

SSS urges member-borrowers to avail loan condonation program as April 1 deadline nears

WITH only less than 10 days left, the state-run Social Security System (SSS) urged its members with outstanding loan obligations to avail themselves of the Loan Restructuring Program (LRP) with penalty condonation before its deadline of accepting of applications on April 1, 2019.

"We appeal to our members to please avoid the rush. We encourage those who have unpaid loans to immediately file their LRP applications at any SSS branch near them before the last day of application on April 1 to minimize the influx of applicants on the last day," Acting President and Chief Executive Officer Aurora Ignacio said.

The LRP with penalty condonation offers member-borrowers an opportunity to settle their past due short-term loans, where penalties are waived through a conditional condonation.

"We will condone penalties after the member's full payment of the outstanding principal and interest of the restructured loan within the approved term," Ignacio said.

From its first launch in 2016 until February 28 this year, SSS has condoned



over P21.5 billion in penalties and restructured P23 billion loans for over 1.41 million member-borrowers.

"We're hoping more members will avail of the program before the deadline," she added.

SSS implemented LRP in response to clamor from members who failed to pay their loans due to financial constraints caused by calamities. The short-term loan must also be overdue for at least six months.

Members can pay their overdue loan in full within 30 days with no additional interest, or apply for an

installment payment of up to five years with minimal interest rate of three percent per annum.

LRP Applicants should bring duly accomplished LRP form, identification document and Letter of Authorization (LOA), in case application is being filed through an authorized representative.

Short-term loans covered by the program are calamity loan, loan, emergency educational loan, Study-Now-Pay-Later, Voc-Tech Loans and Investment Incentive Loan.

23 Cavite LGUs receive DILG recognition for transparency

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite — All 23 local government units (LGUs) in Cavite province received their citations from the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) on March 8 for accountability and transparency in local governance in 2018.

DILG 4-A (Calabarzon) Director Manuel Gotis lauded Cavite Governor Jesus Crispin Remulla for spearheading the good governance initiatives for the province's seven cities and 16 municipalities.

Gotis presented the citations and recognition during the joint Provincial Peace and Order Council and Provincial Anti-Drug Abuse Council meeting at the Sherwood Hill Golf and Country Club in Barangay Cabezas here.

Seven cities got citations for the local governance yardstick — Bacoor, Cavite, Dasmariñas, General Trias, Imus, Tagaytay, and Trece Martires.

Sixteen towns were also honored — Alfonso, Amadeo, Carmona,

General Emilio Aguinaldo, General Alvarez, Indang, Kawit, Magallanes, Maragondon, Mendez-Núñez, Noveleta, Rosario, Silang, Tanza, Ternate.

According to DILG 4-A, the LGUs demonstrated "efficiency in managing financial resources as certified by Commission on Audit."

Gotis and Remulla presented the citations to the city mayors, led by Bacoor City Mayor Lani Mercado-Revilla, and to the 16 town officials, led by Cavite Mayors' League Federation president and Carmona Mayor Dahlia Loyola.

Each LGU was also recognized for performance and participation in the massive cleanup operations under the Manila Bay Rehabilitation Program.



Comelec to enforce "Baklas" ops in Calabarzon

EN. VICENTE LIM, Calamba City — The regional election director of the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) in Calabarzon (Region 4) vowed to fully enforce their "Baklas Operation" on March 29, to public and private areas of illegally posted campaign materials.

Region 4 Director lawyer Petalio disclosed to PNA over the weekend that they have already the provincial election officers in Cavite, Laguna, Rizal and Quezon about tear down illegally posted campaign materials as part of efforts to purge violators. He said it is irritating to the COMELEC illegally placed posters in violation of the election law. He have notified them a week ago and under the election law they have 72 hours to remove the

illegal campaign materials," Petalio said.

She said it is the election officer's job at the locality to monitor and notify candidates about illegally posted campaign materials bearing their names.

She cited the illegal campaign removal operation covers even those posted in private places such as houses, establishment or private lot if these did not comply the size specification of 2 by 3 feet.

"We have embarked on our operations 24/7 as we receive

various complaints of election violations this early. We assure you that we will act on the reports or complaints as we look forward to the start of the campaign for the aspirants for local positions as well as for the House of Representatives elective posts," she said.

