The Clean-Up Drive was aimed to combating the dengue menace and to enjoin Kawiteños to actively participate and support environmental awareness.

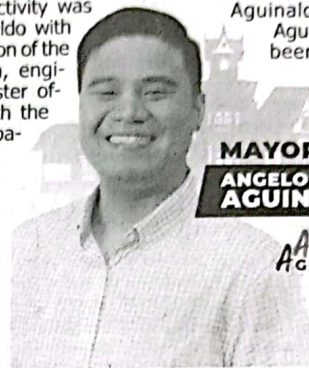

Sustained basic services delivery for peace and internal security



LOCAL chief executives of cities and municipalities in Cavite, regular members from provincial government offices, national line agencies, academe and civil society organizations convened at the joint 3rd Quarter Meeting of the Cavite Provincial Peace and Order Council (CPPOC) and the Anti-Drug Abuse Council (PADAC) on September 26, 2019 at The Bayleaf Hotel, City of Gen. Trias.

In the report delivered by Col. Cesar Fernandez of the 202 IB of the Philippine Army during the meeting, the AFP recommends to sustain the delivery of basic services, livelihood and development projects especially in critical areas and vulnerable sectors to curtail the infiltration of communist terrorist armed groups and ensure internal security in the province. In addition, they also urge to fast track the Declaration of Persona Non Grata of communist groups in the municipalities down to barangay level in accordance with President Rodrigo Duterte's Executive Order No. 70 stipulating the creation of a National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (ELCAC).

Col. Fernandez shared that although there is no

terrorist armed group presently operating in the province, the enemy is likely to exploit different issues to further their armed struggle particularly in the labor sector, the youth and students, the urban poor and the transport sector.

DILG OIC Provincial Director Eloisa Rozul lauded the efforts of Maragondon-LGU headed by Mayor Reynaldo Rillo for its proactive stance against attempts of undesirable groups to infiltrate their vulnerable communities in Barangay Patungan and Pinagsanhan through the provision of basic services and other assistance to affected families.

Updates on peace and order situation was reported by Police Maj. Jonathan Asnan showing a notable

37.5% decrease in the crime statistics from January to September 2019 with 980 as compared to the same period in 2018 with 1,567 recorded crimes.

The alarming case of dengue outbreak was discussed during the meeting. There were 292 cases of dengue reported from January to September 19, 2019 with 51 deaths. Dr. Nestor Soriano, head of the Provincial Epidemiology Surveillance Unit emphasized that the dengue outbreak is public safety concern that must be promptly and rightly dealt with since it has been a recurring problem in the province for years. He called on the LCEs to help the health department in dealing with the issue particularly in terms of legislations that will lay down stricter rules and impose penalty as necessary to mobilize the people to do their share in battling dengue.

