

## REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR THE SELECTION OF THE JOINT VENTURE PARTNER OF THE PROVINCE OF CAVITE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE SANGLEY POINT INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT PROJECT

The Provincial Government of Cavite (PGC) of the Republic of the Philippines is inviting qualified firms to submit Joint Venture (JV) Proposals for the development of the Sangley Point International Airport Project (the "Project").

The Project is a master-planned 1,500-hectare new international airport development to be implemented as a commercial JV arrangement between the PGC and its selected JV Partner. The PGC is the implementing agency of the Project for the Government of the Philippines. The formation and execution of the JV will be done in accordance with Provincial Ordinance No. 002-S-2012, as amended, or the PGC's Public-Private Partnership (PPP) Code and JV Ordinance.

The selected JV Partner will be responsible for co-developing the Project in joint venture with the PGC, providing the necessary equity investment and credit enhancements, and subject to a further competitive process or price test, performing Engineering, Procurement and Construction (EPC) services for the land and airport development components of the Project.

Project financing is being arranged and raised by the PGC through the development financial institutions and policy banks of the People's Republic of China. In addition to the legal, technical and financial qualifications set by the PGC, the selected JV Partner must also pass the credit standards of the Project lenders.

Under the terms of the Project's no objection clearance from the Department of Transportation, no National Government guarantee, subsidy or equity will be granted.

The Request for Proposals (RFP), comprising: (1) the Project Feasibility Study, (2) the Instructions to Candidate JV Partners, and (3) the Draft Joint Venture and Development Agreement, will be available at the Office of the Provincial Governor, Cavite Provincial Capitol, Trece Martires City, Province of Cavite, for distribution to interested parties, from 11 October to 11 November 2019. To obtain a copy of the RFP, any interested party must submit a written Expression of Intent, sign the prescribed Non-Disclosure Agreement, and pay the non-refundable participation fee of PHP1,000,000 (or USD20,000). The form of the Non-Disclosure Agreement may be downloaded from the official PGC website at <https://cavite.gov.ph/home/>. The deadline for the submission of JV Proposals will be on 25 November 2019.

The Province of Cavite reserves the right to accept or reject any JV Proposal, and to discontinue the JV Partner Selection Process.

## Carmona receives Silver Eagle Award recognizing its peace and order efforts



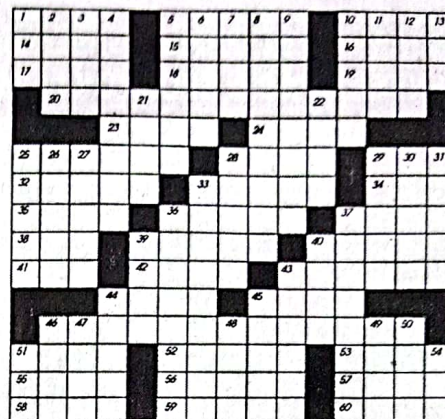

## New Regional Counterterrorism Training Center to Boost U.S.-Philippine and Regional Cooperation

**Camp General Mariano N. Castañeda, Silang, Cavite, Oct. 12 —** As part of our deepening bilateral counterterrorism partnership, today, Philippine Police Chief General Oscar Albayalde and U.S. Ambassador to the Philippines Sung Kim broke ground on a new state-of-the-art Regional Counterterrorism Training Center in the Philippines.

The U.S. and Philippine governments will construct and operate the center on the grounds of the PNP Academy in Silang, Cavite. The U.S. Department of State has secured Php 520 million (\$10 million) in counterterrorism partnership funds to establish and jointly operate the center with the PNP.

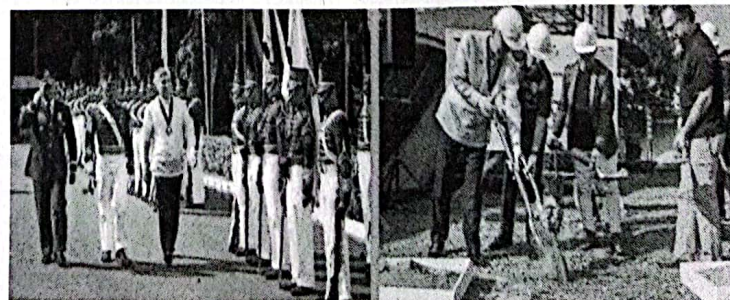
Once constructed, the center will provide counterterrorism training for law enforcement units and personnel