She added that the poll body, along with the PNP and AFP, are appealing to the local candidates to help remove illegal posters and streamers even before the official start of the campaign period on March 29.



the 'Health in Tourism Program' was initiated by DOH-CALABARZON to ensure the health and safety of all persons in Tourism Related Establishments (TREs).

The objective of the program is to create and maintain a database of all TREs in the region, collaborate with other government agencies including the PCG, Department of Tourism, NGOs and other government units in developing health and safety standards for an ideal tourism establishment; monitor the establishments according to the health and safety standards; provide technical assistance to the establishments; and advocate or lobby to local chief executives for the implementation of Republic Act 9993 known as the Philippine Coast Guard Law of 2009 which states that operators and owners of resorts who fail to employ lifeguards will be penalized with fines ranging from P1,000 to P5,000 or be face jail terms of 45 days, both fine and imprisonment.

Lifeguard rescue equipment including rescue whistle and 2 sets of uniform were given by the regional office to the trainees who successfully completed the training course.

SSS Media Advisory

THE Social Security System (SSS) has extended the payment deadline for contributions payment for employers and individual members for the period of January to June 2019.

The new payment schedule allows regular employers (ERs) and household employers (HRs) who are paying contributions monthly, can pay their obligations until the end of the following month. For example, the deadline for payment of contributions for March 2019 will be on April 30, 2019.

Further, HRs can now pay contributions on a quarterly basis. They can pay any or all of the months of a calendar quarter. The calendar quarters are January

to March, April to June, July to September, and October to December. The payment deadline for HRs will be until the end of the month following the applicable calendar quarter. For example, the deadline for payment of contributions for the first quarter of the year (January to March) will be on April 30.

The contribution payment deadline for self-employed, voluntary and non-working spouse (SE/VM/NWS) members was also revised under the new guidelines.

Contribution payments from January to June 2019 will be paid until July 31, whether they are paying monthly, quarterly or semi-annual basis.

On the other hand, the contribution payment schedule for OFW members will remain the same. They can pay their contributions for the months of January to December of a given year within the same year while, contributions for the months of October to December of a given year can be paid until the 31st of January of the succeeding year. For example, the deadline for payment of contributions for January 2019 is until December 31, 2019 while the deadline for payment for October 2019 will be on January 31, 2020.

GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, on August 1, 2018, petitioner, PAUL I. PRIJOLES, through counsel, filed a petition against GERLYN E. PRIJOLES, for Declaration of Nullity of Marriage, which reads as follows:

"PETITION

COMES NOW, Petitioner, by counsel and, unto this Honorable Court, most respectfully alleges- THAT:

