

GOV. REMULLA: ONLY 15 TO 65 YEARS OLD ALLOWED INSIDE CAVITE MALLS

REALIZING he was wrong, Governor Jonvic Remulla retracted his first announcement that the Cavite local government units (LGUs) would allow children 10 years old and above would be permitted to visit malls.

"First of all, allow me to sincerely apologize as I take full responsibility for my announcement of the new policy last December 2 and 3," said the governor.

Early Friday morning, December 4, in a Facebook post, Remulla said that only those ages 15 to 65 years old are allowed inside malls.

"Pagkatapos ko mabasa sa pahayagan na pumayag na ang IATF na papasukin sa mall ang mga accompanied minors ages 15 below ay mabilisan naman ako gumawa ng patakaran para dito," the governor explained.

He added that he was wrong in his earlier post and immediately corrected it after learning from Interior Secretary Eduardo Año that there is still no clear

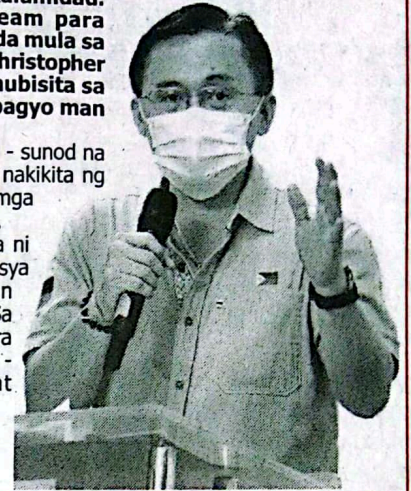

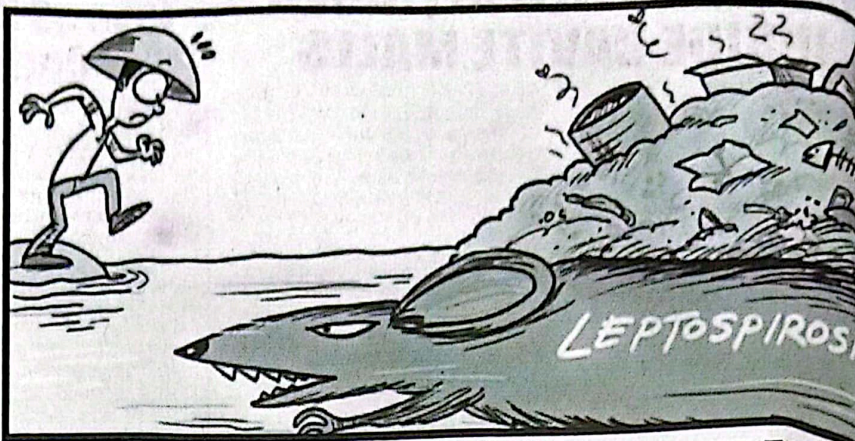

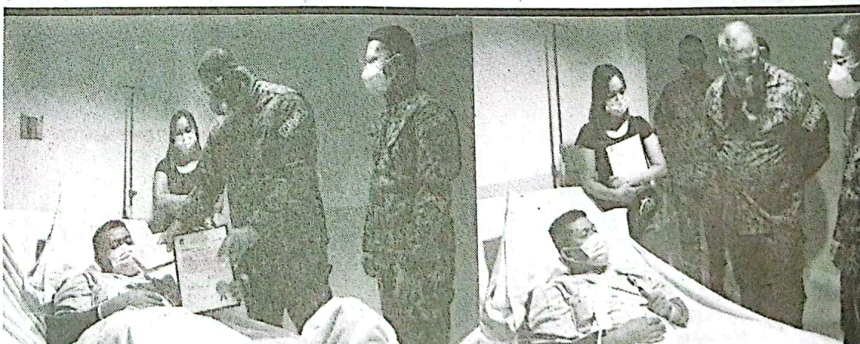


SM BACOR-CITY CSR RELIEF OPERATION

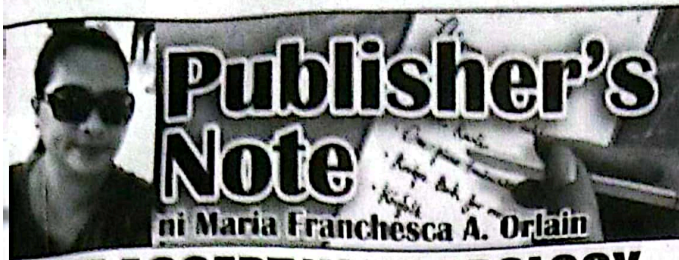

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 300-2020, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2 PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 268, AS AMENDED BY PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 299-2020"

