PhilHealth Regional Office IVA assures Accredited Testing Facilities of Payment for SARS-CoV-2

PhilHealth Regional Office IVA (PRO IVA) is processing claims applications for SARS-CoV-2 Testing in the prescribed period provided that all requirements are complied with.

This is the assurance given by PRO IVA Regional Vice President Edwin M. Oriña, M.D. to its PhilHealth accredited laboratories in their catchment areas Cavite, Laguna and Quezon.

Health accredited testing laboratories are required to maintain an electronic health record of all patients who underwent SARS-CoV-2 Testing by RT-PCR. Correspondingly, all claims for SARS-CoV-2 Testing will also be filed via an electronic system certified by PhilHealth. While the system is not yet functional, submission of claims shall be allowed via electronic media such as compact disk (CD), hard disk or flash drive.

Scanned copies of documents should be saved in PDF format. Itemized billing should be in MS Excel or CSV format. To date, PRO IVA has already paid a total of Php 3,390,400.00 to the United Doctors Hospital and Medical Center for the claims filed under PhilHealth Circular No. 2020-0010 while claims filed from July 27, 2020 to August 12, 2020 from accredited testing laboratories are in various stages of processing in the region.

Sabi ng gobernador sa kanyang FB page sa kalihim ng DepEd: "Please correct me if I am wrong. Sa ilalim ng plano na modular teaching/learning process ng DepEd, para sa 600,000 na mag-aaral ng Cavite, ay kailangan namin maghanda ng P5 bilyon para maipatupad ito."

Mayroon lamang P4.7-B ang nailaang pondo ng pamahalaan lalawigan para ngayong 2020.

Kung walang malaambag ang DepEd sa tinatayang P5-B gastos sa bagong learning module, saan kukunin ng gobernador ang itustos sa edukasyon ng mga estudyanteng Caviteño.

Tanong ni Gov. Remulla, kung walang kontribusyon ang DepEd, ayon sa plano nito, sandaang porsiyento ng P5-B ang papasanin ng local government unit (LGU).

Nakita ni MLQ na kailangan na magkaroon ng isang wikang magbibigkis sa mga mamamayan ng Pilipinas na nahahati sa mga arkipelago, mga isla at may kani-kaniwang sariling lengguwahe sa bawat rehiyon.

Kailangan ng bansa ang isang pambansang wika at dahil Tagalog ang wikang mas ginagamit noon,



ito ang opisyal na wika na ginawang batayan sa pag-uusap, talastasan at komunikasyon ng lahat ng mamamayan ng bansa.

Ngayong taon, gaya ng nakagawian, ang pagdiriwang ng Buwan ng Wika ay pinangungunahan ng Komisyon sa Wikang Filipino (KWF) at ng National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP).

Bahagi sa pagpapayaman ng ating wikang Filipino ay ang paglikha ng mga bagong salita na kakatawan sa ating isip, at ang paglangkap ng iba pang katutubong wika mula sa iba-ibang rehiyon ng bansa at ang panghihiram sa mga wikang dati nating ginagamit na, mula sa English at Espanyol, at iba pang salitang dala ng mga dayuhang naninirahan at nagpasyahng dito na sa atin manirahan, at marami sa kanila ay naging mamamayang Filipino na.

Iba ang ginawa ng Indonesia: nagbuo siya ng isang lupon na inatasang ipunin ang lahat ng magagamit at mauunawaang wikang katutubo, kasabay ang paglikha ng ibang wika at ito ay tinawag na Bahasa Indonesia.

Sa simula ay maraming tumutol sa katwirang mahirap na maintindihan at maunawan pero ipinagpatuloy at ngayon, makaraan ang maraming taon, isa itong buhay na buhay na wikang Pambansa sa Indonesia.

