ORDER

During today's setting, the petitioners Christopher Palma and Keith Sarasa-Palma are present. Counsel Atty. Josefine A. Viray is absent. Prosecutor Gee B. Rosanes appeared for the state. This verified petition, dated 15 May 2017, filed by the petitioner, through counsel, prays that after due notice, publication and hearing, judgment be rendered for the issuance of decree of adoption declaring the minor **IAN THE RIZ S. PALMA** as the legitimate child of the petitioners Christopher Palma and Keith Sarasa-Palma, Filipino Citizens.

On 21 March 2018, the Court issued an order for the publication of the same in a newspaper of general circulation within the Province of Cavite, Office of the Department of Social Welfare and Development, Office of the Solicitor General, Office of the Prosecutor of Cavite, petitioners and their counsel.

On 7 May 2018, record shows that the Court's order dated 21 March 2018 was sent to the petitioners and the Office of the Solicitor General but this court did not receive any return. The petitioners were directed to show proof of residence as prospective adoptees.

On 3 September 2018, the petitioner complied with the order of the Court, the petitioners submitted PLOT and Meraleto utility bills to prove residence.

On the same date, the Court directed the petitioner to submit the original birth certificate of the child to prove that the adopters were the biological parents. Considering that the adopters were the biological parents of the child, the DSWD of General Trias, Cavite was directed to conduct a case study on the biological child as well as the other child of the adoptive father and to submit to this Court a certification that the adopted child is not opposing the adoption and is in fact giving her permission to the adoption to be submitted in the Court within thirty (30) days from receipt.

On 3 December 2018, the DSWD of General Trias, Cavite was directed again to conduct a case study report and a home study report of the prospective adopter as well as the report on the biological parents.

On 18 March 2019, the Court directed the DSWD of General Trias, Cavite to explain within fifteen (15) days from notice why the required report was not submitted to the court.

On 1 October 2019, the Department of Social Welfare and Development of General Trias, Cavite submitted a favorable recommendation for this adoption case.

Finding the petition to be sufficient in form and substance, let the same be set for hearing on 12 November 2019 at 8:30 o'clock in the morning before this Court sitting at the Government Center Building, Capitol Site, Trece Martires City, Cavite on which date, time and place any interested person may appear to show cause, if he/she any, why this petition should not be granted.

Let a copy of this order be published at least once a week for three(3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the Province of Cavite and have copies hereof be furnished the Department of Social Welfare and Development, Office of the Solicitor General, Office of the Prosecutor of Cavite, the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), the Civil Registrar of Quezon City, petitioners and their counsel.

The parties are hereby directed to coordinate with the clerk of court for the raffie of the publication.

CALABARZON bags one-third of the awards in the 7th Regional Competitiveness Summit

The Department of Trade and Industry Region 4-A commends the competitive cities, municipalities, and provinces in the CALABARZON region, bagging 25 out of 75 or one-third of the awards in the recently concluded 7th Regional Competitiveness Summit on October 24, 2019 at the Philippine International Convention Center, Pasay City.

For this year, 1,518 local government units participated in the Cities and Municipalities Competitiveness Index (CMCI)—an annual ranking of Philippine cities and municipalities developed by the National Competitiveness Council through the Regional Competitiveness Committees (RCCs) with the assistance of the United States Agency for International Development.

"Eighty-four (84) LGUs in CALABARZON have shown improvement in their competitive ranking this 2019 compared to the previous year. We are happy that more LGUs are realizing the significance of the CMCI program," said DTT CALABARZON Director Marilou Q. Toledo.

The ranking was based on the four convergent

pillars: 1) Economic Dynamism is usually associated with activities that create stable expansion of business and industries and higher employment; 2) Government Efficiency refers to the quality and reliability of government services and government support for effective and sustainable productive expansion; 3) Infrastructure refers to the physical building blocks that connect, expand, and sustain a locality and its surroundings to enable the provision of goods and services; and 4) Resiliency is the capacity of a locality to facilitate businesses and industries to create jobs, raise productivity, and increase the incomes of citizens over time despite

of the shocks and stresses it encounters.

The Province of Rizal remains undefeated for the Most Competitive Province in the country for four consecutive years. The CALABARZON Region dominated this category as second and third, respectively. In the component cities, Antipolo, Rizal topped the Overall Competitiveness ranking, Calamba, Laguna as second, and Sta. Rosa, Laguna as third. General Trias, Cavite was declared as Top 1 in Economic Dynamism, followed by Calamba, Laguna as Top 2 and Batangas City, Batangas as Top 3. In terms of Government Efficiency, Antipolo, Rizal achieved the top spot and Sta. Rosa, Laguna ranked third. In Resilience, Antipolo, Rizal was ranked first again and



then ranked second in terms of Infrastructure.

