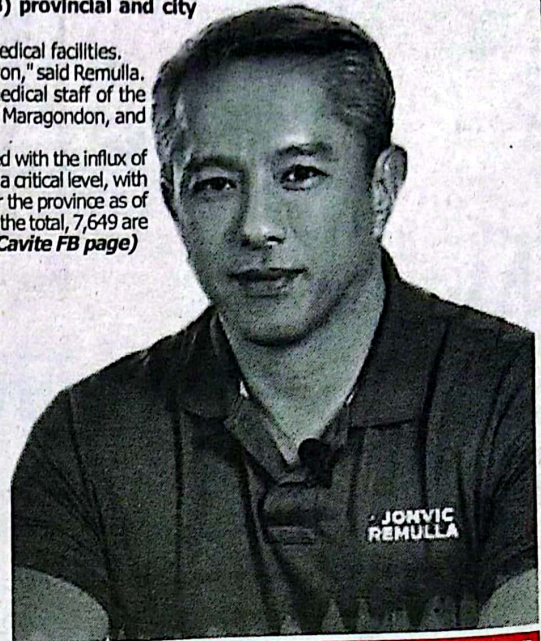


# acceptance of new patients for a week - Gov. Remulla decides

Marikina, Cavite Apr. 16 - Cavite Governor Jonvic Remulla stated that eight (8) provincial and city hospitals in the province will not accept new patients for a week.

Remulla declared in the wake of the Covid-19 infection among several health care workers in said medical facilities. "We have decided not to [accept patients] until we know the situation," said Remulla. He added that he has ordered the closure of the cities of Bacoor, Dasmariñas, and Trece Martires and in the municipalities of Kawit, Maragondon, and Marikina (GMA) tested positive of the COVID-19 disease.

Remulla said that the medical facilities are now understaffed and remaining health care workers will be overwhelmed with the influx of patients. Moreover, private hospitals in the province are also at a critical level, with the hospital reaching 95 percent according to the governor. Meanwhile, the COVID-19 Case Tracker for the province as of April 16, 2021 recorded 568 new cases for a total Confirmed cases almost reaching the 33k mark. Out of the total, 7,649 are recovered while 796 have perished. (Ruel Francisco, with reports from Go Cavite FB page)

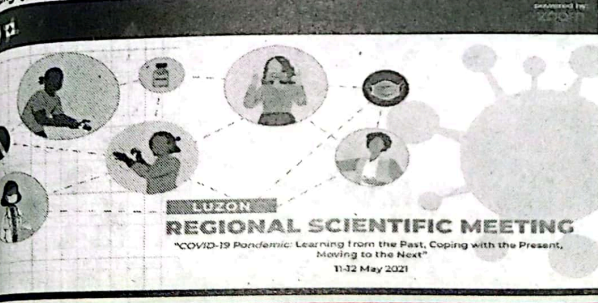

### 40M supplemental budget to augment SAP for 49K households of Naic

Trece Martires, Cavite - The Local Government of Naic headed by Mayor Junio C. Dualan ordered for a supplemental budget to augment the allocated funds amounting to Php 115,822,000 from the national government to aid the residents affected by the Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ).

While the fund allocation was based on the 2010 census with about 29,000 households, current statistics show the town's population at more or less 49,000 households.

Thus, the LCE together with the members of the municipal council decided to issue a supplemental budget of P40M from the savings of the municipal government to augment the SAP budget that will benefit a lot more people in need.