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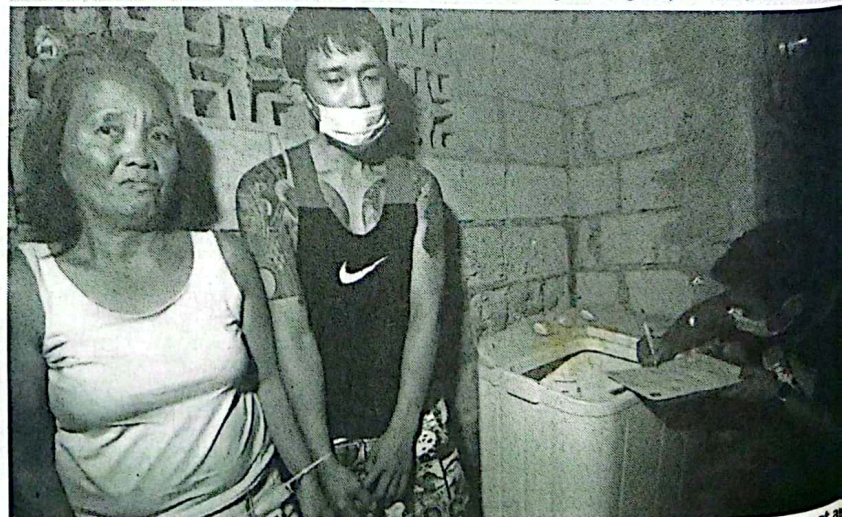

DAPAT NA BANG IBALIK ANG DEATH PENALTY

(CTJ REPORTORIAL TEAM)

ARAW-ARAW, sabi ni Presidential Anti-Corruption Commission chief Greco Belgica, mas o menos sa P3 bilyon ang inilalabas na pera ng PhilHealth at malaking bahagi nito ay ninanakaw ng mga korap sa ahensiyang ito.

Kaya, marami sa netizen at sa mga kababayan kong Imuseño ay nasabi na dapat na ibalik ang death penalty para sa mga taong gobyerno na bilyon-bilyon ang ninanakaw sa gobyerno.

Sa kasalukuyang batas, kung ang ninakaw sa kaban ng bayan ay P50-milyon pataas, kasong pandarambong o plunder ang ikakaso sa taong gobyerno at sa mapatutunayang guilty, life sentence o pagkabilanggo nang habambuhay ang parusa.

Panahon na raw na ibalik ang bitay sa lethal injection, tulad ng pakiusap ni Pangulong Duterte sa kanyang ika-5 state of the nation address (SONA) nitong Hulyo 27, na muling ibalik na parusa sa mga krimeng ilegal na droga, murder, rape, pero hindi kasama ang plunder.

Katwiran ng maraming netizen, talo pa ang murderer ng mga kurakot sa gobyerno dahil maraming buhay ang napagkakaitan ng ikinabubuhay, marami ang namamatay na mahihirap, kung ang perang panggastos sa mga maysakit ay dinadambong ng mga taong pinagkatiwalaang maayos na gastusin iyon sa kabutihan at kapakanan ng mamamayan.

Ang isyung ibalik ang kamatayan ay isang isyung hating-hati ang taumbayan. Sa ngalan ng hustisiya, dapat daw kamatayan ang parusa sa mamamatay-tao o sa mga kondenadong kriminal na nakagawa ng nakarimarim na krimen, tulad nga ng plunder, paggasaha, at negosyong ilegal na droga.

Pero sabi naman ng iba, sapat na ang parusang reclusion perpetua (pagkabilanggo nang habambuhay).

Kamatayan daw ang parusa sa paglabag sa ikaanim na Utos ("Wag Kang Papatay") na nakapaloob sa 10 Utos sa Lumang Tipan ng Biblia.

Maraming kabanata sa Luma at Bagong Tipan ang nagpapanukala na kamatayan ang parusa sa pagsamba sa diyos-diyosan, pakikipid, pagnanakaw, pagpatay, pakikipagtalik sa kapwa lalaki o sa kapwa babae at sa pakikipagtalik sa hayop at kahit ang pagsuway sa awtoridad o utos ng gobyerno.