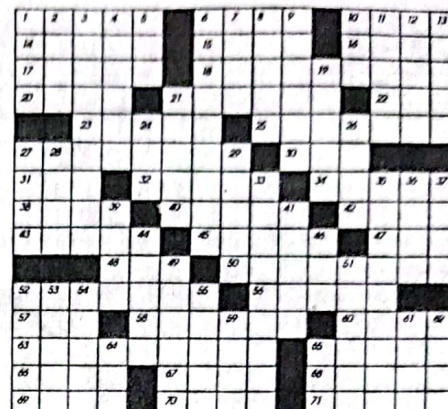

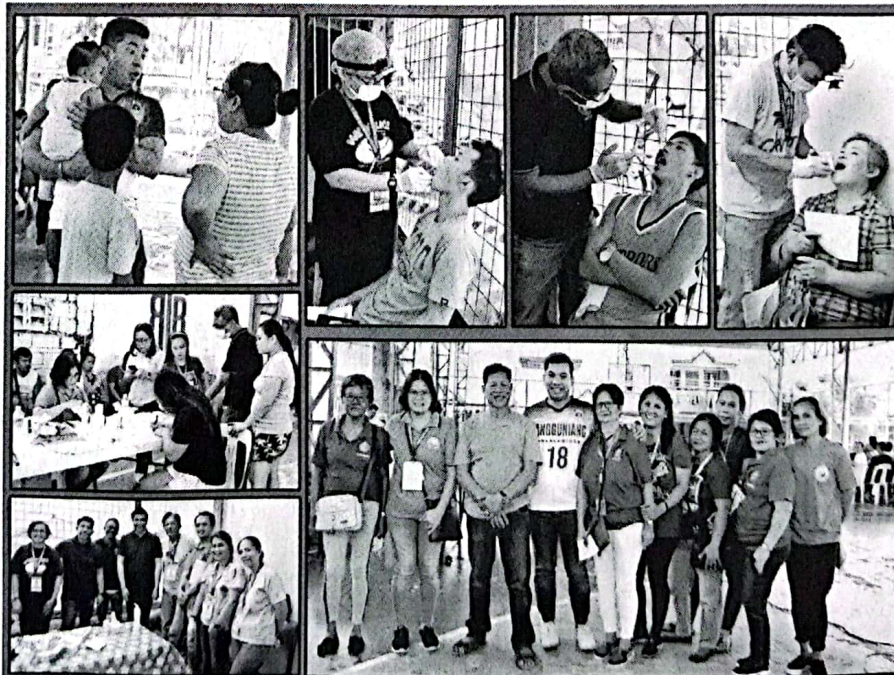

City Veterinarian Office chief Dr. Ma Belle Depayso, city market administrator Med Abad, together with Vice Mayor Ony Cantimbuhan, City Councilors Larry Nato, Mon Mon Arguelles, Miong Aguinaldo, Tito Monzon, Lloyd Jaro, Totie Ropeta and members of the meat vendors' association here joined the 'delicious pork meat' food treat.

Bystanders, some meat buyers and market tenants enjoyed the fried pork chops, menudo, and other dishes of pork meat.

Dr. Depayso said that her office has been monitoring piggeries in the city to ensure that pigs being slaughtered at the city slaughter house are free from ASF virus.

Abad told this paper that since the ASF infestation broke out, prices of pork products here have gone down.

"Talagang malaki ang naging epekto ng ASF, and we hope that this boodle fight na kasama natin sina Mayor Maliksi, Dra. Depayso at mga konsehal natin, malalaman ng ating consumers na pork meat products sa ating Imus market ay safe na kainin," said Abad.

Vice Mayor Cantimbuhan said that the Sanggunian Panlungsod has a contingency plan in place in the event of a suspected ASF outbreak.

"Ipinamo-monitor po natin ang mga piggeries sa ating lungsod. Kung may mabalitaan kami na may baboy na namatay, we immediately inform our health and veterinary officers para maaksiyonan nila agad nang hindi na kumalat ang ASF virus. Ang kaligtasan ng mga kababayan natin ang pinakamahalaga sa lahat," Vice Mayor Cantimbuhan said.

"Kung may report na dead swine dahil sa sakit, agad po nating ipinalilibing and the area is immediately disinfected. Ipinasusuri din natin ang mga baboy kung sina ay na-infect na ng virus," said Dr. Depayso.

She added that blood samples of dead pigs are being collected for laboratory analysis.

The lunchtime treat was initiated by Mayor Maliksi to assure the public that swine meat products in the city are safe to eat and are not affected by the ASF disease.

The Mayor warned meat vendors to refrain from selling pork meat coming from other unknown sources and do not have the usual inspection by the National Meat Inspection Service.

"Gusto rin nating ipaalaala sa ating manininda na tiyaking nasa hustong timbang ang karneng ibinebenta natin. The City Government is closely monitoring every movement of meat products, especially pork para sa kaligtasan ng ating mga mamimile.

Unang - una, ipinaaalang natin na walang ASF dito sa ating lungsod. Siyempre, gusto natin kunin ang suporta ng lahat ng mga sektor. Mayroon po tayong guidelines na mahigpit na ipinatutupad upang hindi makapasok ang ASF dito sa ating lungsod, so kailangan namin ng inyong tulong be vigilant na ma-enforced natin ang mga guidelines kasama ang ating City Veterinary Office,"

said Maliksi.

The mayor added that city health officials are continuously coordinating with all concerned national government agencies that have the mandate to prevent the spread of the swine disease.

Maliksi also urged city backyard hog raisers to immediately notify the city veterinary and agriculture officers if their pigs show symptoms of illness so that action could be taken at once.

"Kung namatayan kayo ng alagang baboy, ireport nyo agad. Mahalaga ang kalusugan ng publiko para hindi na kumalat pa ang sakit na ASF sa ating mga alaga," said Maliksi.