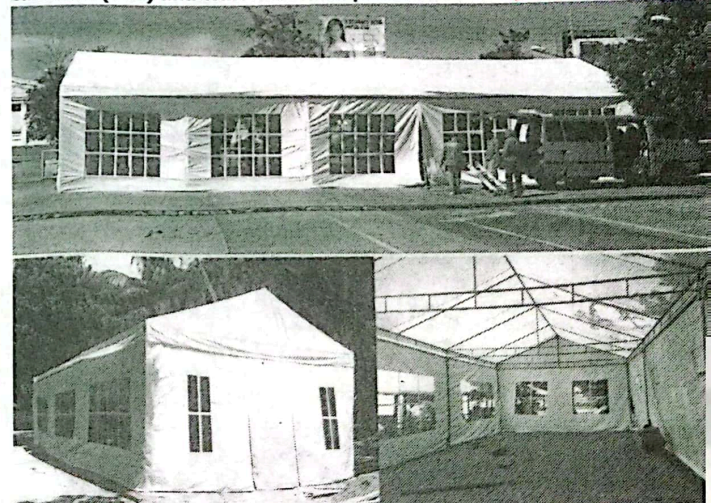

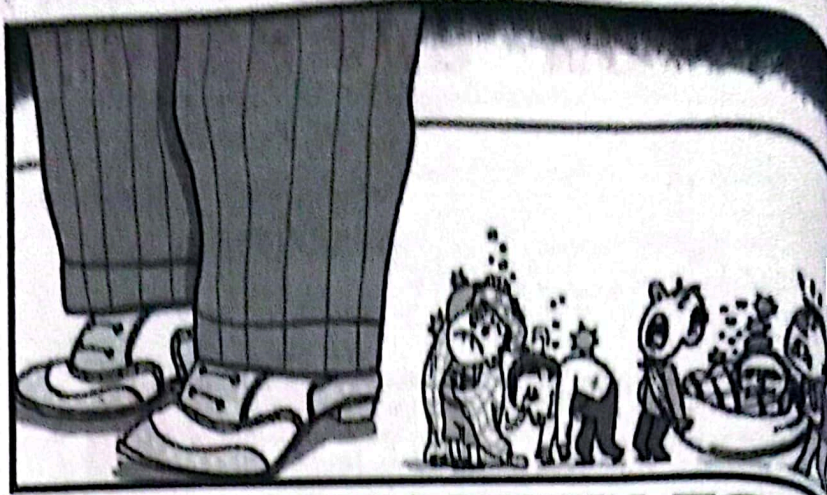

## FIRST DOH HOSPITAL TO R IN RIZAL PROVINCE

Department of Health (DOH) – CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, Quezon) Director Eduardo C. Janalro and 2nd District of Rizal Representative Congressman Felipe Nograles yesterday led the on-site inspection of the health facility's location in San Jose in the town of Rodriguez, Rizal.

The proposed level-II apex hospital will have a 2-storey facility and 200-bed capacity and will be built on a one-hectare lot purchased by the local government of Montalban.

According to Director Janalro, it will have an operational emergency room and out-patient department that will initially operate once the first phase of the project will be completed this year.

"A Covid and non-covid will also be operation within the year to augment the needs of other hospitals in the province."

"It will also include a dietary, morgue, motorpool, laboratory, x-

ray, central supply storage, operating room, delivery room, wards and intensive care units once the hospital is completely refurbished."

"Two floors of basements will be constructed, one for parking and one will serve as staff quarters," he added.

The Northern Tagalog Regional Hospital project will be funded by the health department through the Health Facility Enhancement Program (HFEP) with a total cost of Php839,637,000.00.

The health facility is an Initiative of Representative Nograles to provide communities in the province with their

health care needs.

Nograles added that the construction of the facility is timely and necessary to augment the shortage of hospitals, especially now that the country is battling the Covid pandemic.

Among the catchment areas of the hospital are communities from Montalban, San Mateo, Rizal and parts of nearby Quezon City and San Jose Del Monte Bulacan.

The formal groundbreaking ceremony of the Northern Tagalog Regional Hospital will be on April 23, 2021.

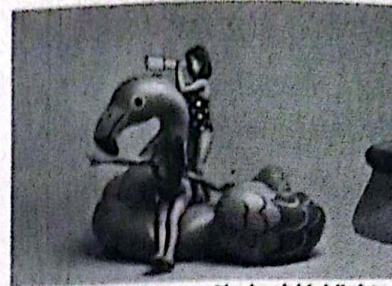
## SM CITY BACOR SECURITY GUARD RETURNS LOST ITEM TO SHOPPER

## DOH-CALABARZON COVID UP

Department of Health (DOH) – CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Rizal, Quezon) today reported a total of 644 new cases recorded in the region.

There is now a total of 106,750 cases with 18,952 active cases and 84,961 recoveries. Recorded deaths are at 2,837.

