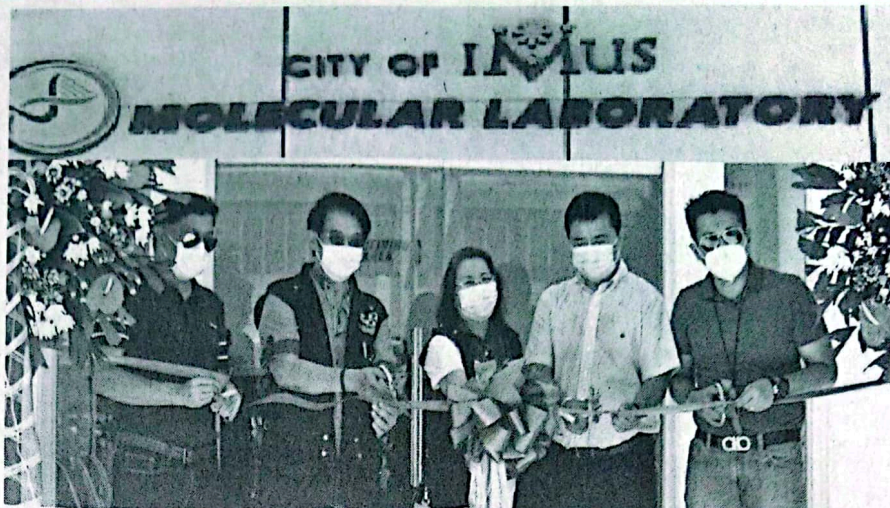

P beneficiaries in GenTri return P2.1M cash aid

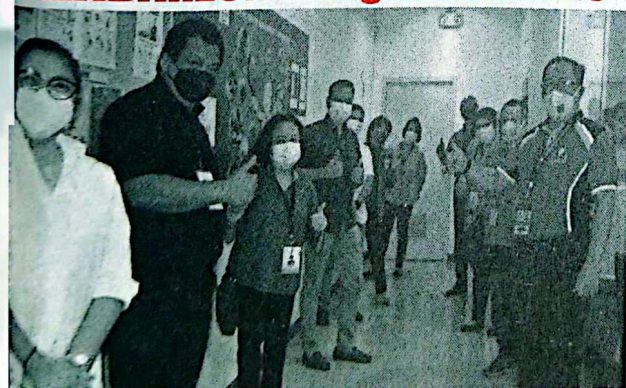

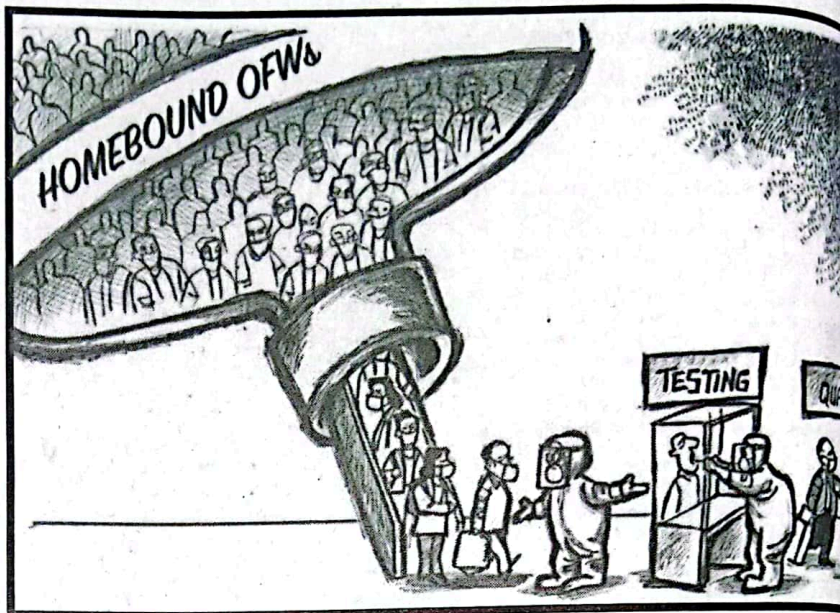

Another guard, SG Roy Fabilia, also returned the

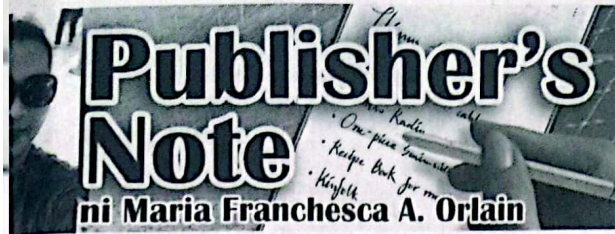
lost item from the Annex Motor Area.