Ang **African Swine Fever (ASF)** ay isang nakakahawa at nakamamatay na sakit na nakakaapekto sa baboy. Mga senyales na maaring makita sa baboy na infected ng ASF:

- Mataas na lagnat
- Walang ganang kumain
- May mga pasa (hemorrhages) sa balat
- May internal bleeding

Pwede mamatay ang mga ito sa loob lamang ng 2-10 araw matapos makitaan ng mga sintomas ng sakit. Wala pang epektibong bakuna at gamot laban sa ASF kaya mataas ang tsansang ikamatay ito ng mga baboy pag sila ay tinamaan.

Tandaan na ang ASF ay **HINDI NAKAKAHAWA SA TAO** kung hindi sa mga **BABOY** lamang na pwedeng

makahawa sa iba pang baboy.

ANO ANG MGA DAPAT GAWIN PARA MAIWASAN ANG PAGKALAT NG ASF.

- Para sa mga nag-aalaga ng baboy, magpakain ng kaning baboy (Swill Feeding) o magtirang pagkain na galing sa mga restaurant, karinderia na maaring makainfect sa mga baboy.

- Paigtingin ang tamang biosecurity sa mga backyard maging backyard man ito o commercial. Bago pagsilang ang mga bumibili, at mga tao na pumupunta sa mga babuyan, siguraduhin umapak sila sa foot bath na disinfectant maging ang mga sasakyan ay dapat infect.

- Bawal pagdala dito ng mga pork at pork by-product mula sa mga bansang may ASF maging sa mga ditto sa Pilipinas na apektado ng ASF. Maging kung may mga nagtitinda at nagpapadala nito sa lugar.

- I-report sa City Veterinary Services Office kung may namatay dito na mga alagang baboy. Huwag itapon sa ilog o kung saan man.

SAFE BANG KUMAIN NG KARNENG BABOY, YES, LIGTAS ANG KUMAIN NG KARNENG BABOY

Siguraduhin lamang na ang binibilhan ay nagkarang karneng galing sa accredited na katayan. Hati ng Meat Inspection Certificate at tingnan kung tatak ng NMIS at may nakalagay ng **"Inspected and Passed."** Ibig sabihin dumaan ang karneng masusing inspeksyon sa slaughterhouse.

Patuloy din ang suporta ng Pamahalaang Lungsod ng Imus sa pangunguna ni Punong Lungsod Emmanuel L. Maliksi sa mga meat dealer kampanya nito para sa ASF Free na lungsod. Sinisigurado rin ng lokal na pamahalaan na ligtas ang mga karne sa mga pamahalaang panglungsod.

Nais din ng Pamahalaang Lungsod ang pakikipagkalo sa mga hakbang nito laban sa ASF at ang pagtangkik sa lokal na karne. DUTERTE DEFENDS WAR ON DRUGS IN SOCHI FORUM

PRESIDENT DUTERTE will not stop on his war on

Russian think tank forum in Sochi, Russia, Duterte defended his critics and said he will continue his war on drugs. He said his administration only want to protect the country from those who wish to tear it apart.

At the forum, he said, as he fly and ready to go back to the Philippines, there are two general who are still playing with drugs.

Right now, even as I fly here and go back. There are again two generals who are still playing with drugs. Duterte said in the forum attended by other world leaders, Russian officials, policymakers, international academicians and journalists.

He made the revelation as the Philippine National Police Chief, Director General Oscar Albayalde, is now under investigation for his alleged involvement in an illegal recycling, years ago when he was Pampanga police chief.

He did not disclosed the names of the two police officers who he said are still "playing" with drugs. He said at the forum, the President said that he will not let the country to be destroyed by illegal drugs.

He said, that he is not only fighting corruption from the government.

He said, fighting...corruption and the trafficking of drugs from my government. And that is why I had to do this very fast," he added.

49 ASPIRING YOUNG ENTREPRENEURS GRADUATED IN PCLEDO BIZ iCREATE BATCH 2

AIMING to empower future young entrepreneurs, the Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood and Entrepreneurial Development Office (PCLEDO) and World Vision Development Foundation, Inc. facilitated the last session of BIZ iCREATE- Cavite's Responsible Entrepreneurs Aiming Toward Economic Sustainability for the Youth Sector on September 27, 2019 at the PCLEDO Training Area, CaCoDec in Trece Martires City.

