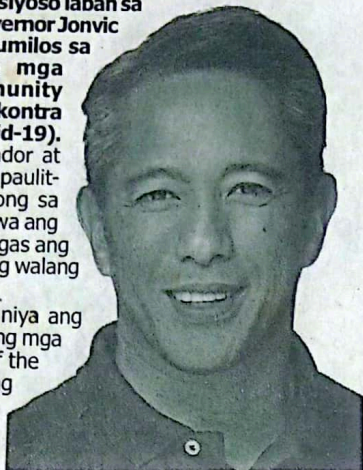

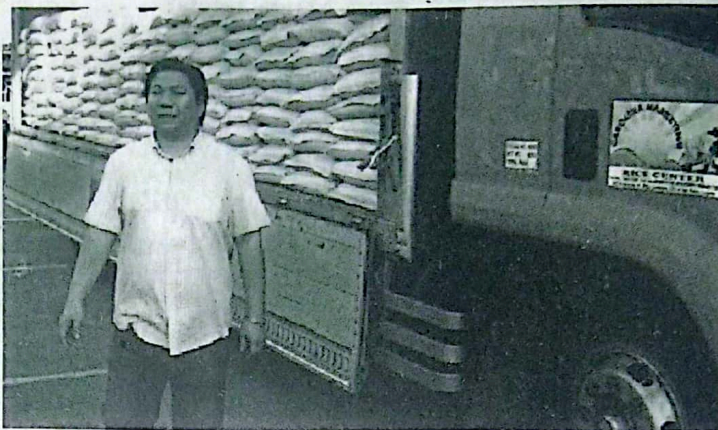

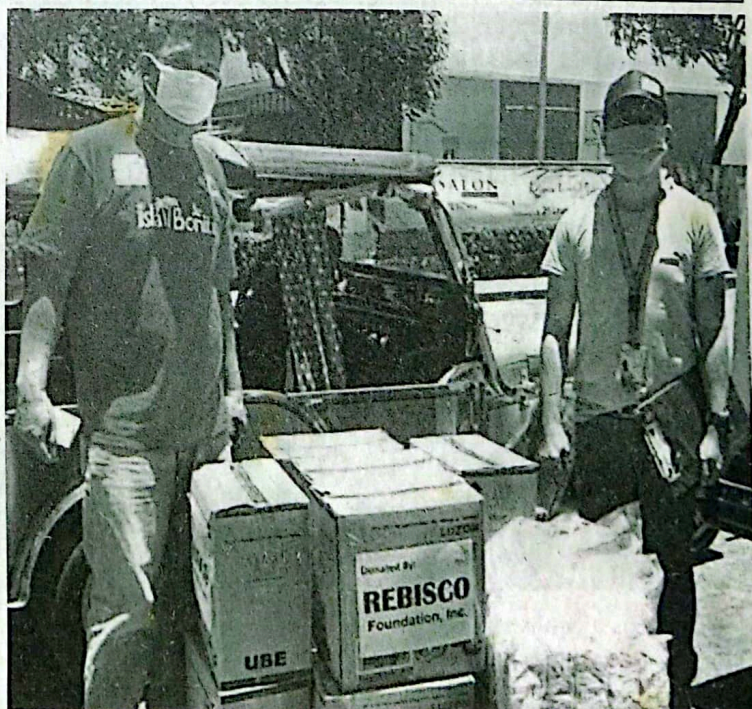

NTC CANNOT GRANT PROVISIONAL AUTHORITY TO ABS-CBN TO CONTINUE OPERATION

AS we go to the printing press, this Monday, May 4, the legislative franchise of ABS-CBN Corporation has already expired, and there are rumors that the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC) is drafting provisional authority to grant the broadcast giant which will allow it to operate while the renewal of its franchise is pending in Congress.

And as you are reading this piece, you now fully know if that rumors are true or not.

If ... is the provisional authority is legal and constitutional?

We can only guess and rely on the statement made by Solicitor General Jose Calida that only Congress can grant franchises to public utilities, including broadcasting companies, for them to operate in the country.

Calida emphasized that at present there is no law giving the NTC or any other agency the power to grant franchises to broadcasting entities.

The SolGen said that for broadcast company like the ABS-CBN to get provisional authority, it must first be granted a franchise from Congress and a pending application for a Certificate of Public Convenience from the NTC.

Calida explained that "no less than the Constitution requires a prior franchise from



Congress."