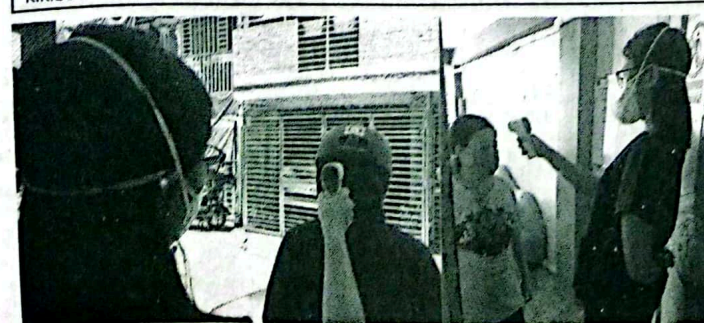
Kaya bakit nga sila ay discriminated, bawal nang lumabas, wala pang ayuda, lalo na kung may pension sa SSS o sa GSIS,

Payment Deadlines of PhilHealth Contributions



To help relieve the financial hardship currently being experienced by many Filipinos during this coronavirus pandemic crisis, self-earning individuals, professional practitioners, and members of group enrolment schemes shall be allowed to pay for their premium contributions for the 1st semester June 2020) until June 30, 2020.

For the Employed Sector, all unpaid contributions for the applicable months of February, March and April shall be acknowledged without interest until June 22, 2020 in line with the Bayanihan to Heal as One Act, RA 11469, implementing a skeletal workforce arrangement are reminded that employees with no earnings or income are properly reported through the EPRS. Employers who have stopped operations should immediately submit an electronic ER-1 or eRF-1 generated through the EPRS. Employers who have properly accomplished ER-3 to their respective Accounts or submitted the ER-3 is also required for Employers who have stopped operations.

II of DOST-CALABARZON, and Mr. Jake Lloyd Peña, Project Assistant II of DOST-CALABARZON, also helped in the facilitation of the seminar-training.

The training started with a pre-diagnostic exam to assess the participants' knowledge on these areas. Lectures, showing of re-recorded activities and AVPs, discussions, and exams were the methods used to train the participants. A post-diagnostic exam was conducted at the end of the training and resulted to a passing and high score from all the seven participants.

Since the DOST-CALABARZON FST visits the project site in Sta.

Rosa City, they can also evaluate if the food handlers are able to apply and practice their learnings on their work.

The contracted food catering service plays a vital role on the VCO project as they will be assigned to prepare and supply the meals of the study participants with the guidance of DOST-Food Nutrition Research Institute (DOST-FNRI).

On June 2, DOST-CALABARZON also conducted a monitoring visit and provided IR temperature gun for daily monitoring of temperature of food servers and food delivery service staff. Hand sanitizers were also provided to the food

delivery as they were proper use safety of the delivered participant.

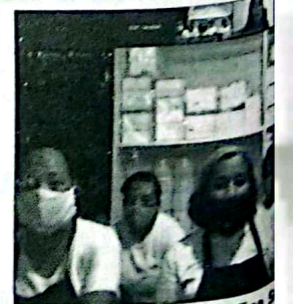

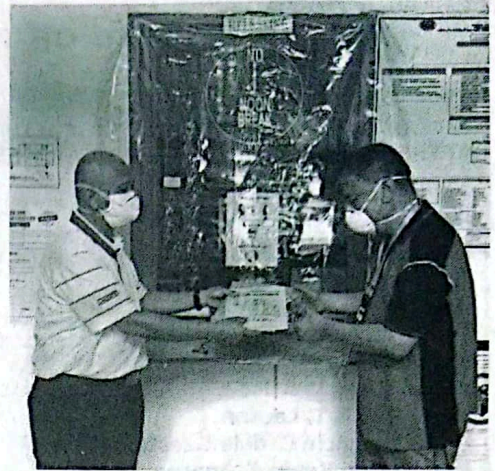

PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 279-2020

AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING BROAD-BASED TESTING FOR CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) IN THE PROVINCE OF CAVITE AND PROVIDING GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES THEREFOR

