

Gov. Remulla shares province's best practices, insights against COVID-19

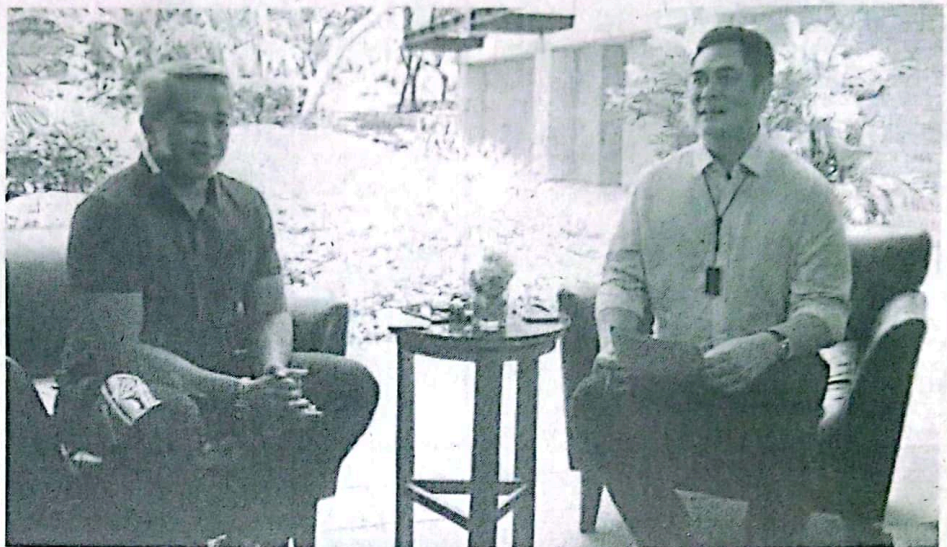
General Trias City, Cavite Aug 14, 2020 – Governor Jonvic Remulla gave his usual in-depth answers for the COVID-19 situation in the province during a brief interview by Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO) Secretary Martin Andana in yesterday's visit of the national task force in the province.

During the interview, Remulla shared the local government units of the province stayed on the strict implementation of the 'at-Home' policy in the Home Stay Pass system in effect since Enhanced Community Quarantine started. Likewise, ordinances on safety health protocols like the mandatory wearing of face mask and physical distancing are strictly

implemented particularly in public places like commercial establishments, and malls with regulations limiting the time spent for basic essentials only. "The main problem in the province is that around 100,000 Caviteños are employed in the NCR where there is a very high risk of transmission which resulted to 80% of our COVID-19 positive cases," stated the governor.

Talking about the economic plans and programs for the province, Gov. Remulla said that the

REMULLA ISSUES NEW EO NO. 28 ON MALLS OPERATION

TRECE Martires City – Governor Juanito Victor 'JonVic' C. Remulla Jr. had issued an executive order providing guidelines on the operation of malls during the modified enhanced community quarantine (MECQ) in the province of Cavite.

The EO No. 28, series 2020 took effect immediately and shall remain in force until the MECQ has been lifted in the province.

Remulla signed the order Monday, August 13 in accordance with Section 465(b)(1) (vii) of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, that gives the provincial governor the power to carry out such emergency measures as may be necessary during and in the aftermath of man-made and