The last session involved the business plan presentation of the nine groups, divided into 2 sets with each group given 20 minutes to discuss and defend their business plan. Panelists were Cavite State University-Main Faculty Researcher Mr. Zandro M. Catacutan, Vice President of M2B Commercial & Trading Corporation Mr. Michael Bacanto, Technical Program Manager on Economic Development of World Vision Mr. Cesar M. Bautista for Set 1 while Owner of Aqua 4A & Reclusado Marketing Mr. Allan G. Reclusado, Owner of Precious Knowledge Training Center Ms. Angelina M. San Pedro and Program Manager on Economic Development of World Vision Mr. Douglas Chua were for Set 2. During the presentation, panelists recommended ways on how to enhance their products and services, shared insights on how to handle their target market and how to identify proper packaging, brand name and pricing. They also underscored the significance of being unique in the business industry.

Forty-nine young aspiring entrepreneurs consisted of Pag-Asa Youth Association of the Philippines (PYAP) members from different cities and municipalities successfully completed the Batch 2 BIZ iCREATE training. The graduation ceremony was held at the Ceremonial Hall of the Provincial Capitol Building in the afternoon. They were congratulated by Provincial Administrator for Community Affairs Mr. Alvin Mojica who shared the reason behind why PYAP has been very close to his heart, as he was once a PYAP member in his early years. He encouraged the young ones to finish their studies and pursue a job or put up their own business.

In order to support the business journey of the young hopefuls, the local government gave cash incentives that will serve as starting capital for their small business. Likewise,



Mr. Bautista of World Vision Development Foundation, Inc. expressed his appreciation to the administration for being aggressive and active in boosting entrepreneurship in the province.

Dr. Aldrin P. Antivola, BIZ iCREATE Resource Person, compared the journey of graduates to the cycle of caterpillar that turns out to be a beautiful butterfly and to an eagle who knows how to soar high.

Highlight of the program was the announcement of winners for Best in Business Plan which was awarded to the City of General Trias (Chicken N' Marbles) coached by Mr. Reclusado and City of Dasmariñas (Brownnut Company) coached by Mr. Bacanto.

On behalf of BIZ iCREATE Batch 2, Ms. Miriam Salacayan took the opportunity to thank everyone who has been part of the program. She shared that it is not easy to manage a business as it needs focus and strong determination to make it work.

Lacson advocated for equality by removing discrimination and shared some examples showing unequal treatment between men and women in society. He also stressed out that a good husband should know how to treat his partner right, quoting "Gawin mo yung tama siguradong hindi ka magkakamali". Likewise, former Board Member Irene Bencito urged the lawmakers to put an end on gender stereotyping. She added that in order to gain respect, one should also treat people with respect.

The seminar was led by PCPT Renalyn P. Lim, Chief of WCPD and Social Welfare Officer II Rodolfo C. Buhay, RSW. PCPT Lim reported the VAWC situation and problems of LGUs based on the data gathered from January 2018 to August 2019. In 2018, out of 603 children cases, 207 were physical injuries/intentional mutilation cases and 153 rape cases while as of August 2019, out of the total 300 cases, 88 were physical injuries/intentional mutilation cases and 72 were other acts of abuse which mostly happened in the City of Dasmariñas, Bacoor and Imus. She also elaborated the Anti-Photo and Voyeurism Act (RA 9995) reiterating the liabilities and penalties to be imposed in committing the crime and violating the law. She reminded everyone to use social media wisely and always think before they act or share.

Topics on Gender Based Violence, Anti-Violence

Against Women and their Children (RA 9262) and Anti-Human Trafficking (RA 9208) were conversed by Mr. Buhay. He provided the ratio of VAWC classified into physical, sexual, pregnant women violence. He also tackled the 3 elements of trafficking which are acts, means and purposes and said that this kind of crime can be reported to the barangay, the PNP and local social welfare office.

During the discussion, representatives from Office of the Provincial Governor Mr. Bherlie Razon and Mr. Albert Sañez shared their own perceptions about the training course. Mr. Razon encouraged them to have a balanced and equal treatment between men and women while Mr. Sañez shared his belief that women deserve to be loved not to be hurt.

To determine the effectiveness of the program and draw commitment, participants were asked to write down what they will do to end violence in the aspect of personal, family and in the workplace.

As a response, representative from PG-Enro Mr. Arnel Paredes underscored the importance of respect regardless of gender, age and beliefs while Dasmariñas City WCPDO Maria Victoria Divina hoped that the lecture will serve as motivation for participants to use their voice in eliminating violence to the community.

In closing, Social Welfare Officer III Ms. Henelyn Lapizar left a word of advice reminding participants to share with their colleagues what they have learned, encouraged them to put it into practice and as a public servant, always lend a helping hand to others.