If the franchise has expired as in the case of ABS-CBN, then there is no renewal.

"The franchise expires by operation of law. The franchise ceases to exist and the entity can no longer continue its operations as a public utility," Calida explained.

Therefore, the SolGen added that the NTC can only issue a cease and desist order and/or a recall order against a broadcasting entity that has no congressional franchise.

It only mean that as of this moment, that ABS-CBN cannot operate even if NTC has granted a provisional authority to operate despite no Congressional franchise granted.

It will be recalled that on February 10, Calida has filed a quo warranto case (QWC) against the franchises of ABS-CBN Corporation and ABS-CBN Convergence before the Supreme Court.

In his QWC, Calida argued they were "unlawfully exercising their legislative franchises."

ABS-CBN Convergence's franchise had already lapsed on March 17.

He explained that a Senate resolution from a House committee calling for provisional authority to ABS-CBN is because they "merely express the House committee and the Senate Supreme Court decision.

"These issuances cannot amend requiring a congressional franchise of broadcasting networks. Not being themselves, they cannot amend or argued Calida.

He added that NTC is likewise opinion from the Department of Justice authorities.

Calida cited a Supreme Court decision invalid a 1991 DOJ opinion stating to issue a permit or authorization without franchise.

What if the NTC grants provisional ABS-CBN, what will happen?

"The (NTC) commissioners themselves to prosecution under the Corrupt Practices Act," Calida said.

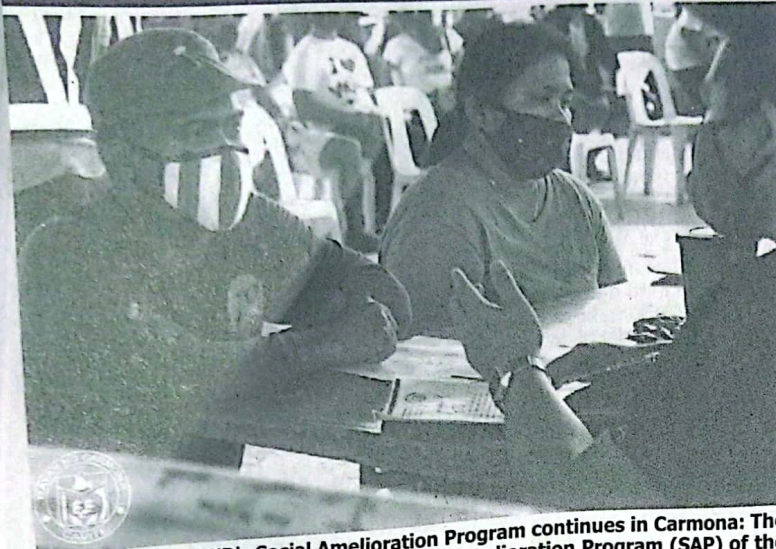

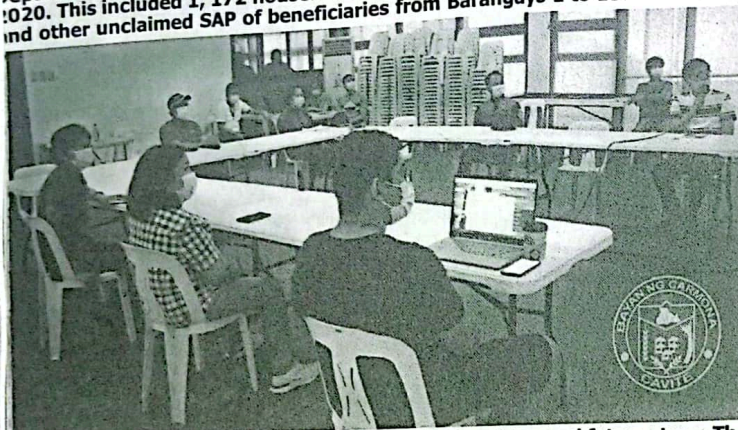

Carmona LGU reports second case of COVID-19: The local government of Carmona, through the Municipal Health Office (MHO), confirmed on May 2, 2020 the second coronavirus disease (COVID-19) positive case in the municipality. The patient is a 59-year old Filipino male and a resident from Barangay Mabuhay. He is currently admitted at Research Institute for Tropical Medicine (RITM).