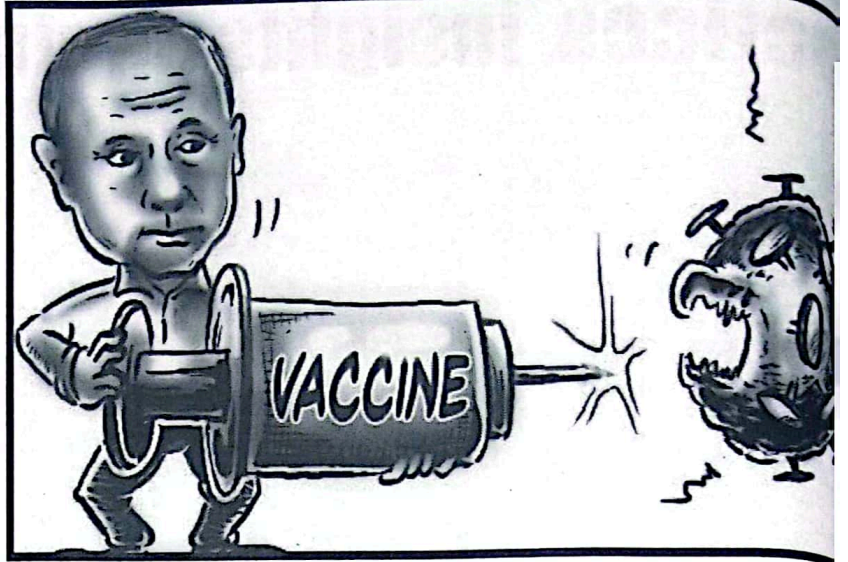
Marami nga ay walang trabaho sa loob ng mahigit nang tatlong buwan bunga ng pesteng Covid-19 pandemic, makatatanggap ka pa ng singiling abot sa langit, e sino ang hindi magwawala sa ngitgit at galit?

Kapag binususi ang bill, lalabas na hinokus-pokus ang pagbasa sa nakunsumong koryente na katakataang "nabasa" ng kanilang meter reader sa panahong bawal ang lumabas dahil nga sa pinaiiral na enhance community quarantine (ECQ) sa 22 lungsod at 86 na munisipalidad na sinerbisuhan nito.

Pati ang nakaw at nawawalang koryente dahil sa depekto ng transmission ay sinisingil sa mga consumer na hindi naman sila ang may kasalanan.

Isa pang nakadidismaya ay ang walang abisong pagdaragdag na dagdag singil na P47 fee kung magbabayad ng kunsumo gamit ang online payment.

Kungdi ito pagsasamantala, ano ang maitatawag dito?

Ang nakagagalit pa, kung di nga makabayad agad, kinukuha ang kuntador na ang may-ari mismo ay ang electric consumer.

Mayroong unpaid refunds, kasama umaaabot sa P19.26 billion ang hindi, consumer mula pa noong 2003.

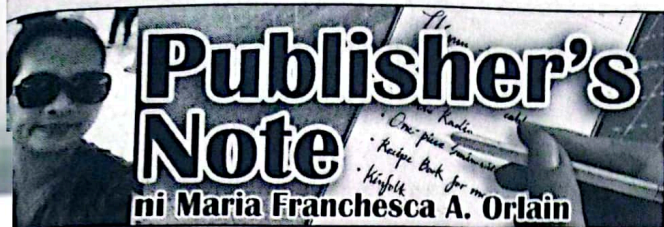

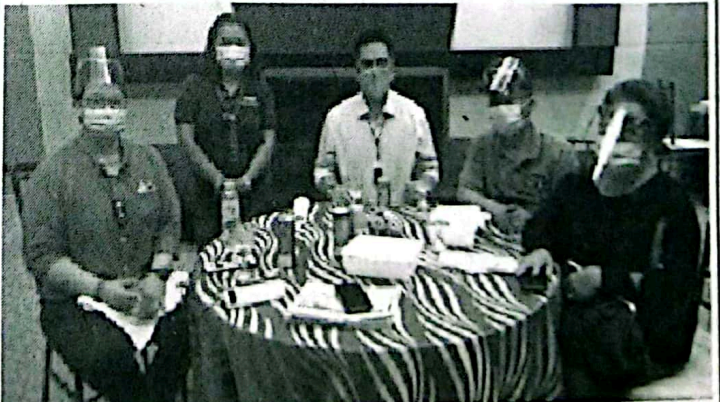
Gov. Remulla reiterated the call for the public to observe the strict compliance of the health protocols at ang stay at home policy ng government.

packs and face masks were distributed in the 11 barangays in the Poblacion area. Other barangays that received food packs include: Barangay Pinagtupunan - 2,300 packs; Tapia - 1,600 packs; Manggahan - 5,300 packs; and Pasong Camachile 1 - 8,700 packs.