Kung ipinagtatangol ang buhay ng isang kriminal, mas makatarungan na igawad ang kamatayan sa mga mamamatay tao na hindi gumagalang sa buhay ng mga inosente at walang malay sa kasalanan.

Ayon sa mga pabor sa kamatayan, sinasabi na mismong Diyos ang nagtakda ng kamatayan na bayad sa kasalanan – ito ang ikalawang kamatayan na parusa sa makasalanan sa dagat-dagatang apoy o impierno.

Nawawalang kabuluhan ang buhay kung hahayaang ang mamamatay-tao at mga karumaldumal na kriminal ay bubuhayin pa upang mabigyan ng pagkakataong muling pumatay at gumawa ng kasamaan.

Hindi raw makatao, isang malupit na parusa kahit sa kriminal ang death penalty; isang malupit na pagkakait sa karapatan ng tao at walang pusong pagpatay ng estado sa ngalan ng katarungan ang parusang kamatayan, sabi ng mga ayaw sa capital punishment.

Sa panig ng Simbahan at ng mga grupong relihiyoso, ang pagpatay sa isang mamamatay-tao ay maling pagtutuwid sa kamalian; ito ay magpapabigat sa lalo pang pagpapawalang-saysay sa kahalagahan ng buhay.

Hindi na maibabalik pa ang nawalang buhay kung muling papatay sa ngalan ng katarungan, sabi nila.

Sapat na ang life sentence sa mga kriminal upang magbigay ng hustisiya sa mga biktima ng malupit, marahas at karumaldumal na kasalanan sa lipunan at sa batas.

Anti-poor o biktima ng kahirapan o ng racial discrimination ang marami sa naparusahan ng death penalty, sabi ng mga ayaw sa bitay.

May mga biktima ng higanteng politikal, o kaya ang pinararatangan ng krimen bunga ng personal na galit; udyok ng kasakiman.

Nababayaran ang mga testigo, abogado at maging ang hukom o kaya dahil sa pressure o blackmail sa mga hahatol sa kaso, naparusahan ng kamatayan ang mga inosente at walang malay sa kriminal na gawain.

DAMI NG MGA BINITAY

MULA 1700, ayon sa saliksik nina M. Watt Espy at John Ortiz Smykla, inireport na mahigit sa 15,700 tao ang binitay gamit ang pagbigti sa leeg gamit ang lubid (death by hanging), silya elektrika at lethal injection sa US.

Pabor ang United States Supreme Court sa parusang kamatayan sa desisyon nito noong 1978, at mula noon, 1,500 indibidwal ang pinatay sa USA.

Sa maraming bansa, ipinapataw ang death penalty sa mga krimeng pagtataksil sa bayan (treason), rebelyon, ilegal na droga, pagsuway sa utos ng batas military, espionage, marder, rape, pagnanakaw at pandarambong.

Sekreto ng estado ang pagbitay sa China at sa North Korea, ayon sa Amnesty International (AI).

Mula 2017, ayon sa AI, 507 o higit pa ang binitay sa Iran; Saudi Arabia: 146; Iraq: 125+; Pakistan: 60+; Egypt: 35+; Somalia: 24; United States: 23; Jordan: 15.

Walang opisyal na bilang ang binitay sa Vietnam, at may 58 tao sa ibang bansa.

Sa ulat din ng AI, 19 na estado sa USA ang mayroon pa ring de mula 1978 hanggang Oktubre 2018, nasa 1,483 tao ang binitay sa gaya ng sumusunod -- Texas: 555; Virginia: 113; Oklahoma: 112; Missouri: 87; Georgia: 72; Alabama: 63; Ohio: 56; North Carolina: 43; Louisiana: 28; Arkansas: 31; at 184 sa iba pang estado.

Wala nang parusang kamatayan sa Alaska na inalis noong 1957; (2012), Delaware (2016), Hawaii (1957), Illinois (2011), Iowa (1887), Maryland (2013), Massachusetts (1984), Michigan (1846) (1911), New Hampshire (2019), New Jersey (2007), New Mexico (2007), North Dakota (1973), Rhode Island (1984), Vermont (2018), West Virginia (1965), Wisconsin (1853), District of Columbia (1981), American Samoa, Guam, Northern Mariana Islands, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands.