DOST-ITDI's Ready-to-Eat food expands product and market share

Currently, Kai Anya Foods International Corporation, maker of the Ready-to-Eat (RTE) food branded as Pack of Hope caldo, largely distributes to the Department of Social Development (DSWD) to be used during times of calamity. One of the adoptors of the technology provided by Technology Development Institute of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST-ITDI).

With the good reception to the POH, the company eyes on expanding its market by serving the increasing demand for the product from schools, non-government organizations (NGOs), and supermarkets.

In 2014, DOST-ITDI developed RTE arroz caldo to address hunger and thirst of calamity survivors for the next 48 hours. The following year, the company took a chance to adopt the technology and commercialize the said product. It has been producing and marketing the Pack of Hope RTE since 2015.

"Hindi lasang relief," is how a calamity survivor describes Pack of Hope RTE chicken arroz caldo.

DOST-ITDI's Packaging Technology Division, in partnership with DSWD in regions 7, 11 and NCR conducted a survey on the acceptability of RTE chicken arroz caldo among calamity survivors. Almost 100% rated the samples as highly acceptable as relief foods. The taste is very acceptable and very convenient because it is ready to eat, easy-open and requires no preparation and cooking. It also does not contain preservatives (source: DOSTV).

Eventually, other enterprises saw the market potential for safe

and delicious RTE food products. One company from the Visayas has already signed a memorandum of agreement for the adoption and commercialization of RTE chicken arroz caldo. Another company from NCR also intends to adopt the RTE chicken arroz caldo and RTE smoked fish rice meal variant.

Kai Anya's RTE arroz caldo is currently the only one in the market that can be consumed without the need for hot or cold water to prepare. The commercially available arroz caldo, unlike Kai Anya's POH-RTE, are either in powder that needs hot water to cook or chilled arroz caldo that still needs to be heated.

Other than arroz caldo, DOST-ITDI has other three variants that are ready for commercialization: smoked fish rice meal, boiled sweet potato, and cassava in light syrup.

In the pipeline are RTE food products that are ready for field testing: corn soup, chicken adobo and beef tapa rice meals. Local entrepreneurs, especially those who are looking for potential business, may check out DOST-ITDI website or contact DOST-ITDI for available technologies that can be adopted for commercialization.

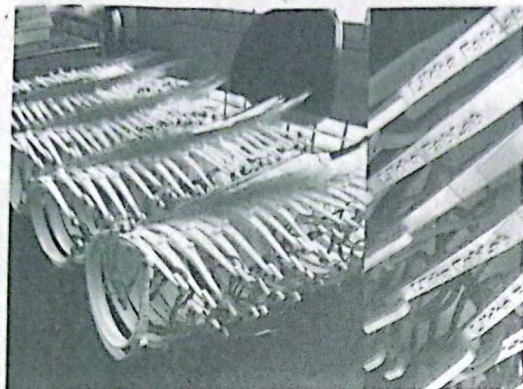

EMPLOYERS WELCOME SUBSIDY PROGRAM TO SMALL BUSINESSES

THE business groups welcomed the government's subsidy program to workers. In a statement released last week by the Philippine Exporters Confederation, Inc. and Employers Confederation of the Philippines.

The move is to provide wage subsidy to about 3.4 million workers from small businesses affected by the COVID-19 crisis.

"Anything they give to support small businesses and workers will be welcome," Sergio Ortiz Luis Jr., president of the Philippine Exporters Confederation Inc. and Employers Confederation of the Philippines, said.

Luis added that Confederation is supporting the move to conduct mass testing of workers as this can help in allowing the resumption of more

businesses.

George Barcelon, president emeritus of the Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry said he also welcomed the wage subsidy program.

"This is a big help for MSMEs because they have been struggling with the closure of businesses for more than a month now. Their financial resources are tight," he said.

Meanwhile, President Duterte said some P101.5 billion have been released by the government for its emergency subsidy program (ESP) for poor families and the informal sector affected by the COVID-19 crisis.

The President has submitted to Congress his third weekly report on the implementation of Republic Act 11469 or the Bayanihan Act.

In his report, Duterte stressed that "our government must deliver genuine, sensitive and tangible assistance to those

in need during this crisis."

He said that various national government agencies and local government units (LGUs) are implementing the ESP as part of the law's implementation that granted Duterte certain powers, including realignment of funds, to address the pandemic.

In the report, it said that as of April 8, the Department of Budget and Management has released P101.5 billion to the DSWD and DOLE for cash grants to poor families and displaced workers.