DOH "TANGLAW" SHINES IN POLILLO ISLAND

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (DOH) - CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, Quezon) on Thursday, September 26, 2019 launched the second "TANGLAW" (TB Agapan, NGayon Lunasan at Wakasan) TB-Free Island Initiative in Polillo Island in Quezon "TB Agapan, NGayon Lunasan at Wakasan" to eliminate tuberculosis in remote island municipalities through the provision of adequate and responsive delivery of health care services.

"Sa pamamagitan ng programang ito, pipilitin natin na wakasan ang tuberculosis sa isla ng Polillo kasama na dito ang mga kalapit nitong munisipyo at atin ring hahanapin ang lahat ng mga taong may TB sa buong isla upang sila ay maalagaan, mabantayan at mabigyan ng gamot at hindi natin sila pababayaan hanggang sa sila ay gumaling sa sakit na tuberculosis," Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo stated during his message at the launching program held at the Polillo Sports Complex.

"Hanggang ngayon, 85-90% pa rin ng Pilipino ay mayroong tuberculosis. Kaya sa pamamagitan ng TANGLAW at ang TB-island free program natin, lahat ng mga maysakit sa TB na ating mapapagaling ay sisiguhin nating hindi na mababalikan ng sakit dahil ang karaniwang TB ay pabalik-balik kaya nagkakaroon ng resistance ang mga pasyente at ito ay hindi natin papayagang mangyari," he emphasized.

Janairo also said that the regional office will conduct a massive TB screening of all the residents of the island from children to adult, for them to be diagnosed and be given immediate

treatment to prevent the infection from spreading in the community.

The DOH-CALABARZON Strategic TB Elimination Plan was developed to prevent, find and treat, and finally put an end to TB.

According to Regional NTP Outcome Manager and Head of the Communicable Disease Unit, Dr. Maria Elena C. Gonzales, who also developed the "TANGLAW" acronym for the program, three pilot sites for the TB-Free Island Initiative was chosen as pilot sites namely Tingloy in Batangas and Polillo in the province of Quezon. "The project has three phases which includes preparation and advocacy; search, treatment and prevention; and eliminate and sustain. We will endeavor to eradicate TB in the islands of CALABARZON and after a year expect to declare it all TB-Free," she added.

A two-day medical and surgical mission was also conducted which includes free Chest X-ray Screening, GX Testing, Health Education through Interactive Panels, IEC Distribution, HIV Counselling & Testing, Condom Distribution, Deworming & Health Education, Skin

Disease Consultation "Kilatis Kutis", Distribution of Insecticide Treated Nets, IEC materials, Dengue NS1 RDT, Malaria RDT, Maternal Health: Buntis Kit (50), Hgb & Glucose Screening, Health Education, Dental Examination, Oral Prophylaxis, Fluoride Application, Fit & Fissure Sealant, Dental Kits (provision of 150 dental kits for 150 Adults & 100 Children), Micronutrients Distribution, RBS, BP Taking, Consultation, urinalysis, medical consultation, distribution of medicines, vitamins, antibiotic, ointment, mefenamic acid, and compact medicines.

A total of 25 wheelchairs wheelchairs were distributed to PWDs, one flat TV set was donated to the

municipal health center.

A Happy Servant

By G.S. Atas (SGOD)

A FAMOUS Hollywood actor, Arnold Schwarzenegger, once said to help others and get something back. I guaranteed you will discover that while public service improves the life and the world around you, it's greatest reward is the enrichment and new meaning it will bring to your own life.

That makes me think of what is the essence and meaning of my life before I reached this point.

As I reminisce about my life for a year as a contractual teacher in a private school. As a newly graduate, my mind was full of ideas for what I have learned at PNU-Manila. I took care of children ages 5 and below, feeding their minds with knowledge, teaching them good values and etiquettes, socials and grooming made easy for me but the struggle was on the part of disciplining extreme children in class who were pampered and spoiled by their parents that made it difficult for me to instill the reality of life for them.

Then I pushed myself to be in the public school system. I was assigned to a remote barangay. There I faced challenges. In a school with less needed facilities, furniture, and supplies I exerted more efforts to connect with the parents and communities for the support of their material needs in school to make their children feel the safe and relaxing atmosphere in the classroom. In return, I had done my duties to my pupils as their second parent or older sister in school.