DAHILAN NG PARUSANG KAMATAYAN

KASI, hopeless o hindi na raw makapagbabago ang isang talamang Kaya tama ang death penalty upang mawala sa lipunan ang (convicted) para mapigilan na mulang gumawa ng kasamaan, at lamang ito, kung papatayin ng estado ang kriminal.

Pero sabi ng kontra, may pag-asa pa ang isang kondenado (o muling makapagbabagong buhay at maging matinong mamamayan) sa pag-unlad ng bayan.

Makapigipil na ang death penalty sa masasamang tao na karumaldumal na krimen?

Kung papatayin ang kondenado, ito ba ay magbibigay ng katahimikan sa biktima at sa pamilya nito?

Deterrent o magbibigay takot at hadlang ang parusang kamatayan at sa mga nag-iisip gumawa ng krimen.

Tama lamang, dapat lamang na parusahan ang mga kriminal sa ginawa sa lipunan.

Hustisiya at katahimikan ang kaloob na matiwasay na buhay sa mga biktima sa pagkaalam na naparusahan ang gumawa sa kanilang krimen.

Ayon sa mga kontra sa death penalty, ito ay imoral, hindi detektadong makapagbibigay ng takot at hindi makapigipil sa isang tao at kamatayan para gumawa ng krimen.

Malaking gastos sa gobyerno ang paggawad ng death penalty. Tulad ng nasabi na, anti-poor ang death penalty.

Ang kasiguruhang mahuhuli, maparusahan at makukulong ang mga matibay na deterrent o pamigil sa mga nais gumawa ng krimen.

Hindi na maibabalik pa ang buhay ng mga binitay na mga taong dahil sa maling akusasyon at mapatunayang nagkamali ng hatol at matapos ang muling pagrerebisa sa kanilang mga kaso.

Ang isang kriminal ay may kakayahang makapagbabagong buhay makapag-ambag ng kabutihan sa lipunan, tulad ng kaso ni Tookie Kahit ano pang isyu, ang pagpatay ay mali at immoral at labag sa Diyos, ayon sa ikaanim na utos: "Wag Kang Papatay!"

MULA 2017, ayon sa Amnesty International, umiiral pa rin ang mga bansang walang death penalty sa Afghanistan, Antigua and Barbuda, Bahamas, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Belarus, Belize, Botswana, China, Comoros, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Dominica, Egypt, Equatorial Guinea, Ethiopia, Guyana, Honduras, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Kiribati, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Macedonia, Malta, Marshall Islands, Mauritius, Mexico, Moldova, Monaco, Mongolia, Montenegro, Mozambique, Namibia, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Niue, Norway, Palau, Panama, Paraguay, Philippines, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Rwanda, San Marino, Sao Tome and Principe, Senegal, Serbia (incl. WHEREAS, President Rodrigo R. Duterte issued Proclamation No. 922 on 8 March 2020, declaring a State of Public Health Emergency throughout the Philippines, and Proclamation No. 929 on 16 March 2020, declaring a State of Calamity throughout the country in light of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic;

WHEREAS, President Duterte placed the Province of Cavite under Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) for the period of 4-18 August 2020, in response to the surged confirmed COVID-19 cases in the country;

WHEREAS, Provincial Ordinance No. 268 provided for curfew hours in the Province of Cavite from 8:00 PM to 5:00 AM of the following day for the prevention and containment of COVID-19 in the Province;

WHEREAS, Provincial Ordinance No. 286 amended Provincial Ordinance No. 268, modifying curfew hours to 8:00 AM to 4:30 AM of the following day to give frontline workers ample time to travel to their places of work;

WHEREAS, frontline workers, workers allowed to work, and other authorized persons outside residence face difficulty in travelling due to the suspension of public transportation during MECQ, pursuant to the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines issued by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases;