WHEREAS, President Rodrigo R. Duterte issued Proclamation No. 922 on 8 March 2020, declaring a State of Public Health Emergency throughout the Philippines, and Proclamation No. 929 on 16 March 2020, declaring a State of Calamity throughout the country in light of the Coronavirus Disease 2019) pandemic;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11469 or the Bayanihan to Heal as One Act declared a State of National Emergency over the entire country due to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, R.A. No. 11469 declared an urgent need to immediately and amply provide healthcare, including medical tests and treatments to patients, persons under investigation (PUIs), or persons under monitoring (PUMs);

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11332, otherwise known as the Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Act, declares it a policy of the State to protect the people from public health threats through the efficient and effective disease surveillance of notifiable diseases, including emerging and re-emerging infectious diseases, diseases for elimination and eradication, epidemics, and health events including chemical, radiological, and environmental agents of public health concern and provide an effective response system in compliance with the 2005 International Health Regulations of the World Health Organization (WHO);

WHEREAS, according to the WHO, diagnostic testing for COVID-19 is critical to tracking the virus, understanding epidemiology, informing case management, and to suppressing transmission;

WHEREAS, the Provincial Government of Cavite (PGC) entered into Memoranda of Agreement with the De La Salle Medical and Health Sciences Institute (DLSMHSI) for the establishment of the Cavite-DLSMHSI COVID-19 Diagnostic Center (CDCDC);

WHEREAS, the CDCDC has been certified by the Department of Health (DOH) and allowed to process test samples for COVID-19 at full scale;

WHEREAS, the PGC seeks to develop more COVID-19 diagnostic facilities through partnerships with capable institutions to increase the testing capacity in the Province and enable wide-scale testing for the novel coronavirus;

WHEREAS, to ensure the health and safety of the people of Cavite, broad-based testing for COVID-19 shall be implemented in the Province once the testing capacity has been increased through the establishment of additional diagnostic facilities;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, gives local government units such powers and authority as may be necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and that the exercise of such powers is essential to the promotion of the general welfare;

W, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Salazar, duly seconded by Hon. Gawaran and all the members present, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in session assembled that:

SECTION 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as "An Ordinance Implementing the Broad-Based Testing for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in the City of Cavite and Providing Guidelines and Procedures Therefor."

SECTION 2. Broad-Based Testing. The PGC shall implement broad-based testing of individuals for COVID-19 to control the spread of the disease in the City. Broad-based testing shall cover persons prioritized for COVID-19 testing under existing rules and regulations, as well as persons to be subjected to testing by reason of their exposure to large numbers of people, as provided in this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. Priority Testing. The following persons shall undergo testing for COVID-19 in the order indicated:

1. Patients including medical professionals and health workers exhibiting severe to critical symptoms of COVID-19 with known travel history or contact to a positive patient.
2. Medical professionals and healthcare workers with mild symptoms and known exposure to a positive patient, and all patients with mild symptoms of COVID-19 classified as suspect cases who are (1) known to be high-risk with pre-existing medical conditions and/or members of the vulnerable groups and (2) with known travel history or contact to a positive patient.
3. Medical professionals and health workers with no symptoms (asymptomatic) but with known exposure to a positive patient, and all asymptomatic patients with known travel history or contact to a positive patient.
4. Medical professionals and health workers in hospitals, quarantine/isolation facilities, and specimen collection sites, whether or not they show symptoms of COVID-19 or have a history of travel or contact to a positive patient.
5. Security and utility personnel working in hospitals.
6. The following individuals, whether or not they show symptoms of COVID-19 or have a history of travel or contact to a positive patient:
 - a. Members of the police and barangay officials manning checkpoints and enforcing protocols placed in connection with the community quarantine;
 - b. Public market workers; and
 - c. Public utility vehicle (PUV) drivers.

Where tests shall be conducted at the CDCDC or at any DOH-accredited testing facility established and/or contracted by the PGC ("Provincial Testing Center") following the procedure provided in this Ordinance. The PGC shall bear the expenses for the same.

SECTION 4. High-Vector Testing. The following establishments are highly encouraged to subject their employees to COVID-19 testing, whether or not they show symptoms of COVID-19 or have a history of travel or contact to a positive patient:

1. Supermarkets, groceries, convenience stores, pharmacies and drug stores, food preparation and delivery services, and water-refilling stations;
2. Pawnshops, and money transfer services;
3. Factories.