Being single at that time, my salary was enough for me to extend support in preparing my instructional materials, adopting my less fortunate pupils as to give them regular extra "baon" for fare and food and even buying school supplies for

them. Sometimes, I brought my pupils at home during weekends and coach them if they have upcoming contests. I exerted efforts after my class to provide them remediation especially in reading and mathematics. I visited my pupils and walking extra miles to reach those who live near the creek, slopy area, and far-flung area just to see them okay.

I spend time to confer with parents at home, explaining to them the importance of education to their children, because parents rather than being a tricycle driver. By then, when most of the community sold their lands to the business tycoons, there were difficulties for them, to send their children to school, not because of money but because at that time, having money for them is enough. I never gave up on my pupils, but I came up and show them I care. Happy to say that I won this battle—no one in my class dropped.

With this effort, I became our school representative in district activities—became teachers club president, school representative to LGUs, winning coach, winning teacher-participant, and awarded in 1997 as District Outstanding Teacher. Then I pursued my postgraduate study to make me more equipped with knowledge and skills that I share with my teachers and colleagues.

When I became Teacher-

In-Charge in another school and promoted as Teacher III, the same level of expectations from my superiors and my colleagues never changed. At that time, I remember the saying "Walk your talk." I doubled my efforts especially when I have my own family to take care of. To lead teachers in school is difficult. You need to be firm in any decisions. I sacrificed not being with my children in school. I sent them to far school from me; just to make teachers follow the school rules about limitations in taking care of their children while working in teaching. How I wish I could eat lunch with my children and be with them when they need. Another is the struggle between imposing what mandates us to do from the DepEd Orders issuances, Magna Carta, and Memoranda against what exists in the school from their old and negative practices of the community or neighbors where most of them are relatives of my spouse.

I experienced managing the school with mobile patrols and police who rendered services for security inviting us to present, and arguing with strong personalities or politicians, DepEd officials and my spouse's family members to the school's site ownership and dispute of claiming the land against the heirs. The school was barricaded and all classroom doors

were locked by the owner of the land, who is also the grandfather of my spouse. During that period, I conducted series of negotiations with my in-laws and other families to let the government decide on the issues and insisting that we need to serve the residents of the barangay by allowing the children to go to school.

Luckily, having a supportive, educated and understanding spouse, I established my role as a school leader as his relatives. He is the boss in the house, but I am the boss in the school as if he cannot get away that I was just imposing what is right for the learners, what is good for the community and what was beneficial for all of us. Even my relationship with him was at risk. During that period, I also learned to balance my relationship with the community, teachers and other stakeholders. I practice democratic leadership among teachers. I trained them well and honed their potential and skills. I encouraged them to grow professionally and personally. Surprisingly, 7 were promoted. Others to become school heads and some become the asset of the district.

When I was transferred to another district in a school with few teachers and a small population of pupils, a challenge had been part of my job when I had one problem teacher. I have tried to be friendly with that teacher, asking his needs

and wants from colleagues providing him technical assistance and resources he needs to perform better in school, but still, he showed tardiness, frequent absenteeism, in compliance with the school reports and requirements, and other misconduct.

I documented all the conferences with him and issued school memorandum for him, so that he was aware of what he was doing until such time that I referred to the higher office for appropriate discipline or administrative decision even some of my co-school heads were advising me not to do it because he was a drug addict and they feared that he can do harm to me anywhere anytime and my life will be at risk.

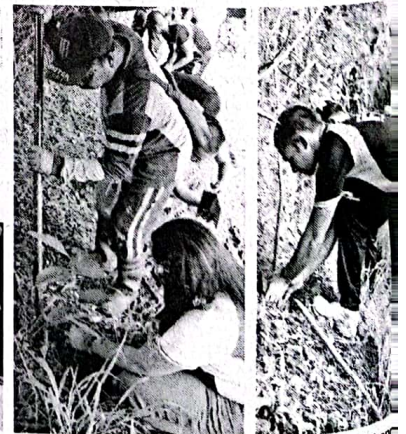
There is a saying that only by giving, you are able to receive more than you already have. This proves my good relationship with my colleagues as they recognize my potential to lead them in a group, asking my point of view and

knowledge on any matter relative to their function. Being grateful to superiors means conforming with expectations of the superior for me to be an effective and efficient worker.

