## DOH commits to 'more trainings' for health, safety of tourists

**TAGAYTAY CITY, Cavite** - After the two batches of lifeguard trainings conducted among tourism related establishments (TREs) in Region IV-A (Calabarzon) reduced the incidence of drowning to just 2 (from the 12 incidents last year per Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council data), the regional health department vows to conduct "more trainings" to capacitate the region's public and private stakeholders engaged in tourism activities.

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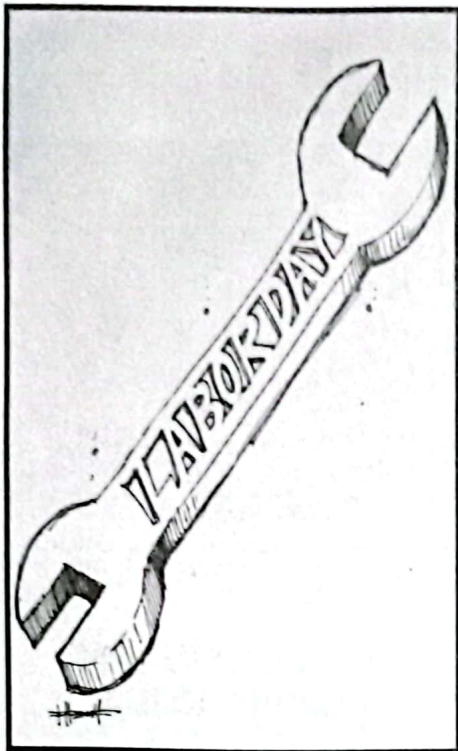
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## Editorial

### Maging handa sa init, tagtuyot at brownout

**N**AKARANAS tayo ng kakaibang malalakas na lindol nitong nakaraang linggo—sa Pampanga at Zambales nitong Lunes, sa Eastern Samar nitong nakaraang Martes, at sa Davao at Batangas nitong Miyerkules. Ang mga lindol at pagputok ng bulkan ay bahagi ng buhay sa bansang ito, na nasa loob ng Pacific Ring of Fire. Maging ang mga bagyo ay isang ordinaryong bahagi na rin ng ating pamumuhay, lalo't nakaharap tayo sa daanan ng mga ganitong kalamidad na tumatahak mula Pasipiko patungo ng Asya.

Sa ngayon, kailangan muna nating kayanin ang init ng tag-init at ang epekto nito sa ating dalawang pangunahing pangangailangan—ang tubig at kuryente para sa mga kabahayan, pabrika at mga opisina.

Sinabi ng Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical, at Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) nitong Miyerkules na nahaharap ang Metro Manila at 16 na probinsiya sa Luzon at Visayas sa tagtuyot sa

pagtatapos ng Mayo. Makakaranas ng dry season Bohol, Cebu at Southern Leyte, mas may kondisyon kumpara sa tagtuyot. Kaya dumarating na ang ulan tuwing huling bahagi ng tag-init ngunit hindi sa taong ito dahil sa init na kumakalat ng El Nino mula sa bahagi ng Pasipiko.

Dahil sa tagtuyot, patuloy na bumaba ang antas ng tubig sa ating mga dam. Sinabi ng National Water Resources Board (NWRB) na bumaba ang antas ng tubig sa 181.63 metro nitong Miyerkules mula sa dam ng Angat sa 181.63 metro noong tag-ulan ang tubig sa Angat Dam nagsusuplay ng 96 na porsiyento ng Metro Manila at irigasyon ng nasa 27,000 hektarya ng saklaw ng Bulacan at Pampanga. Inaasahan lalong bumaba ang antas ng tubig sa minimum operating level na 180 metro ng Angat Dam sa Linggo, dahilang upang mabawasan ang tubig sa ilalabas para sa irigasyon. Mananatili ang antas ng tubig sa Metro Manila, ngunit nararapat na alerto.

Dahil din sa init ng panahon, ibinahagi ng National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP) na bumaba ang demand ng suplay sa Luzon. Kaya naman magkakaroon ng mga rota, brownout sa ilang bahagi ng Luzon at Metro Manila. Nagdulot din ang lindol kamakailan ng bumabagal na pagpasa ng ilang planta ng kuryente.

Kinakailangan na nating paghandaan ang nagpapatuloy na problema sa init ng panahon sa kakulangan sa tubig, at kuryente. Maaaring lumalagay ngayong taon dahil sa nararanasang mga ngunit palagi nating itong nalalampasan at kailangan muli natin ito.

# DOST-SEI scholarships hit new record with 9,852 S&T qualifiers

**Scholarship Programs reached yet another all-time high as 9,852 graduating high-school students topped the country's premier science scholarship programs.**



S&T qualifiers breached the 8,994 mark of last year, up by 10 percent, a record for the program, which started in 1958. Out of the 9,852 qualifiers, 5,819 qualified as scholars

under the Republic Act 7687 Scholarship Program for academically talented students who belong to economically disadvantaged families; while 4,033 top-ranking examinees passed under the DOST-SEI Merit Scholarship Program.

The 2019 DOST-SEI Undergraduate Scholarship Examination, which was held on October 21, 2018, in 290 test centers nationwide hit a record-breaking of 73,712 total number of examinees.