The province of Cavite has the highest recorded case with 30,901 followed by the province of Laguna with 25,021, Rizal province with 23,911, Batangas province with 18,369 and Lucena city with 1,720 Covid-19 cases.

Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo disclosed that a total of 2,186 beds have been occupied by Covid patients and there are 842 remaining vacant beds available in various health facilities in the region.

"The province of Batangas have 397 occupied beds and 132 available vacant beds, Cavite with 475 occupied beds and 196 vacant beds, Laguna with 566 occupied beds and 251 vacant beds, Quezon with 305 occupied beds and 143 vacant beds and Rizal with 443 occupied beds and 120 vacant beds," he enumerated.

Janairo added that the

modular tents in San Juan District Hospital and Laguna Medical Center are now complete and ready for occupancy.

"Congrats to Batangas State University CTI-TBI for this wonderful event message lang for the teams so I got this from Han Ji Pyeong kung nanonood kayo from The 2020 k-drama startups so he said "As you already know you will face many hardships while running a startups the only thing that you keep going is the confidence that you're doing what you love" so to all the teams presented today congrats hope that your idea or businesses will grow and be successful", Liezi D. Sueno, Senior Technology Transfer Officer Science Research Specialist, PCIEERD-RITTD, and also one of the panel of judges during the said event. "I personally thank CTI kasi during student pang ako, sila talaga yung nag-hone sa akin. Sila yung nag-provide ng training, seminars, webinars, that helped me grow."

CTI provided me with people na ma tap ko for a specific concern. CTI is also the one who gave me the idea of how I can build my own startup.

I have the grit to do it, at passionate talaga ako. If you are passionate, lapit ka lang kay CTI and they will provide you with the tools you need, mga equipment, and the connections", explains Cedric Mirafior, RXDB Founder, who also bagged 1st place in the said competition. Meanwhile, the Batangas State University has been selected as one of the Philippines' primary business incubators along with the other eight Technology Business Incubators (TBI).

Two incubators were selected from Luzon, including the BatStateU CTI, four from the Visayas, and two from Mindanao. The emergence of the center was through the BOR Resolution No. 937, Series of 2014.

Institute's (DOST-FNRI) aired via Zoom and Facebook Live, March 9.

More than 40 participants composed of micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), educators, students, researchers, government officers, and private organizations partook the activity. The discussion was led by Mr. Richard Lo Alcaraz, Science Research Specialist II at DOST-FNRI.

Obesity or overweight and diabetes are increasing at an alarming rate in Asian countries including here in the Philippines. Based on the Food and Nutrition Research Institute of Department of Science and Technology's 8th National Nutrition Survey in 2013, 3 out of 10 Filipinos are either overweight or obese and 1 in every 16 adult individuals has diabetes. To combat these health problems, the institute developed this incredible guilt-free ice cream, dubbed as the Low-Fat Low Sugar Ice Cream.

According to Mr. Alcaraz, this healthy frozen delight in a classic vanilla flavor is a delicious and inviting dessert which is good for weight-watchers. He mentioned that this contains 3.5% protein and energy of 139 kcal per 100g sample, which is much lower than the regular ice cream. Its fat content is only 1.7% compared with the commercial ice cream which normally holds 5 to 20% fat. Shelf life of this ice cream was identified for one year when properly stored in freezer at -18 °C or below.

DOST-FNRI invested P1.1 million for the research and

development of this low fat low sugar ice cream. Interested adoptors of this technology need to establish a production facility ranging from 400,000 - 3 million pesos depending on the scale of production. In the conducted financial feasibility study of the institute, 592, 292.88 pesos total project cost (initial capital) would cover the total pre-operating cost such as working capital, fixed asset and equipment (production facility or building is not included). Given this, Return of Investment (ROI) is projected at 58.56% in a payback period of 1.55 years. According to Mr. Alcaraz, this computation was projected at an average of 9,000 cones per month production capacity at 14.30 pesos selling price. The selling price is computed at 35% mark up. Hence, the suggested selling price of this low fat low sugar ice cream is 150 pesos per half gallon and P14 per cone (for soft serving).