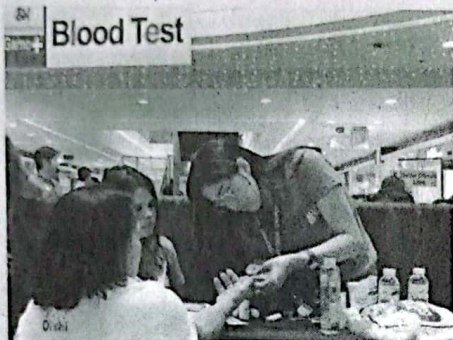

Malacañang of the North has over a million visitors annually and most of them are students. He also emphasized that children, pregnant women, the elderly and those who are differently-abled are the ones most affected every time a disaster strikes. They take a relatively high share of the disease burden associated with emergencies.

The objective of the MHPSS program is to equip participants with basic knowledge, proper skills, and attitude in the promotion of Mental Health and the provision of Psychosocial care intervention to affected population in their areas of assignment.

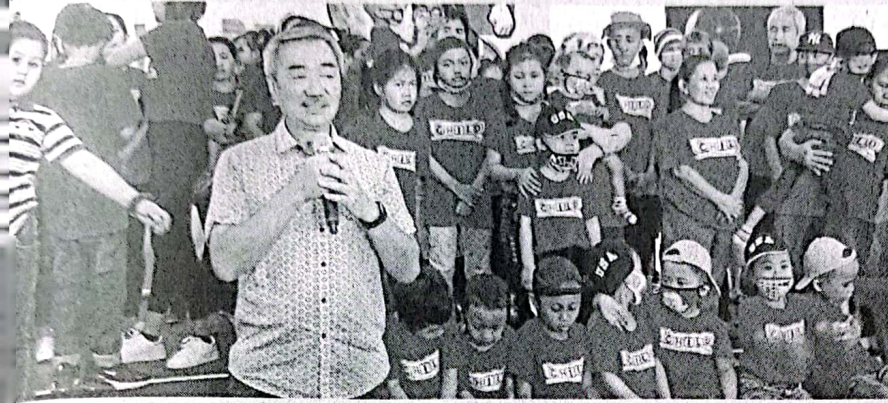

# Hans Sy's priceless joy: Helping cancer patient

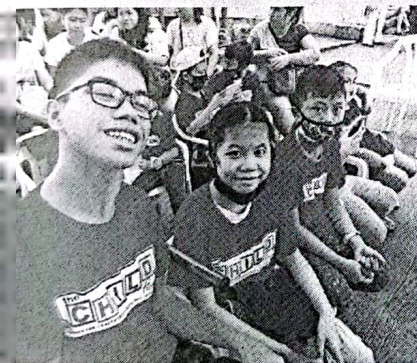

4, Hans Sy has just about everything in life—a family, good health and enormous wealth. This Hans, together with his five siblings, Teresita, Beth, Henry Jr., Herbert and Harley, made it to top of Forbes magazine's list of the Philippines' top people—a post held for the past 11 years by the late, SM Group founder Henry Sy, who died on 1999. "Something that Hans considers heartwarming and priceless is helping children with afflictions and spending time with them.

"gives me inner happiness," he told Inquirer while celebrating his birthday recently at Child Haus, a seven-story building in Paco, Manila, with complete facilities to assist and care for cancer patients from all over the country awaiting medical attention and treatment at the Philippine General Hospital (PGH), was built in 2015 from Hans' own money. "My wife, who arrived with his wife Carol to join the celebration that has become an annual event hosted by Child Haus founder Ricky Reyes, recalled being moved to action after catching Ricky crying on TV. Child

In 2011, he was watching the news and saw Ricky pleading to the government to stop an eviction order against Child Haus, which was then sharing space at the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office compound in Quezon City.

The idea to set up Child Haus took off 15 years ago, soon after then Inquirer editor in chief Letty Jimenez-Magsanoc took Ricky to the Cancer Institute of PGH to help female cancer patients. Ricky saw young patients and their families sleeping on the hospital corridors and the yard because they had no place to stay.

Hans recounted that he asked Ricky about the eviction notice: "I said the children didn't deserve to be involved in those issues. They don't even understand why they're sick. The first thing I did was buy them a house in Quezon City."

After a couple of years, Hans said he saw that the kids were doing fine, but he wanted to do more: "So, on my 60th birthday in 2015, I decided to build this (Child Haus's own building on Agoncillo St.).

## Donations

The program began with a Mass held under a tent across the Child Haus building. About a hundred children with their parents sat in the center, with Hans, Ricky and Child Haus donors and supporters at the sidelines.