WHEREAS, Provincial Ordinance No. 268 provided for curfew hours in the Province of Cavite from 8:00 PM to 5:00 AM of the following day for the prevention and containment of COVID-19 in the Province;

WHEREAS, Provincial Ordinance No. 286 amended Provincial Ordinance No. 268, modifying curfew hours to 8:00 PM to 4:30 AM the following day to give returning workers ample time to travel to their places of work;

WHEREAS, Provincial Ordinance No. 299 amended Provincial Ordinance No. 286, modifying curfew hours to 8:00 PM to 4:00 AM the following day;

WHEREAS, Provincial Ordinance No. 300 amended Provincial Ordinance No. 299, modifying curfew hours to 9:00 PM to 4:00 AM the following day;

WHEREAS, the purpose of the adjustment of curfew hours is to allow employees to return home before the start of the curfew hours and to travel at an earlier time, since transportation is quite difficult during this time of pandemic;

WHEREAS, there is a clamor for another adjustment to give consideration to the working class and to the general public having a hard time completing their tasks and/or other important businesses or matters due to the curfew hours;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Ambion duly seconded by Hon. Gawaran and unanimously approved by the members present, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Cavite in a session duly assembled that

SECTION 1. Section 2 of Provincial Ordinance No. 300-2020, as amended, shall be further amended as follows:

Section 2. Prohibited Acts - It shall be unlawful for the public to loiter, wander, stroll, play or to remain or stay in public places within the territorial jurisdiction of the Province of Cavite without legal justifiable reason from 10:00 PM to 4:00 AM of the following day, daily, unless falling under herein exceptions.

It shall also be unlawful for any parent or guardian of a child to knowingly permit or negligently allow the child to remain in any public place within the Province of Cavite during curfew hours. Parents and guardians of minors are expected to keep their minor children from leaving their home.

SECTION 4. Repealing Clause. All other resolutions and ordinances which are inconsistent to this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. If, for any reason, any section or provision of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by competent authority, such judgment or action shall not affect or impair other sections or provisions thereof.

SECTION 6. Effectivity. This ordinance shall take effect after its approval.

reliant and resilient.

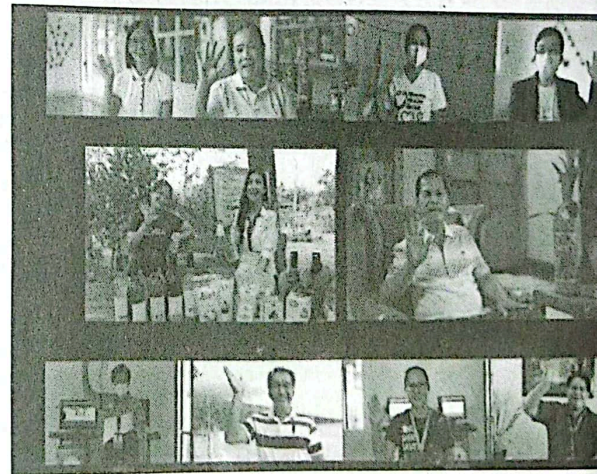

Integrate master's, PhD level researches into basic education curriculum - DepEd Sec. Briones

SANOS, Laguna, Dec 4 (PIA) -- "Masteral and PhD level researches should be translated into a curriculum and integrated into the curriculum for basic education so that we start off our learners early in their lives on being appreciative of the benefits of agriculture, of protecting our environment, and caring not only for the present but also for the future generations."

This was the call to action of Department of Education (DepEd) Secretary Leonor Briones during a virtual event commemorating the 54th anniversary of the Southeast Asian Regional Center for Graduate Study and Research in Agriculture (SEARCA) last November 27.

Sec. Briones represents the Philippines in the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO), of which SEARCA is the oldest regional center. As such, DepEd is the focal agency for Philippine government-SEARCA whose mandate has been

to build capacities in agricultural and rural development in Southeast Asia since its establishment in 1966.

SEARCA Director Glenn B. Gregorio said, "From 2020 to 2025, SEARCA's programs are geared towards accelerating transformation through agricultural innovation (ATTAIN) to elevate the quality of life of agricultural families through sustainable livelihoods and access to modern networks and innovative markets."

He added that SEARCA's five-year development strategy is articulated through its

DENR WARNS "CATASTROPHIC" EFFECT OF QUARRYING OPERATIONS IN UNSTABLE UPLAND AREAS

ANILA - The Department of Environment and Natural Resources has warned against persistent mining and quarry operations in areas identified as unstable as these may cause serious damage in low-lying villages and further siltation of the Cagayan River.

During an interview, DENR Undersecretary for Policy and Planning Leonel said that they are now assessing alternative areas for quarry and mining operations in Region 2, which was affected by a flooding.