1. He is of legal age, married to herein respondent, Filipino and with residence and postal address at 957 San Antonio 1, Noveleta, Cavite, while Respondent is also of legal age, married to herein Petitioner, Filipino and with residence and postal address at San Miguel St., Poblacion, Nawasa, Noveleta, Cavite, where she may be served Summons and other legal processes;
2. They got married on 4 May 1995 in Noveleta, Cavite, as evidenced by a copy of their Certificate of Marriage which is attached as Annex "A" hereof and made integral part of this Petition;
3. Their marriage produced one child named Julius Ellarinas Prijoles who was born on 25 July 1996 in Noveleta, Cavite, as proven by a copy of his Certificate of Live Birth marked as Annex "B" hereof;
4. It was in 1993 when he was twenty-three (23) years old when he met her who was only eighteen (18) years young. She was new in the factory she was working in and had just recently broken up with her boyfriend. She was known as flirt because she dressed seductively and was somewhat dramatic. She always wanted and enjoyed being the center of attention;
5. Soon, he courted her until they became an item. However, early on, they had several disagreements because she did not inform him of her whereabouts but he learned that she went out with her friend in drinking sessions. She was stubborn she did not want to compromise. She binged on alcoholic beverages;
6. Her interpersonal relationships were unstable. She entertained suitors while she was in a relationship with him. She also introduced male friends to him. Still, they had sexual intercourse until she became pregnant unexpectedly;
7. Petitioner relied on his family to make decisions for him. He was afraid to lose their support. Thus, he was easily pressured to marry the Respondent because his sisters, who were the conservative types, insisted. They did not want illegitimate nephews and nieces. They wanted that they bear their family name;
8. The wedding was celebrated on 04 May 1995 at the Parish Church, Noveleta, Cavite. She was five (5) months pregnant at the time. Unfortunately, her first pregnancy resulted to spontaneous abortion after she fell while going down the stairs while they were arguing. She was very hard-headed and refused to listen to anyone trying to prevent her from leaving. Good for her, a month later she again became pregnant;
9. She continued to be stubborn. She refused to stay home to take care of their child and continued to stay out with friends. She landed a job in Noveleta Industries where she was later on promoted as Quality Assistant. Because Petitioner was constrained to quit his job, he was reduced to staying home and taking care of their son;
10. Respondent would often come home late reasoning out that she performed overtime work but which he found out to be untrue the truth being that she would attend birthdays and other events to be able to drink with her friends. One time, because Noveleta Industries was near their place of residence, he thought of fetching her but he learned she had left early before 5:00 in the evening and went out with friends. He sent her a text message but she lied to him saying she was still in the workplace. He found out she was lying thru the log book;
11. One time, his friends squealed to him that they saw the Respondent with another man inside Villamar Beach Resort in Noveleta, Cavite holding hands while strolling along the shoreline. It was with this man with whom Respondent bore two (2) children, both girls, because she had the third one aborted;
12. Whenever there were company occasions and gatherings, Respondent would not invite him and their son to join her because she would reason out, they would just be a hindrance to their drinking sessions. Worse, she would even hide from them the true venue of the company occasions and gatherings so they would not be able to follow her there;
13. After coming from her drinking spree, she would refuse to sleep beside him and deny him her wifely obligation. He would get the feel that she was trying to evade him. This had caused him to lose his self-confidence at times because he was getting the impression that she was distancing herself away from him because he could not make her happy, sexually, that is;
14. He also noticed that whenever she would leave the house, she always dressed impressively as if she was still single with no husband and family. Respondent would even buy things like dresses for herself alone and would even hide this from him. He would just be surprised see her wearing new clothes and accessories;
15. As of year 2000, Petitioner continued to be unemployed. It was at this point in time when he learned Respondent was dating another man from her very own friends. One time, his friends squealed to him that they saw the Respondent with another man inside Villamar Beach Resort in Noveleta, Cavite holding hands while strolling along the shoreline. It was with this man with whom Respondent bore two (2) children, both girls, because she had the third one aborted;
16. He lost no time and confronted about the news he was receiving with regards to her flings. She just made empty promises that she would not have anything to do with another or any man other than him and he naively believe her;
17. However, she was hardly at home most of the time and their child was already getting neglected. She was spending the money that was meant for the children and pay for the bills on other unimportant things like her gimmicks with her friends. He reminded her about this but she did not want to hear his thoughts;
18. Even while having disagreements she left the house when her friends arrived to invite her and would refuse to be dissuaded until, one time, when their disagreements escalated

he slapped her face;

19. In February 2002, Respondent left the house and stayed with her parents. She brought their son. A few months later, he found out she was having a relationship with her lover right, of all places, in her parent's house;
20. He was able to work in EFZA as a factory worker and then later to Noveleta Industries. When Respondent found out he was employed she transferred their son's care to him. Julius was already six (6) years old by then;
21. After almost sixteen (16) long years of lack of communication and separation, Petitioner decided to start moving on with his life while he still has time. He deemed it best to file for the annulment of his "marriage" with her. Thus, this instant Petition;
22. In a fourteen-page Psychiatric Evaluation Report prepared by Dra. Jay Madelon C. Carcereny, a copy of which is attached as Annexes "C" to "C-13" hereof, respondent, Gerlyn E. Prijoles was diagnosed to be suffering from a Borderline Personality Disorder, a pervasive pattern of instability of interpersonal relationships, self-image and affects, and marked impulsivity beginning by early adulthood and present in a variety of contexts, as indicated by five or more of the following:
 1. Frantic efforts to avoid real or imagined abandonment.
 2. A pattern of unstable and intense interpersonal relationships characterized by alternating between extremes of idealization and devaluation.
 3. Identity disturbance, markedly persistently unstable self-image or sense of self.
 4. Impulsivity in at least 2 areas that are potentially self-damaging (spending, sex, substance abuse, reckless driving, binge eating) Spends excessively, considers purchases as a "quick fix" considers money as a form of affection. She binges in alcoholic beverages.
 5. Recurrent suicidal behavior, gestures, or threats, or self-mutilating behavior.
 6. Affective instability due to a marked reactivity of mood (e.g. intense dysphoria, irritability, anxiety, lasting for a few hour or a few days).
 7. Chronic feelings of emptiness.
 8. Inappropriate intense anger or difficulty controlling anger (e.g. frequent displays of anger, constant anger, recurrent physical fights).
 9. Transient stress-related paranoid ideations or severe dissociative symptoms.
23. Interview of Respondent, Gerlyn Ellarinas Prijoles, yielded the following information, to quote:

"She is the third of five siblings, born in Noveleta, Cavite. Her father, Dionisio Ellarinas, was a Policeman. He went to night clubs. He drank alcoholic beverages with his friends. He is deceased at present.

