivery of services to the people in case of earthquake and other disasters," Bondoc said. "This is also solution to the traffic woes in Metro Manila," Cativo echoed.

The media people also got a glimpse of the other facilities, including the location of the Athletes

Village which is the first world-class living quarters for the SEA Games athlete participants.

Cativo said the athletes will be accorded VIP treatment during their stay in the "village." This was constructed inside the sports complex for easier access to the sports facilities and some five-minute walk to the Aquatic Center. The Athletes Village will house some 2,900 participants - athletes, coaches, trainers and delegation officials. The five-storey facility was designed by Budji Royal Architecture Design that features 525 rooms, 310 of which are PWD-friendly. It also offers gym facilities, conference rooms, kitchen and dining rooms, conference rooms, a transport plaza and recreational facilities, along with a 24/7 dining hall, entertainment and leisure center, event plaza and village mall.

BCDA President and Chief Executive Officer Vivencio Dizon in earlier reports, highlighted BCDA's mandate to transform military bases into premier centers of economic growth, according to published reports.

The amount of P8-billion, represents 20 percent of the total P40 billion received by the men and women in uniform from BCDA since the state-run agency was created in 1992.

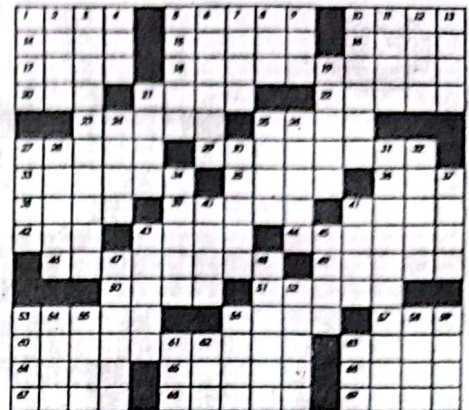

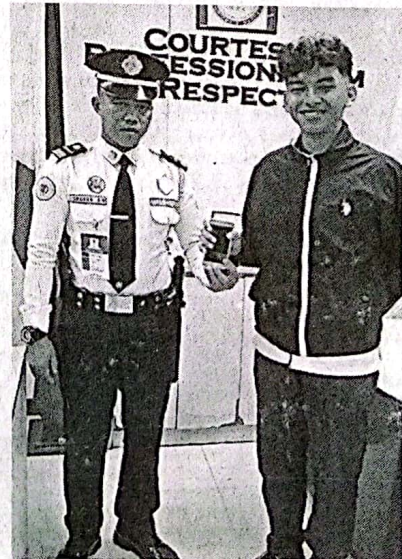
