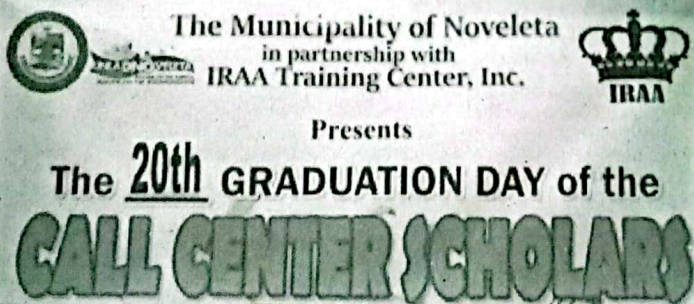

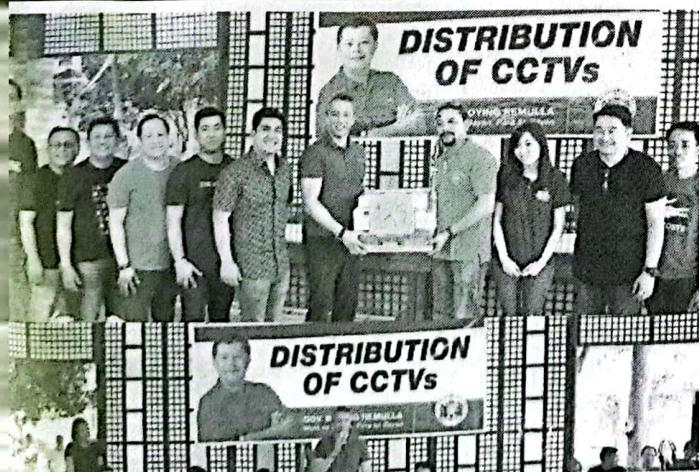

CRUSADE FOR A PEACEFUL COMMUNITY

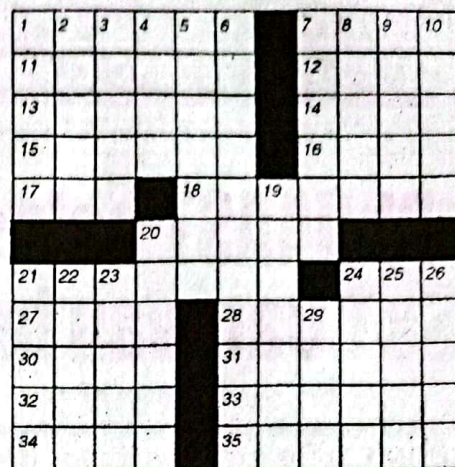

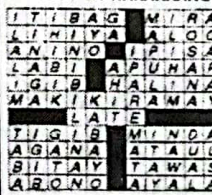

PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 224

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE MONTH OF JUNE AS W.A.T.C.H (WE ADVOCATE TIME CONSCIOUSNESS AND HONESTY) MONTH AND ENJOINING ALL SCHOOLS, COLLEGES, UNIVERSITIES AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS TO UNDERTAKE PROGRAMS OF ACTIVITIES RELATING THERETO EVERY SECOND WEEK OF JUNE

WHEREAS, W.A.T.C.H (We Advocate Time Consciousness and Honesty) is an advocacy program jointly undertaken by JCI Senate Philippines, Department of Education, Commission on Higher Education, Technical Education and Skills Development Authority, Philippine Association of Colleges and Universities, PAPSCU, PRISAA, and the Office of the Presidential Assistant for Education, to promote and undertake programs that will instill the value of punctuality and honesty in all sectors of society;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to develop and instill the importance of time management and punctuality among the people of Cavite most especially those in public service and the youth;

WHEREAS, the Provincial Government of Cavite takes cognizance of the role, functions and responsibilities of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, as the legislative body of the Province, to enact ordinances, approve resolutions and appropriate funds for the general welfare of the province and its inhabitants pursuant to Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991.

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan deemed it proper to adopt and reiterate **Presidential Proclamation No. 1782-s-2009**, signed on May 21, 2009 by then President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo, to strengthen public awareness and encourage Caviteños, most especially the younger generation, to promote and practice punctuality and honesty, and to pursue moral renewal among public servants, government employees and younger generation to encourage and maintain a society that values and respect punctuality and honesty;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Lara, duly seconded by Hon. Grepo and all the members present, be it enacted by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Cavite in session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as "**W.A.T.C.H (We Advocate Time Consciousness and Honesty) Month Ordinance in the Province of Cavite**".

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY

The Provincial Government of Cavite strongly encourage and promote effective, efficient, and accountable public service in its pursuit for a progressive and world class Cavite.

SECTION 3. GENERAL PROVISION

It is hereby declared that every second week of the month of June every year shall be observed as W.A.T.C.H (We Advocate Time Consciousness and Honesty) Month in the Province of Cavite.

Relative thereto, all schools, colleges, universities and local government within the Province of Cavite are hereby enjoined to initiate the programs below in order to instill deeper awareness of honesty and punctuality among youth and the entire society.

1. Inclusion of concept/programs on related subjects such as Values Education, GMRC and Technology and Home Economics;
2. Information campaign through School Bulletin Boards, school paper, other related activities;
3. Continuous training and orientation programs that involve members of faculty, students, parents and school community;
4. Coordination with the local government unit and non-government organizations for the conduct of programs and activities that promote and advocate time consciousness and honesty.

SECTION 4. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

If any part of this Ordinance is declared as unconstitutional or unlawful, the declaration shall not affect the other parts or sections hereof that are not declared unconstitutional or unlawful.

SECTION 5. REPEALING CLAUSE

All previous ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be deemed repealed accordingly.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVITY

This Ordinance shall take effect after its approval and compliance with the law and publication requirements.