Dr. Josette T. Biyo, DOST-SEI director, said that DOST scholarship programs will provide greater opportunity to students as they pursue a college science degree, especially to those who are hard up in life.

"The scholarship will certainly allow the students to pursue their dreams in their desired fields in science, technology, engineering and mathematics in leading

universities and colleges and will ultimately lead them to become key players in the country's development once they practice their professions four or five years from now," Biyo said.

"We are hopeful that these qualifiers will soon help us in creating S&T-based solutions to our pressing national concerns," Biyo added.

The new S&T scholars will receive monthly stipend of 7,000 across all disciplines. They are also entitled to tuition subsidy up to 40,000 per academic year; book allowance; MS/PE clothing allowance (one-time only); one economy-class round trip fare per year for those studying outside of their home province; and group accident insurance.

The scholarship qualifiers must enroll in any of the University of the Philippines's campuses, in state universities and colleges, or private higher-education institutions recognized by the Commission on Higher Education as Centers of Excellence or Centers of Development, or with Federation of Accrediting Agencies of the Philippines Level III accreditation for the S&T priority programs. The list of priority S&T programs can be found in the SEI web site.

DOST-SEI scholars are required to render service in the country along their fields of specialization after graduation for a period equivalent to the number of years they enjoyed the scholarship as a return service. SEI maintains that this strategy allows the country's industries to have "the best minds" to do value-added services and products.

"As early as now, we welcome these new scholars in the S&T community," Biyo said. "We are optimistic that they are more than qualified to be the experts that will lead this nation toward the development we always hoped for."

related establishments (TREs) "by providing appropriate trainings, orientations and advocacy related to health and safety in tourism," Janairo.

DOH's goal "Towards CALABARZON Prime," is coined "to ensure that general standard safety and hygiene in all hotels, resorts and other establishments are enforced and implemented accordingly for the benefit of both foreign and local tourists," Janairo.

From the trainings, the program is also aimed to maintain a database of TREs in the region, and to assess these establishments according to health and safety standards in place, provide assistance and lobby among local govt units for the implementation of existing laws related to health and safety.

The program also includes dissemination of IEC to promote awareness and "what to do" for related health conditions and sicknesses like wound care, sun burn, prickly heat, including heat stroke, dog bites, drowning, and jelly fish stings among others.

The program will also include vermin control and health service provider networks, ensure availability of medical clinics and medical emergency services, putting up of health signage's in hazardous areas, provision of safety buoys and lifeguard

components will be put in place through partnership with LGUs, other government agencies and private sector including the provision of water testing for drinking and recreational water, garbage and sewerage disposal

program, emergency response training, paramedics, ambulance driving and lifeguards," Janairo adds.

Now on its initial phase, the DOH, in collaboration with the Dept. of Tourism and Philippine Coast Guard, has conducted 2 batches of lifeguard qualifications training and successfully trained 70 lifeguards from various resorts of the provinces.

These trainings are in view of the previous reported drowning incidents by the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) where out of the 53 incidents, 12 are from Region IV-A.

With the launching of the lifeguard training before the 2019 summer season kicked in, the drowning incidents in the region has dropped to just 2 (in Rizal), per latest RDRRMC report.

Dept of Tourism Region IV-A Director officer-in-charge Maritess T. Castro is happy with this DOH initiative.

"Although we've been collaborating with DOH and other concerned agencies in the past to ensure tourists' safety, and health, this program will refresh our TREs anew of the safety, health protocols as required in their DOT accreditation," Castro said.

The program is also a way to let the TREs know how serious the government is in monitoring their compliance to local and national safety and health standards, but at the same time let them know of its willingness to help where needed to comply to these set regulations," Castro added.

In a National Economic Devt Authority (NEDA) data, Region IV-A (CALABARZON) plays a significant contribution (2nd in regional share) in the national economy with Gross Regional Domestic Product (2017) of Php1.45 trillion (16.8%) with its abundance of tourism, agriculture and trading.

This 5th smallest region in terms of land area is dubbed most populous (14.41million, as of 2015) is also home to various agri-tourism sites.

The tourism industry, a broad category of fields with the service industry that includes lodging, food and drink service, event planning, theme parks, transportation, among others may not be all fun and pose health, safety risks if businesses do not comply to health and safety regulations.

Friday's summit culminated with the signing of the "Pledge of Commitment" to safeguard the health and safety of tourists including the environment led by Janairo and Castro and PCG Capr. Armando Balillo, with the various resort owners and hotel managers of the five provinces who attended the summit.

## PhilHealth holds Health Care Financing Summit

This was held on March 18-19, 2019 at the Crowne Plaza Manila Galleria Hotel as part of PhilHealth's 24th anniversary celebration.

The summit provides a multi-stakeholder platform for collective action towards effectively implementing reforms in health care financing which is a key element in achieving universal health care.



## DOST-PAGASA inaugurates rehabilitated forecasting, warning facility in Bicol

**Arines Sur**—The Department of Science and Technology-Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (DOST-PAGASA) inaugurated on Monday its newly rehabilitated Bicol River Basin Flood Forecasting and Warning System (BRBFFWS) here to enhance disaster-related services of the agency in the Bicol Region.