The 27-page report stated that a set of omnibus guidelines will harmonize all issuances pertaining to subsidies to speed up delivery of assistance.

Duterte reminded LGUs that the assistance should be given on a "per family basis" despite living in a single dwelling.

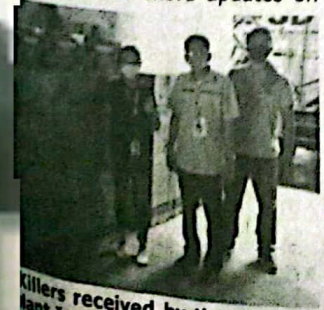

"Ang sabi sa akin, nasa barangay raw ang form at nang magpunta sa barangay, ang itinuturo e ang taga-social welfare," sabi ng solo parent.

Immuno-booster food, drinks and related products including turmeric powder, Calamansi Juice, and Banana Chips that are purchased by some local government units (LGUs) for distribution to frontliners in various areas.

In addition, he said DOST-RO2 is also working with the Department of Trade and Industry and the Department of Agriculture on the "KADIWA ng Ani at Kita" program which enables the MSMEs to display their products for promotion and marketing.

Furthermore, the DOST Regional Director also highlighted the benefits of the OneStore.ph program they developed, an e-commerce platform that helps market products of MSMEs for free. Despite the temporary suspension of some logistics companies, he said the self-enabled MSMEs are still able to deliver their products to their customers,

said DOST is now conducting clinical trials on virgin coconut oil (VCO) that is believe to have anti-viral and anti-microbial properties that can help deter the spread of the current pandemic contagion.

He likewise cited the continuous production of 70% alcohol at their DOST-Isabela State University (ISU) facility, and the utilization of their Hybrid Electric Road Train (HERT) and E-trikes that provide free transportation for front liners in Cauayan City and Tuguegarao City, respectively.

barangays' quick response fund (QRF) was utilized to provide food packs, and the second week was covered by their municipal calamity fund. "After exhausting all their savings from 2018 and 2019, the mayor did not want to deplete their calamity fund for the year 2020 because Noveleta is a flood-prone municipality," the FB post said.

Mayor Chua added: "We are only in the first quarter of the year and we don't know what will happen in the coming months, especially during

the typhoon season."

He explained that instead of depleting the town's QRF, he waived his one year's salary of around P2 million to augment their funds to purchase enough food packs for 15,000 families in all 16 barangays.

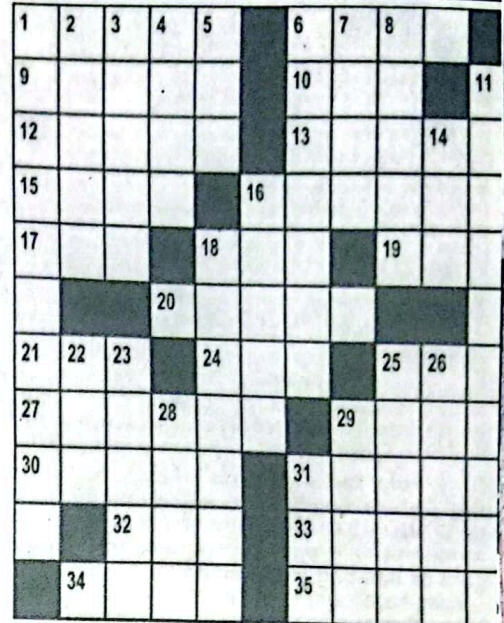

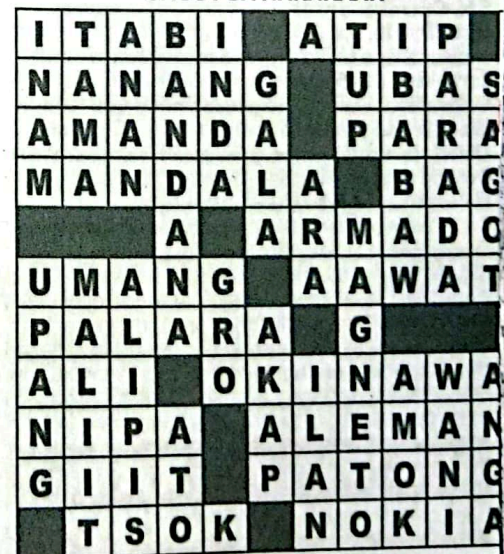