WHEREAS, persons travelling to their places of work have to start their travels at an earlier time due to the restrictions imposed during MECQ;

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary that the curfew hours be adjusted to 4:00 AM to allow people to leave their residences earlier, thereby amending Provincial Ordinance No. 268-2020, as amended by Provincial Ordinance No. 286-2020;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Ambion, duly seconded by Hon. Gawaran and unanimously approved by the members present, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Cavite in a session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of Provincial Ordinance No. 268-2020, as amended, shall be further amended as follows:

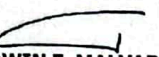
Section 2. Prohibited Acts - It shall be unlawful for the public to loiter, wander, stroll, play or to remain or stay in public places within the territorial jurisdiction of the Province of Cavite without legal justifiable reason from 8:00 PM to 4:00 AM of the following day, daily, unless falling under herein exceptions. It shall also be unlawful for any parent or guardian of a child to knowingly permit or negligently allow the child to remain in any public place within the Province during curfew hours. Parents and guardians of minors are expected to keep their minor children from leaving their home.

SECTION 2. Effectivity. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after its approval and compliance with posting and publication requirements.

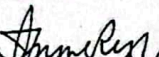

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 276-2020, AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE MANDATORY USE OF FACE MASK IN PUBLIC PLACES BY ALL PERSONS WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE PROVINCE OF CAVITE DURING THE STATE OF PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY IN THE COUNTRY

Introduced by: **Vice Governor Ramon Jolo B. Revilla III**

Co-sponsored by: **All Sangguniang Panlalawigan Members**

HEREAS, Section 16 of the Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides in part that every local government unit shall use the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare and shall ensure and support, among other things, the promotion of health and safety;

HEREAS, there is an alarming increment of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) cases in the Province of Cavite especially during the placing of the province under General Community Quarantine (GCQ);

HEREAS, there are scenarios that inhabitants of the Province of Cavite are being complacent despite the implementation of community quarantine and do not wear their face mask, even at public places, or wear their masks improperly, still exposing their nose or mouth, making them more vulnerable to COVID-19 infection;

HEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Cavite realizes the need to amend Provincial Ordinance No. 276-2020, otherwise known as the Mandatory Use of Face Mask in Public Places, in order for the Caviteños to give more importance and to observe stricter compliance in the said measure;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Ambion, duly seconded by Hon. Gawaran and unanimously approved by the members present, be it enacted by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Cavite in a session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. The Provincial Ordinance No. 276-2020, otherwise known as the Mandatory Use of Face Mask in Public Places, is hereby amended.

SECTION 2. Section 5 shall now be read as follows:

SECTION 5. Proper Wearing of Face Masks. Face masks shall be worn covering the nose and mouth entirely. The mask shall be fully worn as this will help in minimizing or avoiding possible accumulation of COVID-19.

SECTION 3. Section 6 shall now be read as follows:

SECTION 6. Apprehension. The Philippine National Police or the concerned barangay officials are hereby deputized to implement the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Sections 5, 6, and 7 shall now be Sections 7, 8, and 9, respectively, and shall be read as follows:

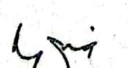
SECTION 7. Penalties. Any person who violates this Ordinance shall be meted with a fine of Two Thousand Pesos (Php 2,000.00) or shall attend community service awareness campaign on COVID-19 for four (4) hours as conducted by the barangay officials or the Philippine National Police (PNP).

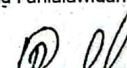
SECTION 8. Separability Clause. If, for any reason or reasons, any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof, which are not affected thereby, shall continue to be in full force and effect.

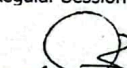
SECTION 9. Repealing Clause. All Ordinances and rules inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby modified or repealed accordingly. Hence, this Ordinance is repealed upon declaration of the Inter-Agency Task Force for the management of Emerging Infectious Disease (IATF-EID) that wearing a mask in public places is no longer necessary and that COVID-19 has ceased to be a pandemic.

SECTION 5. Effectivity. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after its approval and compliance with posting and publication requirements.