Mr. Alcaraz also mentioned the market potential of this low-fat, low-sugar ice cream. For him, its marketing strength could be linked to its benefit as a healthy choice of people who want to reduce their calorie and fat consumption while still fulfilling their craving for a rich and refreshing dessert. Thus, this allows consumers to eat their favorite ice cream while maintaining a balanced diet. As discussed by Mr. Alcaraz, total available market of ice cream is estimated at 282 million US Dollars and the number of overweight or

obese are still increasing yet Filipinos do not outgrow their childhood love for ice cream. Therefore, there is a great potential for low fat low sugar ice cream production, he said.

A 15,000 pesos licensing fee will be charged to interested adoptors of this technology as referred to the technology transfer mechanism of the institute. The institute's licensing fee normally ranges from 5, 000.00 to 100,000.00 pesos depending on the technology that clients want to adopt. They also have free technologies available for adoption but are subject for evaluation and accreditation.

Participants were also given the chance to air their questions to the speaker during the program's ConsulTalk segment. Most of the questions raised to the speaker focused on the taste of the product compared to the commercially available, infusion of other flavors and its effect to sweetness level and fat content of the product, consumption limitations, and the melting rate of the product.





"We have to augment and expand the capacity of our health facilities to accommodate the increasing number of Covid patients in the region. Hindi natin pwedeng sabihing puno na ang mga hospitals natin at hindi sila tanggapin. We have to find ways to help them. Buhay ng tao ang nakasalalay dito and we have to accept them. Naghihirap na nga sila, huwag na nating pahirapan pa. We must provide them the health access and service they need. Every health facility must be able to take care of patients seeking treatment," Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo stated.

"The present Covid pandemic is an unprecedented health crisis that requires extraordinary amount of resources for an indefinite period of time. Lahat tayo dapat magtulungan to ensure that health facilities remain strong and stable in its ability to provide health care to all, especially during this time of pandemic."

The 44-bed capacity modular tent will serve as

an extension of the health facility. The tent has a 5-meter wide and 12-meter-long floor area. It is a closed tent, fully covered with soft PVC side wall and with eave height. One modular tent cost Php294,850.00

Among the sixteen (16) health facilities who received the heavy duty collapsible tents were Carsigma District Hospital in GMA, General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital in Trece Martires City, Ospital ng Imus in Imus and Southern Tagalog Regional Hospital in Bacoor in the province of Cavite; General Calles Memorial District Hospital in Pakil, Laguna Medical Center in Sta. Cruz, San Pablo City General Hospital in San Pablo City, and San Pablo City District Hospital in San Pablo City in Laguna; Bondoc Peninsula District Hospital in Catanduanes, Claro M. Recto Memorial District Hospital in Infanta, Gumaca District Hospital in Gumaca, Magsaysay Memorial District Hospital in Lopez, Quezon Medical Center in Lucena City and RAKK Prophet Medical Center Inc. in Gumaca in the province of Quezon; San

Juan District Hospital in San Juan and Mabini Community Hospital in Mabini in Batangas province.

Janairo also disclosed that the provinces of Rizal and Batangas are now at high risk in terms of bed occupancy rate with 77.8% and 74.3%, respectively.

"We have moderate risk for total beds occupancy rate for the provinces of Cavite (65.2%), Laguna (63.8%) and Lucena City (65.2%). The province of Quezon is at low risk with 57.8%."

"We have to be prepared to handle the influx of Covid patients not only from the provinces but also those of nearby Metro Manila. Our health facilities in the region are already accepting Covid patients from NCR for treatment and care," he emphasized.

The four mega quarantine facilities in the region are now at 64% occupancy rate with a total of 534 admitted patients from a total number of 839 beds capacity.

As of April 6, 2021, a total of 100,440 Covid cases were recorded in the region with 16,860 active cases. There are 80,901 recoveries with 2,679 deaths.

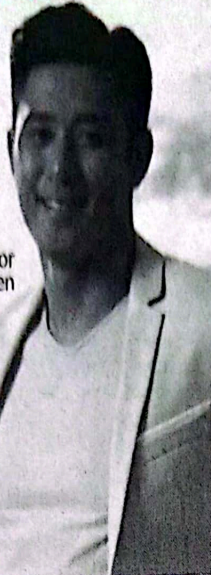