The forecasting system, which has been operational since 1973, was recently rehabilitated by replacing all its old and non-operational monitoring stations, the installation of additional gauging stations and improvement of communication facilities and backbone multiplexing system for voice and data transmission. Operating for more than 30 years, the wear-and-tear of the electro-mechanical component of the system has been pushed beyond its intended lifespan. The economic as well as the landscape and environmental transformations have contributed much to the deterioration of the equipment," PAGASA administrator Dela Peña said.

With the rehabilitated equipment, PAGASA also inaugurated yesterday the new Bicol River Basin Flood Forecasting and Warning Center (BRBFFWC) built adjacent to the agency's Agromet Station in the compound of Pili State University for Agriculture in the city of Pili.

At PAGASA's central office, this [center] is the first of its kind, as far as our flood forecasting and warning system is concerned," DOST secretary Fortunato Dela Peña said in a media briefing after the blessing of the



establishment.

The enhanced hydrometeorological equipments and the establishment of its corresponding center was funded by the Japanese government through the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) in approval of the request from

the DOST-PAGASA to rehabilitate existing flood forecasting and warning system (FFWS) in the country.

"This has been made possible through the grant from JICA. JICA has been a major contributor to the projects of PAGASA and Philvolcs (Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology) and they have been very consistent in their support," the Science and Technology chief said.

The rehabilitation project, with a budget of P900 million or P450 million, is expected to boost the flood forecasting and warning operational services of the agency in the Bicol Region for a real-time hydrological data, including rainfall and water level, and for an improved flood forecasting and warning activities.

Heading the whole-day event with Dela Peña and Malano was DOST Undersecretary for Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Renato Solidum Jr.

According to Solidum, the improved system will further enhance the capabilities of local disaster action officers in managing the risks of flooding in the region.

Also present during the ceremony was Minister for Economic Affairs of the Embassy of Japan, Makoto Iyori, as well as representatives from various provinces and municipalities in Region 5.

The establishment of the original BRBFFWS was an offshoot of the successful operation of the pilot FFWS in the country which is the Pampanga River Basin FFWS in 1973.

The Bicol River Basin is the eighth major river basin in the country in terms of drainage size. It encompasses the provinces of Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur and Albay.

to Rappler, Vera Files, Center for Media Freedom and Responsibility (CMFR), Philippine Center for Investigative Journalism (PCIJ) and, the National Union of Journalists of the Philippines (NUJP), as direct beneficiaries of foreign largesse running in the millions of pesos each year.

The issue of the legality and constitutionality of such sordid practices aside, they are ethically indefensible and reprehensible.

TOTOO bang namimili ng boto (vote-buying) si dating Cavite Governor Juanito Victor 'Jonvic' Remulla?

Pinabulaan ito ng kampo ni Remulla na nahaharap sa isang disqualification (DQ) case na isinama ng hapon, Miyerkoles, ng isang botante sa Commission on Elections (Comelec).

Ang kasong DQ laban sa dating punong-glalawigan ay isinama ni Efepania Sunico, residente ng Bacoor City sa pamamagitan ni Atty. Myrnoa Sto. Domingo bunga ng pagdakip sa ilang tagasuporta ni Remulla ng mga tauhan ng Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG) ng nakaraang linggo.

Sa panayam, sinabi ni Sto. Domingo na maraming ebidensiya na iharap sila sa Comelec upang patunayan ang pamimili ni Remulla ng boto — isang paglabag sa

batas ng eleksiyon.

Sa tanong kung may kinalaman sa politika ang kasong DQ laban kay Remulla, sinabi ni Sto. Domingo na luma-pit sa kanya si Sunico bunga ng tinatanggap nitong pagbabanta sa buhay.

"Lumapit siya sa amin, at nang makita naming na may merit ang reklamo niya, tinanggap namin ang kaso, pro bono, wala pong bayad ang aming serbisyo," sabi ng abogado.

Udyok ng kagustuhang maituwid ang sa paniniwala ni Sunico na gawaing labag sa batas, nagsampa ito ng kasong disqualification laban kay Remulla.

"Ginawa ito ni Sunico sa sarili niyang kusa at kalooban, she did it on her own volition. Nakita niya ang mga paglabag na ito sa eleksiyon, kaya nagsampa siya ng kaso to disqualify Remulla," sabi ni Sto. Domingo.

Ayon sa kampo ni Remulla, gawa-gawa lamang ang kaso DQ na kagagawan ng isang mahigpit na katunggali nito sa pagka-gobernador ng Cavite.

"Definitely, Remulla's opponent has nothing to do with this," sabi ni Sto. Domingo na idinagdag na tumutulong lamang siya kay Sunico at walang bayad, pro bono ang serbisyo niya bilang manananggol.

For a very long time now, the NPC has been accused and vilified by its critics and even by our more "respectable" colleagues from the profession of being "corrupt" for alleged engaging in all sorts of unethical practices; its members and officers they derisively describes as "below standard" media practitioners.

day, are fully aware of the complexity of the problems plaguing the profession.