The remaining 18 barangays are scheduled to receive relief packs from the local government before the MECQ period ends on

infrastructure projects soon to start will give the economy a boost. "We are now in the final stages of negotiations for the Sangley International Airport with a Php550B worth of investment. This would create about 10,000 jobs in construction and more than 50,000 jobs when it is operational and up to a million more jobs from tourism, transportation, and services," revealed Remulla.

Moreover, the road infrastructure projects like

CALAX and the Coastal Road which will decongest traffic in Aguinaldo highway and other major thoroughfares in the province would contribute to faster economic progress of the province and neighbouring cities and provinces since construction gives a huge multiplier effect in economy.

When asked if ever the government declares the four high risk areas including the province under ECQ, Governor

The province was placed under MECQ by President Rodrigo R. Duterte on August 4 to 18, in response to the surge in confirmed Covid-19 cases in the country, said the EO.

The EO was issued by Remulla to modify the guidelines on mall operations in the province "to ensure uniformity with the guidelines established by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID)."

The operations of malls under the EO are as follows:

1. Only establishments inside mall premises that are allowed to operate in areas under MECQ pursuant to IATF guidelines are allowed to open;

2. Malls shall allow entrance of patrons from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM only and shall ensure no patrons are inside mall premises by 6:00 PM.; however, groceries/supermarkets, pharmacies/drug stores, and banks inside malls may open at 8:00 AM.

Further, mall patrons shall be allowed inside mall premises only upon presentation of a Quarantine Pass and that each patron shall be

allowed inside mall premises for a maximum period of one (1) hour and thirty (30) minutes only, except in supermarkets where no time limit shall be imposed.

Also, mall customers shall be allowed only in malls within the city/municipality in which they reside, except for the following - (a) Residents of Cavite City and Noveleta may be allowed in malls within Rosario; (b) Residents of Naic may be allowed in malls within Tanza; (c) Residents of Ternate, Maragondon, Indang, and Amadeo may be allowed in malls within Trece Martires City; (d) Residents of Mendez, Alfonso, Magallanes, General Emilio Aguinaldo,

PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 289-2020

**AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL SUPERMARKETS, MALLS, AND DEPARTMENT STORES OPERATING WITHIN THE
 JUDICIAL JURISDICTION OF THE PROVINCE OF CAVITE TO PUT UP SIGNAGES ON LOCALLY-PRODUCED GOODS IN
 STRATEGIC AREAS**

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, President Rodrigo Roa Duterte declared the entire Luzon Island under enhanced community quarantine
 in response to the growing pandemic of COVID-19 in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, the growing pandemic of COVID-19 has brought precariousness not just to public health but also to the local economy
 in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, to help our local economy bounce back during and after this pandemic, the Provincial Government of Cavite shall
 urge its constituents to fully patronize and buy Philippine-produced products;

WHEREAS, to encourage patronage, the establishments must display visible posters informing the public that they are selling goods
 that are produced locally;

WHEREAS, Article XII, Section 12 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides in part that the State shall promote the preferential
 use of locally produced goods and adopt measures that help make them more competitive;

AND, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Lacson, duly seconded by Hon. Asistio, Hon. Anarna, and Hon. Gawaran and unanimously

approved by the members present, be it enacted by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Cavite in session duly assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This ordinance shall be known and cited as the "PRODUKTONG PINOY ORDINANCE"

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. Section 16 of the Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, declares that every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and among other things, the preservation and enrichment of culture, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological innovations, improve public morals, enhance economic prosperity and social justice, promote full employment among their residents, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS. As used in this ordinance, the following terms shall mean:

- a. Philippine products – refer to all goods and products made and produced in Cavite and in any part of the country
- b. Signage – refers to a poster, tarpaulin, with a standard size of 2'x3'

SECTION 4. SCOPE. This ordinance shall apply to all supermarkets, malls and department stores operating within the jurisdiction of the Province of Cavite.