After the priest gave his blessings and sprinkled holy water on everyone, Ricky took the mic and started thanking special guests, especially the ones "na mabilis pumirma ng cheke para mag-donate sa amin."

He explained that Child Haus operates on an average budget of P20 million every year from donations. But the best thing about it is, each time they needed more funds, the money would come.

Child Haus has opened its doors to thousands of cancer patients, and has even helped those with different ailments.

For Hans' birthday party, other kids with various afflictions were invited.

John Ren Ceballos, 17, was diagnosed with cerebral palsy when he was just a year old. The future seems uncertain, he admitted. "Hindi ko alam kung hanggang kailan malakas ang parents ko," he said.

He dreams of becoming a chef and wants to finish college for his parents.

What gives him hope? "My family and God. Hangga't nagdarasal ka, andiyan ang Diyos para pakinggan ka at bigyan ng pag-asa."

Patricia Siaboc, 13, has been suffering from bone disease since she was 1 and a half years old. She's been undergoing chemotherapy, which she said is masakit. She attends a school at PGH called Silahis ng Kalusugan.

Like John, she said she finds hope in her family and God.

Guiller Celestial, 12, a leukemia patient, echoed their view: "May pag-asa habang andiyan ang aking pamilya at mga taong tumutulong sa amin."

Moments after all the kids went onstage to perform a musical number for Hans, the guest of honor was silent for a moment: "I'm ... speechless. I'm so happy."

Like a child, Hans looked bashful but his eyes twinkled with delight.

## TWO UNDOCUMENTED OFWs INTERCEPTED AT NAIA

DEPT. of Immigration Commissioner Jaime Morente cautioned overseas Filipinos who want to work abroad to be extra careful to accept offers from tour operators and travel agencies their companies are sending undocumented OFWs abroad.

Two Filipino women, allegedly recruited by a travel agency to work in Qatar, were recently intercepted at Ninoy Aquino International Airport.

"Travel agencies who send Filipinos disguised as tourists to work abroad can be held liable for violating the law," Morente. "They are not authorized and licensed

to recruit and deploy overseas job applicants."

BI port operations division chief Grifon Medina said the two Filipino women—who were initially bound for Bangkok, Thailand—were stopped by members of the bureau's travel control and enforcement unit at the NAIA Terminal 3.

The two were told by their recruiter that upon their arrival in Bangkok (Thailand) they have to wait within 24 hours for their working visas and job contracts before proceeding to their final destination in Doha, Qatar.

After receiving their working visas and job contracts, the two can fly to Qatar to work as a waitress and a cashier," the BI official said.

**KAWIT, Cavite** — The historical town of Kawit may be synonymous to General Emilio Aguinaldo's declaration of Philippine Independence in 1898 and his iconic abode, which now turned into a shrine and museum in his honor. Aside from this, the town is also known for its leading livelihood activities in the early 20th century.

This is the highlight of the National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP) free exhibit, dubbed "KA(la)WIT: Baldomero and the Livelihood of early 20th century Kawit" at the Museo ni Baldomero Aguinaldo (MBA) in Binakayan village which opened here on Friday.

"The exhibit aims to inform the present generation and the public not just about the town's origin but its livelihood activities back at the era when it was still considered a predominantly agricultural town," MBA curator Azhel Miral said.

## From Ka(la)wit to Kawit

Founded in the 16th century, what is now known as a first-class municipality is considered one of Cavite's oldest towns.

It was popularly referred to as Cavite el Viejo (Old Cavite) during the Spanish era, where its name was derived from the word "kalawit" or hook, "in reference to the small hooked-shaped peninsula jutting out to Manila Bay from Cavite," Miral said.

One of the nearest towns from the Manila, Kawit is considered as a highly-urbanized town. But back in the early 20th century, Cavite el Viejo was a relatively small pueblo in terms of population and land area where most of its lands were used by the olden townfolks for farming.

In 1884, with an area of 1,542 hectares, the town was composed of six barrios--Poblacion, Binakayan, Putol, San Juan, Gahak, and Tabon--1,193 hectares of which were devoted to farming, while the rest was idle land.

"The exhibit coalesces the words Kawit and Kalawit as it combines the town and its most notable imagery of the farming industry."

The exhibit will also take the guests back in the early 20th centuries to explore the town of Kawit in the perspective of the leading livelihood activities, "when aside from farming, Cavite el Viejo (old Cavite) also had other industries like fishing, salt production,

and blacksmithing," Miral added.