For the 1st to 2nd Class Municipalities, Cainta, Rizal topped the Overall Competitiveness ranking followed by Taytay, Rizal as second, Cainta, Rizal was also ranked third in Economic Dynamism. In

terms of Government Efficiency, Cainta, Rizal got the first place, Taytay, Rizal on the second, and Silang, Batangas ranked second in terms of Government Efficiency and Pagsanjan, Laguna was also second in terms of Resilience.

Rizal got the second place and San Mateo, Rizal for the third place.

For the 3rd to 6th Class Municipalities, Taal, Batangas ranked second in terms of Government Efficiency and Pagsanjan, Laguna was also second in terms of Resilience.

MORE THAN 2MILLION WORTH OF SHABU RECOVERED IN TWO BUY BUST OPERATION IN IMUS CITY

Cavite- Police Provincial Director, Police Colonel WILLIAM M SEGUN reported to CALABARZON Regional Director, Police Brigadier General VICENTE D DANAJO Jr that seven drug pushers were arrested and confiscated more than 2 million worth suspected shabu in Malagasang, Imus, Cavite.

At about 9:00 in the morning of October 30, 2019 when Drug Enforcement Team of Imus PNP in coordination with CAVITE PDEA conducted buy bust in Brgy Malagasang 2-C, Imus City which resulted in the arrest of Victoriano Sico Y Ting @ Victoriano, 45 years old, married, male, mechanic, and a resident of Brgy Pascam 2-General Trias City, Cavite; Angelo Cadano Y Tombocon @ Gelo, 28 years old, single, male, jobless, and a resident of Brgy Pascam 2-General Trias City, Cavite; Sonny Boy Panchong Y Barzaga, 37 years old, single, male, jobless, and a resident of Brgy Navarro, General Trias City, Cavite; Joseph Calnan

Y Betong, 37 years old, single, male, driver, and a resident of Brgy Pascam 2-General Trias City, Cavite. Recovered in their possession were 48.20 grams of suspected shabu with street value of P36,400.00 and buy bust money.

Just after an hour in Greengate Homes, Malagasang 2-A, the team arrested Kevin Ramirez y Javier @ KEVIN, 26 years old, male, single, call center agent and a resident of Malagasang 2-A, Imus City, Cavite; and Krisha Mendoza y Saquilon @ KRISHA, 24 years old, female, single, casino dealer and a resident of Malagasang 2-A, Imus City, Cavite. An estimated weight of 291.18 grams of shabu with street value of P1,980,024.00 and buy

bust money were recovered from their possession during the course of operation.

The team yielded a total of 339.38 grams of shabu worth of P36,400.00 in two consecutive operations.

Suspects were apprised with their constitutional rights in dialect known to them. They were brought to the Police Custodial Center in preparation for Inquest proceedings before the Office of Provincial Prosecutors for a criminal offense for Violation of RA 9165 known as Dangerous Drug Act of 2002.

Police Imus is still probing the source of drugs from the arrested suspects for their relentless effort to stop illegal drug trade in the City. (Cavite PIO)

SEN. KIKO SIGNS SENATE REPORT VS ALBAYALDE

RESIGNED Philippine National Police (PNP) chief Oscar Albayalde was "in cahoots" with his former men, also known as 'ninja cops,' in the alleged recycling of seized illegal drugs, Senator Francis Pangilinan said.

Pangilinan added that he agreed with the Senate report finding the former police director general guilty of violating the Anti-Graft Law and the Comprehensive Dangerous Drug Act of 2002.

"I signed the report, kasi sumasang-ayon ako sa findings sa ginawang hearing. Instead of answering the allegation against him, he claimed he was being politicized. Sagutin niya ang accusation na pinagtakpan n'ya ang mga (dating) tauhan at kung totoo ba na sinabi na waga silang

sibakin," said Pangilinan. In the report prepared by the Senate blue ribbon committee and Committee on Justice, both headed by Sen. Richard Gordon, it said that when Albayalde was Pampanga police chief, he phoned at least two PNP officials to intercede in the case of his former men involved in "agaw bato" or the recycling of seized shabu (crystal meth) in 2013.

The senator added that there are many pieces of circumstantial evidence that point that Albayalde was in cahoots [with the

ninja cops]. Following the resignation of Albayalde, President Rodrigo Duterte ordered PNP Officer-in-Charge Lt. Gen. Archie Francisco Gamboa to immediately institute a PNP revamp following the Senate probe.

Gamboa placed all officials under probation and revamped the PNP.

The PNP Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG) has filed an amended complaint before the Department of Justice (DoJ) naming Albayalde as

one of the respondents, together with the so-called 13 ninja cops for various violations of the Comprehensive Drugs Act of 2002, qualified bribery and falsification of public documents.

Gordon said that the Senate would continue "to watch with eagle eyes" the complaints against Albayalde and the 13 ninja cops.