SECTION 5. MANDATORY PROVISION. All supermarkets, malls, and department stores operating in the Province of Cavite are hereby required to put up a signage indicating the phrase, "Produktong Pinoy: Tangkilikin Sariling Atin". The signage shall be 2'x3' and shall be placed in all entry points within the area of the establishments to ensure visibility to customers. The signage shall use the official layout of the signage attached in this Ordinance as Annex "A", and forms an integral part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. PENAL PROVISION. All establishments covered by this ordinance who are found violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be meted with the following penalties:

SECTION 7. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS. Within thirty (30) days from the date of its effectivity, the Provincial Office of Tourism and Cultural Affairs Office and the Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood, and Entrepreneurial Development Office, with the assistance of the Provincial Legal Office, shall promulgate the necessary guidelines and regulations for and shall make the effective implementation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason, any section or provision of this ordinance shall be held null and void or invalid by competent authority, such judgment or action shall not affect or impair the other sections or provision hereof.

SECTION 9. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, rules and regulations or part thereof, in conflict with or inconsistent with the provision of this ordinance, are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVITY. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after its approval and compliance with posting and filing requirements.





**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 279-2020, "AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING BROAD-
 BASED TESTING FOR CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) IN THE PROVINCE OF CAVITE AND PROVIDING
 GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES THEREFOR"**

Davey Christian, Hon. Romel R. Enriquez, Hon. Edwin E. Malvar, Hon. Fulgencio C. dela Cuesta, Jr., Hon. Felix A. Grepo, Hon. Diego D. Remulla, Hon. Angelito H. Langit, Hon. Virgilio P. Varias, Hon. Nickanor N. Austria, Jr., Hon. Francisco P. Crisostomo, and Hon. Jerome Napoleon T. Gonzales

WHEREAS, Provincial Ordinance No. 279-2020 implemented broad-based testing for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in the Province of Cavite to ensure the health and safety of the people of Cavite amid the COVID-19 pandemic;

WHEREAS, changes in the circumstances and national policies necessitate the adjustments in the established protocols and guidelines under Provincial Ordinance No. 279-2020 to make it more responsive to the prevailing realities;

WHEREAS, there is a need to further enhance the abovementioned Ordinance to more effectively carry out its purpose;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, gives local government units such powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental to the efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Salazar, duly seconded by Hon. Gawaran and unanimously approved by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in session assembled that:

SECTION 1. Section 6 of Provincial Ordinance No. 279-2020 is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 6. Testing Expansion. Once the individuals under Sections 3 and 4 of this Ordinance have undergone testing, the following shall likewise be tested for COVID-19, subject to availability of resources:

1. Employees of government offices;
2. Senior citizens;
3. Students; and
4. Teachers and employees of educational institutions.

The expenses of the tests shall be borne by the PGC, except for those of teachers and employees of private educational institutions which shall be shouldered by their respective employers. For teachers and employees of private educational institutions tested at a Provincial Testing Center, a Testing Fee of Two Thousand Two Hundred Pesos (P2,200.00) per test shall be charged.

The above individuals may be subject to testing at a Provincial Testing Center only upon such date as the PESU may determine, considering the testing capacity of the Province. The Provincial Governor is hereby given authority to enter into agreements with other local government units/entities to allow the testing of such individuals prior to the aforementioned determination of the PESU.

SECTION 2. Section 7 of Provincial Ordinance No. 279-2020 is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 7. Testing on Demand. Individuals not qualified for broad-based testing under Sections 3, 4, and 6 may avail of the testing services of a Provincial Testing Center, but only upon such date and such conditions as may be determined by the Provincial Governor to ensure the unhampered testing of priority individuals, and upon payment of the special fee of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) per test.

The Provincial Governor is hereby authorized to enter into agreements with other local government units/entities to allow the testing of persons not covered by Sections 3, 4, and 6 of this Ordinance in Provincial Testing Centers. In such cases, the Testing Fee shall be determined by the Provincial Governor, considering the public policy declared in this Ordinance, which shall in no case exceed an amount of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) per test.