For the above tests shall be borne by the respective employers of the individuals concerned. The same may be done at any DOH-licensed COVID-19 Testing Center, including any Provincial Testing Center, provided that the latter shall not run the above tests until all priority individuals under Section 3 have been tested for such purpose, the Provincial Epidemiology Surveillance Unit (PESU) shall determine the date on which the above tests may be done at a Provincial Testing Center.

SECTION 5. Payment. High-vector tests as provided in the previous section which are to be performed at a Provincial Testing Center shall be paid to the officers duly authorized by the Provincial Treasurer's Office (PTO) designated at the local testing centers/booths. A Testing Fee in the amount of Two Hundred Pesos (P2,200.00) shall be charged for each test. The collection officer shall issue the corresponding receipt and a slip which shall be submitted prior to specimen collection.

Collection officers shall account for all payments collected within their respective areas to the PTO.

Amounts collected shall be deposited to a trust fund, which shall be utilized for the continued operation of the Provincial Testing Center. Expenses such as, but not limited to, procurement of testing kits and logistical and technical equipment, repair and maintenance of Polymerase Chain Reaction machines and other equipment, incentives for medical technologists and laboratory personnel, and charges imposed by private partners, shall be charged to the said trust fund.

SECTION 6. Testing Expansion. Once the individuals under Sections 3 and 4 of this Ordinance have undergone testing, the following shall likewise be tested for COVID-19, subject to availability of resources:

1. Employees of government offices;
2. Residents;
3. Citizens;
4. Teachers and employees of educational institutions.

Costs of the tests shall be borne by the PGC, except for those teachers and employees of private educational institutions, which shall be shouldered by their respective employers.

Only individuals may be subject to testing at a Provincial Testing Center only upon such date as the PESU may determine, considering the testing capacity of the Center.

SECTION 7. Testing on Demand. Individuals not qualified for broad-based testing under Sections 3, 4, and 6 may avail of the testing services of a Provincial Testing Center, but only upon such date and such conditions as may be determined by the PESU to ensure the unhampered testing of priority individuals, and upon payment of the special fee of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) per test.

Under this section must comply with the procedure on payment, registration, sample collection, and encoding as provided in this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. Registration. Individuals for COVID-19 testing as provided in Sections 3, 4, 6, and 7 shall register at the registration areas designated at the city/ municipal halls, local testing centers/booths, or such other places as may be established by the PGC and other local government units (LGUs).

Individuals at the registration areas shall require the presentation of the following documents as proof of qualification for testing:

1. Medical professionals and health workers:
 - a. Company ID, Professional Regulation Commission ID, or Certificate of Employment
2. Priority personnel

- a. Security Guard License
- b. Duty Detail Order
3. Utility personnel
 - a. Company ID
 - b. Certificate of Employment
4. Members of the police and barangay officials:
 - a. Office ID, Certificate of Employment, or appointment document
5. Public market workers:
 - a. Company ID or any proof evidencing fact of employment at public market
6. Drivers of public utility vehicles:
 - a. Certificate of Public Convenience or any satisfactory proof of operation of PUV; and
 - b. Professional driver's license
7. Employees under Section 4:
 - a. Company ID or Certificate of Employment
8. Government employees:
 - a. Office ID, Certificate of Employment, or appointment document
9. Senior citizens
 - a. Senior Citizen ID; or
 - b. Any government-issued ID showing fact of age
10. Students
 - a. Student ID; or
 - b. Certificate of Registration and any government-issued ID
11. Teachers and employees of public educational institutions:
 - a. Office ID, Certificate of Employment, or appointment document
12. Teachers and employees of private educational institutions:
 - a. Company ID or Certificate of Employment

Suspected patients and all patients exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 shall register at local testing centers/booths, where the officer concerned shall ask them for symptoms and travel and contact history. The said persons need not present any proof of qualification prior to registration, but may be registered upon the referral of the City/Municipal Health Office (C/MHO) concerned.

The personnel assigned at registration shall obtain the following information from the registrant, in addition to such information necessary for completion of the Case Investigation Form for COVID-19 patients provided by the DOH:

1. Full name;
2. Address;
3. Date of birth;
4. Sex;
5. Contact information;
6. Social Security System/Government Service Insurance System number, if any;
7. Tax Identification Number, if any;
8. Identification photograph; and
9. Signature.

All information obtained shall be processed in accordance with the Data Privacy Act and all pertinent laws, rules, and regulations.