Being a public servant is not an easy task. Sometimes you please some people, some do not. But the wonders of being a public servant are never seen, but it is felt. Just serve with dignity, knowledge, patience, and with a heart because you will be blessed. I have seen with my former pupils who are now successful professionals, teachers under my care, and my colleagues who also promoted that I kept on expressing gratitude for what I have done to them personally and professionally.

Do you want to be served or be a servant? The challenge is given to you is your choice, which

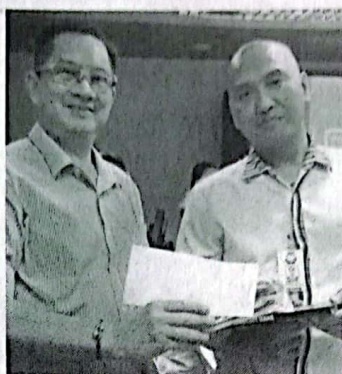

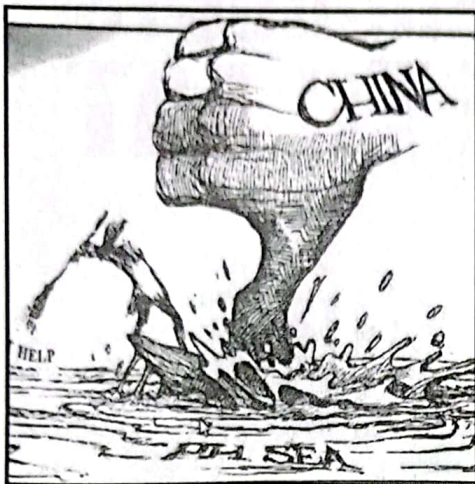

PUNISH ALL THE KILLERS OF CADET DORMITORIO!

THE news about the untimely death due to hazing of 4th class cadet Darwin Dormitorio of the Philippine Military Academy brought extreme shock and sadness to yours truly.

Clearly to my simple mind, the incident is a not homicide but murder though lawyers may argue otherwise.

The 'murder' was done again despite the enactment of the Anti-Hazing Act of 2018, which has gone into the books as Republic Act 11053 that seeks to prohibit all forms of hazing in fraternities, sororities, school- and community-based organizations.

This law, I presumed, is known to the upper classmen of the PMA; they know that the law also prohibits them to perform hazing during military training, although it was previously clarified the Armed Forces (AFP) and the Philippine National Police (PNP) may still conduct physical, mental and psychological testing and training for prospect members of the said organizations.

But these training and tests should not be in the form of physical discipline or hazing.

We suggest that the police investigators should do all to ferret out all the truth to Dormitorio's death; his death to a mother like me, I can only imagine

that he was maltreated by at least three of his PMA cadets.

Autopsy findings revealed that blunt force trauma was the cause of the 20-year old Dormitorio, a member of PMA Class of 2023 from Cagayan de Oro City.

His death was a clear violation of the Anti-Hazing Act of 2018; Dormitorio should be the last victim of hazing, I may say.

His initial inquiries and autopsy reports showed Dormitorio was subjected to inhuman treatment by his co-cadets.

I suggest that Congress should revise the law to revise the implementing rules and regulations on the implementation of the Anti-Hazing Act of 2018.

I call-on President Duterte to call out for resignation of all the top officers of the PMA for negligence and they should be investigated for the command responsibility principle of military law.

Records showed that Dormitorio was the first hazing victim from the PMA, the first in 2000 and two others in 2001.

He should be the last!

I was told that hazing was "necessary" by all future officers of the AFP and this, military of say hazing is a kind of initiation that refers to practice of bastardization, ragging, or depositing.

These include physical challenges, bullying, and physical harassment, abuse or humiliation as a way of initiating a person into a group in a new fraternity, sorority, team, or club.

This is done to make a person strong and steady during tribulations and extreme pressure and with physical and emotional pain.

Let those in the PMA top brass who violate the law, by sin of commission or by sin of omission, properly punished.

President Duterte should order the AFP to punish them — whoever they are!

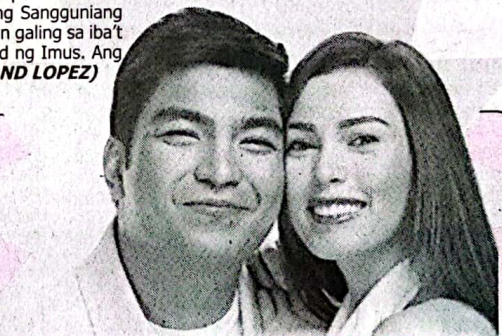