Tests under this section must comply with the procedure on payment, registration, sample collection, and encoding provided in this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. Section 8 of Provincial Ordinance No. 279-2020 is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 8. Registration. Individuals for COVID-19 testing as provided in Sections 3, 4, 6, and 7 shall register in the COVID-19 System to be developed by the Provincial Information and Communications Technology Office (PICTO). They shall provide the following information through online registration:

1. Full name;
2. Address;
3. Date of birth;
4. Sex;
5. Contact information;

Social Security System/Government Service Insurance System number, if any; and
Tax Identification Number, if any.

All information obtained shall be processed in accordance with the Data Privacy Act and all pertinent laws, rules, and regulations.
Upon successful registration, the registrant shall be given a Quick Response (QR) Code, which shall be used for verification purposes.

Patients admitted in hospitals who are to be subjected to COVID-19 testing at a Provincial Testing Center shall be registered by the concerned City/Municipal Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (C/MESU) using information provided by the Disease Surveillance Coordinator (DSO) of the said hospital. In such cases, the C/MESU concerned shall conduct the appropriate verification.

SECTION 4. Sections 9 and 10 of Provincial Ordinance No. 279-2020 are hereby deleted.

SECTION 5. Section 11 of Provincial Ordinance No. 279-2020 is hereby renumbered as Section 9 and amended as follows:

SECTION 9. Use of Cavite COVID-19 System. The Cavite COVID-19 System shall be used by the PGC in determining the number of positive patients, the number of tests conducted locally, the location of positive patients, and other similar information. The same shall be used for other purposes beneficial to the people of Cavite as may be allowed under existing laws, rules, and regulations.

SECTION 6. A new section, to be designated as Section 10, is hereby added as follows:

SECTION 10. Verification. Persons subject to testing shall proceed to their local testing centers/booths or at designated facilities and present the QR Code they were assigned to the concerned personnel, who shall verify the online registration by asking for verification information, as follows:

Medical professionals and health workers:

Company ID, Professional Regulation Commission ID, or Certificate of Employment

Members of the police and barangay officials:

Office ID, Certificate of Employment, or appointment document

Public market workers:

Company ID or any proof evidencing fact of employment at public market

Drivers of public utility vehicles:

Certificate of Public Convenience or any satisfactory proof of operation of PUV; and

Professional driver's license

Employees under Section 4:

Company ID or Certificate of Employment

Government employees:

Office ID, Certificate of Employment, or appointment document

Senior citizens

Senior Citizen ID; or

Any government-issued ID showing fact of age

Students

Student ID; or

Certificate of Registration and any government-issued ID

Teachers and employees of public educational institutions:

Office ID, Certificate of Employment, or appointment document

Teachers and employees of private educational institutions:

Personnel concerned shall likewise obtain information necessary for the completion of the Case Investigation Form for COVID-19 patients provided by the DOH.

SECTION 7. Section 12 of Provincial Ordinance No. 279-2020 is hereby renumbered as Section 11 and amended as follows:

SECTION 11. Specimen Collection. After verification, persons subject to testing shall be subjected to specimen collection to be conducted by duly trained personnel. Specimens collected shall be appropriately marked according to priority, as follows:

1" for those falling under Section 3(1);

2" for those falling under Section 3(2);

3" for those falling under Section 3(3);

4" for those falling under Section 3(4);

5" for those falling under Section 3(5);

6" for those falling under Section 3(6);

7" for those falling under Section 4;

8" for those falling under Section 6; and

9" for those falling under Section 7.

The collected specimen shall be transported to the Provincial Testing Center, in accordance with relevant guidelines set by the Department of Health (DOH).

Specimen collected from patients admitted in hospitals shall be transmitted to the concerned C/MESU or directly to the Provincial Testing Center upon proper coordination with the PESU. The C/MESU or the DSC shall tag the specimen in accordance with the DOH marking.

Establishments that opt to have their employees tested in a DOH-licensed laboratory other than a Provincial Testing Center shall instruct the latter to transmit the results of the said tests to the PESU for proper encoding.

Individuals other than those for priority testing shall be subjected to specimen collection only upon such date as the DOH shall determine, except in such cases as may be allowed pursuant to this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. Section 13 of Provincial Ordinance No. 279-2020 is hereby renumbered as Section 12 and amended as follows:

SECTION 12. Order of Testing. The specimens received by a Provincial Testing Center shall be tested in the order provided under Section 11, without prejudice to such other agreements/arrangements duly entered into pursuant to this Ordinance.