SECTION 6. Application of the Ordinance shall be applied to all private vehicles and shall not apply to Public Utility Vehicles (PUV) such as PUJ, tricycles, taxis and the likes.

SECTION 7. PENALTY CLAUSE. In the case of the cashier or booth attendant, violation of this ordinance shall be imposed a fine of Five Hundred Pesos (Php500.00)

In the case of the operator, manager and/or the owner of the said parking area, violation of this ordinance shall be imposed a fine of Two Thousand Pesos (Php2,000.00)

SECTION 8. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason or reasons, any part or provisions of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not effected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 9. REPEALING CLAUSE. All previous ordinance inconsistent with this ordinance shall be deemed repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval and compliance with the posting and publication requirements.

Calabarzon records almost 2,500 measles cases, 61 deaths

IMUS CITY, Cavite — The recorded suspected measles cases in the provinces of Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon, or collectively known as Calabarzon, have reached 2,494; with 61 reported deaths.

A report from the Department of Health's (DOH) Regional Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (RESU) covering the period January 1 to February 19 this year indicated that Rizal province is in the top spot with 1,293 recorded cases — the highest number reported during the period, including 42 deaths.

A report from Glen Ramos, DOH Calabarzon Media Relations and Communications Unit (MRCU) head, also showed that Cavite followed with 360 cases and eight deaths; Laguna - 346 cases with seven deaths; Batangas - 258 cases with three deaths; and Quezon - 237 cases with one death.

The latest RESU report recorded the recent 'suspected' cases, subject to further verification from DOH, Ramos clarified.

The DOH Calabarzon office has formed a task force to implement key strategies on measles outbreak response, including surveillance, public awareness and education, vaccination and taking care of patients in health care facilities.

It has also established alliance with various government agencies and used public places, such as malls, supermarkets, food establishments and churches, to help augment its campaign strategies and control the spread of the measles virus.

PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 235

AN ORDINANCE EXEMPTING ALL SENIOR CITIZENS AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITY OF THE PROVINCE OF CAVITE FROM PAYMENT OF PARKING FEES IN BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE PROVINCE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF

Introduced and Sponsored by: Hon. Valeriano S. Encabo

WHEREAS, Section 9, Article 2 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution, mandates that the State shall promote a just and dynamic social order that will ensure the prosperity and independence of the nation and free the people from poverty through policies that provide social services, promote full employment, a rising standard of living and an improved quality of life for all;

WHEREAS, Republic Act NO. 7432, as amended by Republic Act NO. 9994, also known as the Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010, aims to establish a mechanism to adopt measures whereby Senior Citizens and Persons with Disability (PWD) are assisted and appreciated by the community as a whole and to establish a program beneficial to them and their families.

WHEREAS, Section 17 of the 1991 Local Government Code provides that the local government units shall likewise exercise such other powers, functions and responsibilities necessary and appropriate to effective and efficient provision

of basic social services which include programs and projects on welfare of the elderly and persons with disability.

WHEREAS, there are business establishments, hospitals and other places that are collecting parking fees to vehicle owner, regardless of age in exchange of convenient and sure parking;

WHEREAS, it has been observed that numerous vehicles parked in business establishments and other similar places belong to senior citizens and persons with disability.

WHEREAS, aware of the status, needs and concerns of the elderly and persons with disability constituents, the Provincial Government recognizes the necessity of extending these privileges;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Encabo, duly seconded by Hon. Lara and all the members present, be it enacted by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Cavite in session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Free Parking Ordinance for Senior Citizens and Persons with Disability of the Province of Cavite"

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is hereby declared the policy of the Provincial Government of Cavite to give priority to the welfare of elderly and persons with disability and in consonance with the constitutional principle to motivate and encourage them to contribute to nation building.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS.

- a. Senior Citizen or Elderly-** refers to any Filipino Citizen who is 60 years old and above. It may apply to senior citizen with dual citizenship provided they prove their Filipino citizenship and have at least established six (6) months residency in the Philippines.
- b. Person with Disability-** refers to any person who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities.
- c. Parking Area/Space/Lot-** an area, structure or edifice being used for parking.
- d. Senior Citizen/Person with Disability Identification Card-** a card issued by the Office of Senior Citizens Affairs (OSCA) and Office of Social Welfare and Development for PWD's card.

SECTION 4. COVERAGE. This ordinance shall cover all malls, business establishments and private hospitals operating within the jurisdiction of the Province of Cavite which charge parking fees in exchange for parking slots/areas at a specific time.

SECTION 5. AVAILMENT/PROCEDURE. In order to avail exemption mentioned herein, the elderly and person with disability must present his/her Senior Citizen/Person with Disability Identification Card upon entry in the parking area/space/lot of malls, business establishments and hospitals. The elderly /person with disability who owns the official car shall be a passenger or driver of the private vehicle in order to be free of parking fees. However, the parking privilege granted in this ordinance shall not apply to overnight parking.

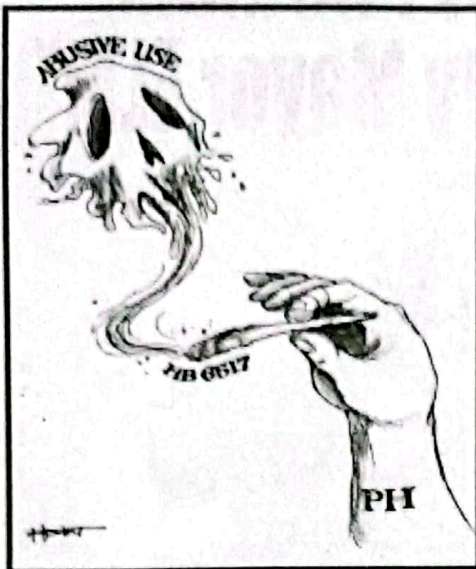