Her mother, Catherine, was a housewife.

Her parents had disagreements when her father arrived home late. She took elementary at the San Rafael Elementary. Her grades were above average. She admits being the school bully, 'Ako nambully'.

She took high-school in Noveleta National High-School. She had short-lived relationships, 'hindi serious'.

Her interpersonal relationships were unstable.

Gerlyn admits wrist-cutting, after her parents almost separated. Gerlyn wanted to be a Teacher someday.

She took a course in Hotel and Restaurant Management, until 2nd semester. She dropped out because of financial constraints when her father took ill.

Gerlyn was closer to her father.

She worked as a Factory worker for 16 years.

1994, Gerlyn met Paul in Noveleta factory.

Paul was using Methamphetamine 'shabu'.

Gerlyn became a Supervisor. She came home late.

She admits having relationship, after she left Paul.

She complained that Paul was physically abusive. He had paranoid and jealous delusions. She explained, 'nananakit na siya, ninanakawan niya ako, tamang duga siya piangseselosan niya lahat.'

Their son Julius is with Paul.

Gerlyn works in Abu Dhabi, as a Domestic helper. She comes home every 2 years."
24. Based also on the interviews of the same people, Petitioner Paul I. Prijoles, was found suffering from ANTI-SOCIAL PERSONALITY DISORDER the manifestations of which are the following, to quote:
 1. Failure to conform to social norms with respect to lawful behaviors as indicated by repeatedly performing acts that are grounds for arrest;
 2. Deception, as indicated by repeatedly lying, use of aliases, or conning other for personal profit or pleasure;
 3. Impulsiveness or failure to plan ahead;
 4. Irritability and aggressiveness, as indicated by repeated physical fights or assaults;
 5. Reckless disregard for safety of self or others;
 6. Consistent irresponsibility, as indicated by repeated failure to sustain consistent work behavior or honor financial obligations;
 7. Lack of remorse, as indicated by being indifferent to or rationalizing having hurt, mistreated, or stolen from another;

B) The individual is at least age 18 years.

Paul Prijoles presented with 5 traits fulfilling the criteria.

N.B. Antisocial personality disorder, sometimes called sociopathy, is a mental condition in which a person consistently shows no regard for right and wrong and ignores the rights and feelings of others. People with antisocial personality disorder tend to antagonize, manipulate or treat others harshly or with callous indifference. They show no guilt or remorse for their behavior.

Individuals with antisocial personality disorder often violate the law becoming criminals. They may lie, behave violently or impulsively, and have problems with drug and alcohol use. Because of these characteristics, people with this disorder typically can't fulfill responsibilities related to family, work or school.
25. Dra. J.M. Castillo-Carcereny recommends that the marriage between the parties be declared null and void on the ground of psychological incapacity of both parties. Stated Dra. Carcereny: "Based on the above findings, it is therefore recommended that Gerlyn Ellarinas-Prijoles' marriage to Paul Prijoles, be declared null and void, on the basis of his psychological incapacity to handle essential marital obligations. Manifested during early adulthood. The root cause is her dysfunctional family and environment. Her Personality disorder is GRAVE and INCURABLE. They are both incapable of co-habiting with each other, nor do they have the ability to give mutual support, love, respect, and trust."
26. The parties did not acquire any property of note during their turbulent period of marriage and reconciliation at this point in time next to impossible.

WHEREFORE, all the foregoing premises considered, it is most respectfully prayed of this Honorable Court that, after hearing, judgment be rendered declaring the marriage contracted by petitioner with respondent on 4 May 1995 in Noveleta, Cavite null and void from the beginning on the ground of psychological incapacity of both parties pursuant to the provisions of Article 36 of the Family Code and ordering the cancellation of its registration in the Office of the Local Civil Registrar of Noveleta, Cavite and the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA).

Other relief and remedies which may be just and equitable under the premises are likewise prayed for by the petitioner.