SECTION 9. Sections 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, and 19 of Provincial Ordinance No. 279-2020 are hereby renumbered as Sections 15, 16, 17, and 18, respectively.

SECTION 10. Repealing Clause. All ordinances, resolutions and executive orders inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 11. Separability Clause. If any part or portion of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, other parts not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 12. Effectivity Clause. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.





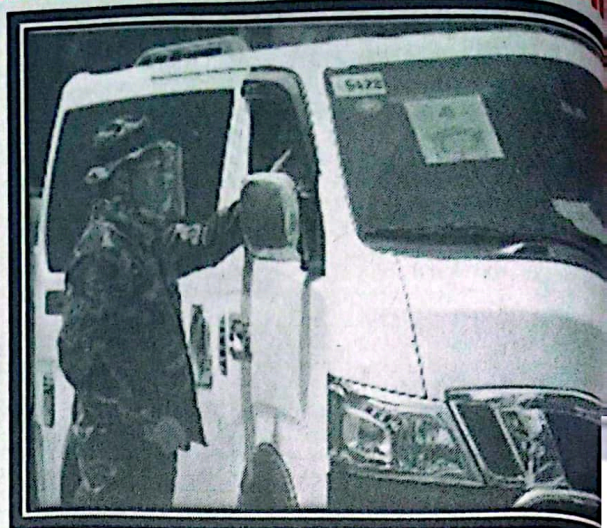

GenTri LGU issues order on reporting of COVID cases, distributes food packs & face masks

GENERAL TRIAS CITY, Cavite Aug 11 -- The city government here recently issued a directive to the City Health Office (CHO) to revise the public reporting format on the COVID-19 confirmed cases in the city.

Memorandum Circular 21-2020 dated August 6, 2020 declares that subsequent COVID-19 Bulletins to be released by the CHO, only the barangays in the Poblacion area consisting of 11 barangays will remain in cluster to protect the patients and their families from discrimination.

On the other hand, confirmed cases in other barangays will be reported by the respective barangays.

Meanwhile, General Trias Mayor Ony Ferrer issued a strong reminder to all city residents against discrimination of COVID-19 patients, their families and health workers.

"I strongly remind everyone, we should avoid discrimination.

Instead, let us take care of each other and pray for the health and welfare of everyone," Mayor Ferrer said.

"Whether there is a case or not in our barangay, we must continue to be careful and stay disciplined. Let us unite so that we may overcome this pandemic," the Mayor added.

The city government with the implementation of a much stricter quarantine protocols under the MECQ period, immediately responded to address the basic needs of the residents especially those areas under lockdown.

Thru the Mayor's Action Team, a total of 4,390 food packs and face masks to the 11 clustered barangays in the Poblacion area.

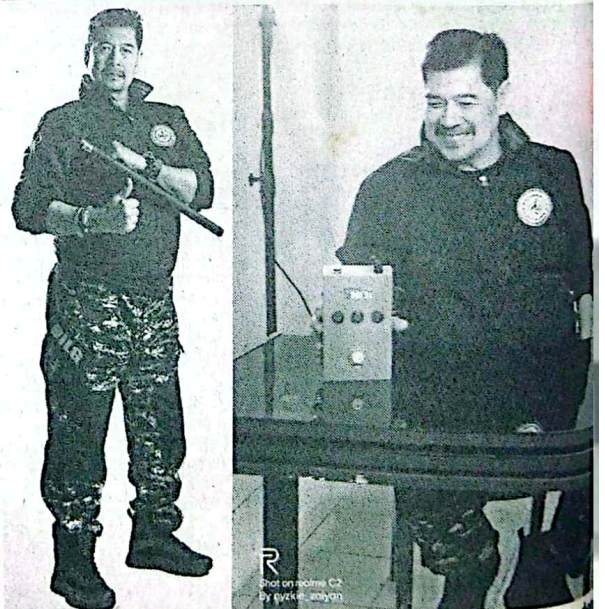