Of its leading livelihood activities back then, only the salt production and blacksmithing remain. These industries are only some of the reasons why the town remains popular among tourists.

Another Aguinaldo in history

The exhibit also aims to transmit and disseminate significant information about another Aguinaldo who figured in history, Baldomero, where a shrine and museum in his honor is also managed and run by NHCP.

"In this atmosphere (where we present the leading livelihood activities), we inject the image of Baldomero Aguinaldo, a general of the revolution, a Kawiteño, and a farmer," Miral said.

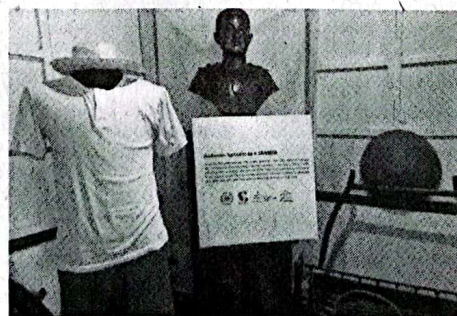
The exhibit, which runs until Nov. 30, will also put into context how Baldomero Aguinaldo lived as a farmer after the revolution and retired to a private life in his humble abode, now known as the MBA.

The National Museums and Galleries month is observed the whole month of October under Presidential Proclamation 798 s. 1991. This year's celebration theme is "Building the Nation, One

Exhibit at a Time".

The exhibit also forms part of "Project Bayani: Curating South Luzon", a simultaneous exhibit among members of the Southern Luzon Association of Museums.

The project attempts to promote a museum route by creating a unifying exhibit to capture in a single theme the thrusts of each participating

museum. MBA is one of the three NHCP-run museums in Cavite, along with Museo ni Emilio Aguinaldo (MEA, also in Kawit town), and the Museo ng Paglilitis ni Andres Bonifacio (Bonifacio Trial House) in Cavite's Maragondon.

It is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Tuesdays to Sundays.

# DILG: 97 LGUs GET FAILED RATINGS

**LOCAL government units (LGUs) that failed to comply with the campaign to clear roads, sidewalks of obstructions nationwide will be issued show-cause order, said Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Secretary Eduardo M. Año told reporters Friday (Oct. 11) in a press conference at the DILG office in Quezon City.**

Strict validation on the compliance showed that LGUs can be charged with dereliction of duty, neglect and possibly suspension," Año said.

Of the 97 LGUs, 18 are from Zamboanga Peninsula, 13 from Northern Mindanao, 12 are in Central Visayas, 11 are from Ilocos Region, and 10 from Region 5 (Region).

Nine (9) LGUs failed in Eastern Visayas, followed by seven (7) from Mimaropa, four (4) each from Cordillera Administrative Region, three (3) from Davao Region and SOCCSKSARGEN, and one (1) each from Cagayan Valley, Central Luzon, and Western Visayas.

The campaign to clear roads and sidewalks of obstructions was clearly stated by the President in his SONA [State of the Nation Address].

"Those who did not follow the President's order, be held liable," said Año.

President Rodrigo Duterte during his 2019 SONA on July 22, gave mayors 60 days until Sept. 29, to "reclaim all public roads that are used for private ends."

Año said the cities of Manila, Caloocan, Las Makati, Malabon, Mandaluyong, Marikina, Navotas, Parañaque, Pasay, Valenzuela, Pateros, and San Juan garnered high compliance rating.

The cities of Muntinlupa, Pasig and Quezon City received Medium Compliance rating, while Taguig City received a Low Compliance rating.

The secretary said the non-compliant LGUs are given five days from receipt of the show cause orders to explain their non-compliance.

If the concerned local executives reasons for their non-compliance are acceptable, no cases will be filed against them.

Año said that the nationwide road clearing effort of LGUs have been "generally successful."

He added that names of those who failed to comply were submitted to the President and file the necessary complaints with the Office of the Ombudsman.

Año said in terms of nationwide compliance to the MC 2019-121, a total of 1,148 have passed the validation with 328 registering High Compliance, followed by 497 for Medium Compliance, and 323 Low Compliance.

Among the highly compliant regions are Region I (Cagayan Valley), III (Central Luzon), VI (Calabarzon), XII (SOCCSKSARGEN) and CAR.

"Based on the report from the 1,148 LGUs, the streets across the country have been returned for use due to the cooperation of the local government," Año added.

Año said the nationwide road clearing program of DILG will continue and that the validation of the DILG will now be done quarterly.

He urged the public to report to the DILG all violations with presidential directive as the department can issue show cause orders against these officials.