An identification card, designated as the Cavite Health Card, shall be issued to the registrant. The said card shall bear the photograph, full name, address, and signature of the registrant, with the corresponding Quick Response (QR) Code.

The Cavite Health Card must be tagged according to priority, as follows:

1. "A1" for those falling under Section 3(1);
2. "A2" for those falling under Section 3(2);
3. "A3" for those falling under Section 3(3);
4. "A4" for those falling under Section 3(4);
5. "A5" for those falling under Section 3(5);
6. "A6" for those falling under Section 3(6);
7. "B" for those falling under Section 4;
8. "C" for those falling under Section 6; and
9. "D" for those falling under Section 7.

Persons for priority testing under Section 3 shall be prioritized in registration.

SECTION 9. Online Registration. The Provincial Information and Communications Technology Office (PICTO) shall make provisions for online registration for the Cavite Health Card, where the registrant shall provide the required information stated in the previous section. Upon completion of online registration, the system shall generate a code which shall be used by the registrant for verification purposes.

Verification shall then be conducted at the registration areas, where the Cavite Health Card will be issued to the registrant once he has satisfactorily established his identity and qualification for broad-based testing.

SECTION 10. Registration of Hospital Patients. Patients admitted in hospitals who are to be subjected to COVID-19 testing at a Provincial Testing Center shall be registered by the concerned City/Municipal Epidemiology Surveillance Unit (C/MESU) through the online registration procedure provided in the previous section, using information provided by the Disease Surveillance Officer (DSO) of the said hospital.

Verification of the registration shall be conducted as soon as practicable at registration areas.

SECTION 11. Use of Cavite Health Card. The Cavite Health Card shall be used by the PGC in determining the number of positive patients, the number of tests conducted locally, the location of positive patients, and other similar information. The same shall also be used for other purposes beneficial to the people of Cavite as may be allowed under existing laws, rules, and regulations.

SECTION 12. Specimen Collection. Persons subject to testing shall proceed to their local testing centers/booths or at designated facilities and premises.

Health Card to the concerned personnel. They shall then be subjected to specimen collection to be conducted by duly trained personnel. The collected specimens shall be transported to the Provincial Testing Center, in accordance with relevant guidelines set out by the DOH.

Specimens collected shall be appropriately marked based on their priority following the tags provided in the last paragraph of Section 8.

Specimens collected from patients admitted in hospitals shall be transmitted to the concerned (C/MESU) or directly to the Provincial Testing Center upon proper coordination with the PESU. The C/MESU or the DSO shall tag the specimen in accordance with the previous paragraph.

Establishments that opt to have their employees tested in a DOH-licensed laboratory other than a Provincial Testing Center shall instruct the latter to transmit results of the said tests to the PESU for proper encoding.

Individuals other than those for priority testing shall be subjected to specimen collection only upon such date as the PESU may determine pursuant to the last paragraph of Sections 4, 6, and 7.

SECTION 13. Order of Testing. The specimens received by a Provincial Testing Center shall be tested in the order of priority provided under the last paragraph of Section 8.

SECTION 14. Encoding. Personnel at the Provincial Testing Center shall encode the result of the COVID-19 test for each patient to the database to be prepared by the PESU. The PESU shall have access to the database and shall be the one responsible for transmitting test result information to the concerned testing center/hospital duly authorized persons/entities after proper verification/validation. The concerned testing center/hospital shall then inform the patient of the test results.

Test results encoded shall prompt an urgent notification to the PESU through the system created by the PICTO.

SECTION 15. Treatment of Patients. Patients who test positive for COVID-19 with mild or no symptoms, as well as suspected patients with pending test results shall be confined to an isolation facility to be established by the respective city/municipal government in which they reside. In the absence of an isolation facility, the patients shall be confined in any isolation facility established or identified by the PGC. If the patient is already admitted in a medical facility, the patient shall be placed in isolation until cleared of COVID-19.

Patients under isolation must be managed in accordance with the guidelines set by the DOH under Memorandum No. 2020-0109 and other pertinent issuances of the Department of Health.

SECTION 16. Reporting. Each city/municipal government shall form a Task Force for the COVID-19 testing which shall submit to the provincial and regional health offices a daily action report covering 12:00 noon to 12:00 noon every 5:00 PM following the procedure provided under Memorandum Circular No. 2020-073 of the Department of the Interior and Local Government.