"Gusto po muna natin asan dun sa mga area na unstable kasi ito po ang nagbibigay ng silt, sediments na kapag nagkaroon ng quarry operations dun sa taas, ilagang medyo agiging catastrophic po yung magigingpekto [We want to avoid those unstable areas because these are tributary to silt and sediments. Once there are quarry operations on these areas, then it could be catastrophic]," he said during the Network Briefing News with host Presidential Communications Operations Office (COO) Secretary Martin Andanar.

"Ang gusto lang po natin talaga ay yung dun sa mga river system, dun ng po sila pwedeng ag-quarry [We want them to conduct operations in our river system]," he added.

He appealed for illegal miners and quarry operators to already cease operations while assuring that the government is ready to

provide alternative livelihood for them.

"Kung ma-suspend man itong mga quarry operations, siguro pwede nating hilingin na bilisan yung assessment so that all illegal quarry operators will be suspended, but legitimate ones and legal operators will be allowed to undertake their quarry operations," he said.

Apart from this, the DENR has approved the dredging activity along Cagayan River's heavily silted channels to address another onset of widespread flooding.

Usec. Leonel bared that the river is becoming shallow and narrower which minimizes its holding capacity in times of continuous heavy downpour.

"Kailangan linisin natin dahil ito po yung nagkocause ng flooding. Kung nakabara po 'yang basura at medyo heavily silted, talagang pong tayo ang maaapektuhan [We have to clean it up because it will cause flooding. If there are deposits as it is already heavily silted, then we will be greatly affected]," he said.

Currently, the DENR, in coordination with concerned agencies and local government units, is conducting assessments on areas affected by the flood, in order to respond with appropriate

programs.

Along with the dredging projects to be conducted, Usec. Leonel said that they have recommended reforestation projects under DENR's National Greening Projects to be implemented in Cagayan Valley, especially in watershed areas.

The agency is also eyeing reforestation projects in upland areas through its Integrated Social Forestry Program (ISFP), which encourages villagers to cultivate forest trees and agricultural crops.

"Meron din po tayong available na perennial crops na pwede nating ilagay din sa kagubatan. Hindi man mapuputol but the communities can benefit from the fruits of the trees that it can provide. This can be part of the alternative livelihood to be given to the communities instead na magputol pa sila dun [We also have perennial crops that we can plant in forests. This can't be cut down as timber but the communities can benefit from the fruits of the trees]," he added.

ISFP aims to assist families generate incomes through the use of appropriate upland technologies while protecting the environment.

confiscated by authorities after conducting more than 180,000 anti-illegal drug operations since the beginning of the Duterte administration.

"We will continue to work even harder not only to suppress the supply of narcotics in our streets, but also to prevent our country from being used as a trans-shipment point for illegal drug trade in the Asia-Pacific region," President Duterte said.

Drug syndicates continue to operate despite the current COVID-19 pandemic, the President told law enforcement agents and operatives, urging them to remain steadfast in their anti-narcotics campaign.

To effectively combat illegal drug trade, law enforcers and anti-drug operatives must intensify their operations against drug trafficking, and the government must reform the country's criminal justice system and address the root cause of drug abuse and dependency, the President said.

"I am asking the brave men and women of our law enforcement agencies, the prosecution service, and the judiciary to never waver in their difficult yet rewarding task. We already accomplished a lot in the past four years, and we can accomplish more in the next years to come," he noted.

"Ending illegal drug trade means securing the future of our nation. Together, let us make a drug-free Philippines the greatest legacy that we can leave behind to our children and the succeeding

generations."

The President also acknowledged the coordinated efforts of the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) and the Philippine National Police (PNP), which led to the seizure of billions worth of dangerous drugs destroyed on Thursday.

The Chief Executive also made a renewed call to law enforcers to go out and destroy the country's drug apparatus. He praised lawmen for their "undying patriotic fervor."

"Now I'm telling the law enforcement, the uniformed personnel: Do your duty. Do it in accordance with law pero be alert and be wise," he said.

"I will assume full legal responsibility. Akin, akin 'yan. Iyang human rights, ako ang magharap niyan, hindi naman kaya."

A total of 1,333 kilos of methamphetamine hydrochloride (shabu), liquid shabu, marijuana, liquid marijuana, ecstasy, cocaine and other dangerous substances were destroyed through thermal decomposition.

This is in response to President Duterte's directive to immediately destroy seized narcotics to prevent unscrupulous agents and personnel from smuggling the drugs from government storage and peddle them to drug users.

Justice Secretary Menardo Guevarra, PDEA Director General Wilkins Villanueva, PNP Chief Police General Debold Sinas and Sen. Christopher Lawrence "Bong" Go were also present. (PIA/PND)