Reporting of COVID-19 test results shall comply with all applicable DOH guidelines and other pertinent issuances of the government.

SECTION 17. Repealing Clause. All ordinances, resolutions and executive orders inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.

SECTION 18. Separability Clause. If any part or portion of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions not affected thereby shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect.


SECTION 19. Effectivity Clause. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.

19 transmission, there are certain measures relevant to both diseases."

He added that, "Usual precautions to protect healthcare workers from TB must continue along with additional actions to protect them from COVID-19."

During the program, the USAID's TB Platforms team enthusiastically shared the recent studies for TB and COVID-19 as well as the common IPC measures applicable during this pandemic.

Also, clarifications on the importance of the use of N95 masks at work and in public places and on recent guidelines detailing how to protect healthcare workers from COVID-19 while they are literally exposed to those who are asymptomatic of the virus were given light on.

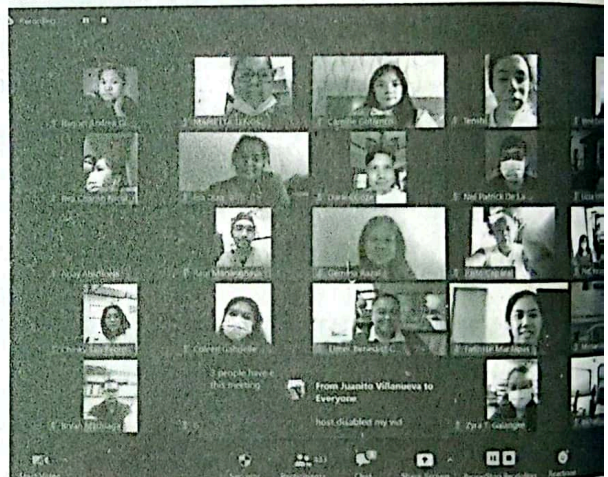
Similarly, PHCICC team led by Ms. Karen Isip shared how the

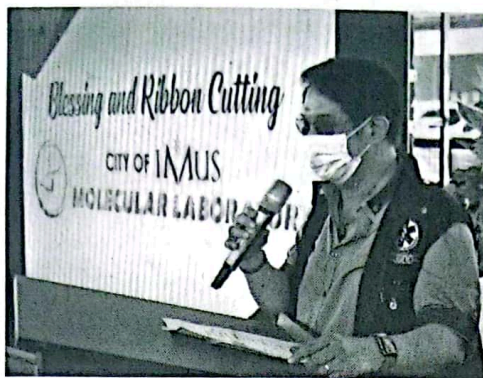

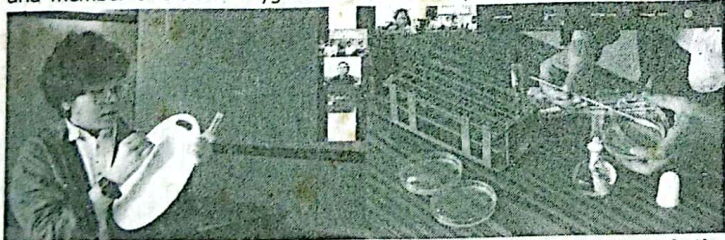

In order to ease the financial burden being suffered by all Filipinos during this Corona Virus 19 pandemic, the following rules may be observed by Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) affected by the enforcement of R.A. 11223 otherwise

* On the rate increase: OFWs may pay at the previous rate of P2,400.00 as initial payment

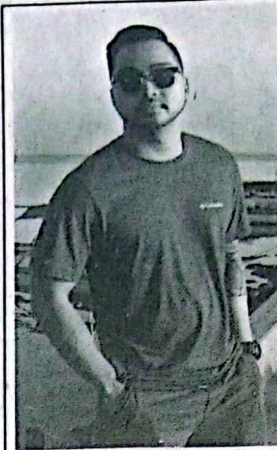
* On the schedule of payments: OFWs are granted one (1) year or twelve (12) months from the date of their initial payment to complete their balance for the year.

Premium payment shall be voluntary for the duration of the pandemic. All are advised, however, that the provisions of R.A. 11223 still apply, although temporarily suspended due to the pandemic, pending amendment of the Law, if any, be the Congress of the Republic of the Philippines.

Repatriated Migrant Workers or Overseas Filipinos in distress should secure an OWWA Certification to be presented to the local social welfare officers as a requirement for them to be considered as Indirect Contributors.
