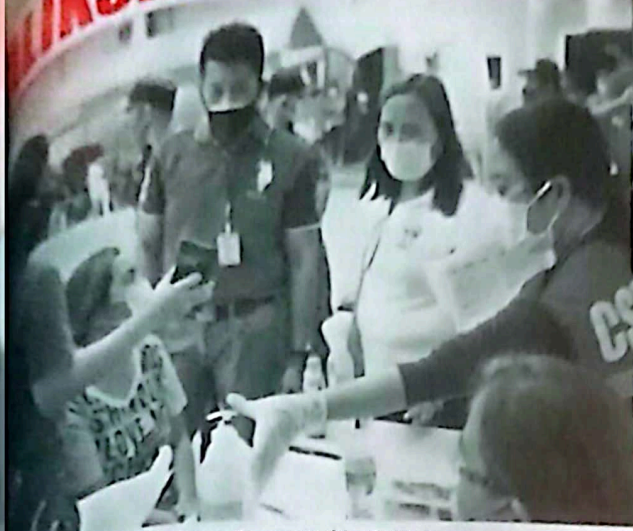

Indang, Cavite - Simula ng ipatupad ang Enhanced Community Quarantine, naging alerto at naging mapagmasid lalo na ang ilang sangay ng gobyerno sandatahang ng Pilipinas o AFP, ang Departamento ng Pangkalusugan at ilang na siyang tatayo bilang mga frontliners sa pananalasa ng COVID-19. PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 274-2020

"AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE PERIOD FOR THE PAYMENT OF REAL PROPERTY TAX, SPECIAL EDUCATION FUND TAX, AND THE TAX ON THE TRANSFER OF REAL PROPERTY OWNERSHIP TO 30 JUNE 2020, MODIFYING PROPOSED SECTIONS 2F.05 AND 3B.02 OF PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 2004-001 OR THE REVISED REVENUE CODE OF THE PROVINCE OF CAVITE"

WHEREAS, in light of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, President Rodrigo R. Duterte issued Proclamation No. 959 on 8 March 2020, declaring a state of public health emergency throughout the Philippines, and Proclamation No. 959-A on 12 March 2020, declaring a state of calamity throughout the country and imposing an enhanced community quarantine throughout the country;
WHEREAS, Resolution No. 1437-2020 of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Cavite declared the Province of Cavite in a state of calamity due to the outbreak of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, a work from home arrangement has been implemented in the Provincial Government in view of the enhanced community quarantine imposed in the Province, causing the temporary closure of certain offices of the Provincial Government;

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code gave provinces, through the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, the power to levy an annual ad valorem tax on real property and an annual tax on the assessed value of real property which shall be in addition to the real property tax, proceeds of which exclusively accrue to the Special Education Fund (SEF);

WHEREAS, Section 2F.05 of Provincial Ordinance No. 2004-001 or the Revised Revenue Code of the Province of Cavite provides that real property tax (RPT) levied together with the additional levy on real property for the Special Education Fund is due and payable on the first day of January. The same may, however, at the discretion of the taxpayer, be paid in four (4) equal installments: the first installment, on or before March 31; the second installment, on or before June 30; the third installment, on or before September 30; and the last installment, on or before December 31;

WHEREAS, Section 3B.02 of the Code provides that the tax on the transfer of real property ownership shall be paid by the transferor, executor, or administrator within sixty (60) days from the date of the execution of the deed or from the date of the death of the decedent;

WHEREAS, taxpayers shall be given temporary reprieve in the payment of their RPT and SEF tax liabilities due to the logistical difficulties posed by COVID-19 and the enhanced community quarantine imposed by reason thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Reyes, duly seconded by Hon. Gawaran and unanimously approved by the members of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Cavite in session assembled that:

SECTION 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as "An Ordinance Extending the Period for the Payment of Real Property Tax, Special Education Fund Tax, and the Tax on the Transfer of Real Property Ownership to 30 June 2020, Modifying Sections 2F.05 and 3B.02 of Provincial Ordinance No. 2004-001 or the Revised Revenue Code of the Province of Cavite";

SECTION 2. Period for Payment. Real property tax levied, together with the additional levy on real property for the Special Education Fund, shall be paid on or before 30 June 2020.

Bacoor City was one of the three major cities in the province which participated in the mass testing program of the provincial government of Cavite that commenced April 14, 2020.

The swab testing program was facilitated

by the City Health Office together with the Provincial Health Office and the Department of Health (DOH).

According to the DOH, there are two kinds of swab testing: the Nasopharyngeal swab (NPS) and the

Gropharyngeal swab (GPS) with results known after two or three days.

is sourced from waste materials.

The team embarked on the research project last March 27, 2020 and developed the prototype at the Material Science and Polymer Chemistry Laboratory in CSU, a project funded by the DOST-Philippine Council for Industry, Energy and Emerging Technologies Research and Development (PCIEERD). The lab serves as a facility, not just for researchers who are into materials development, but also for local industries. The team's current work is on cellulose biopolymer where they saw the potential in developing a filter material from it while integrating nanotechnology.

The team used paper wastes, acid, base, and bleaching reagents to produce nanocrystals then integrated with nanocellulose film to increase the filtering capability of the product. According to Dr. Capangpangan, the nanocellulose crystals can also be extracted from agricultural wastes such as pineapple leaves and water hyacinth.

The research is in collaboration with the College of Engineering and Geosciences (CEGS) and Caraga Fabrication Laboratory in CSU in developing the 3D printed face masks. The lab also collaborated with Dr. Arnold Alguno from the Mindanao State University-Iligan Institute of Technology (MSU-IIT) for the nanocellulose extraction.

The nanocellulose filter will cost around Php15.00 per piece while the 3D

if mass produced. The face mask can be reused while the filter material can be sun dried before reusing. The team continues to modify and test the product for its longevity.

Results from the flame and wettability tests show that the nanocellulose filter performs well as much as the commercial face masks. The team emphasized that the research project does not aim to replace the masks used by health and medical practitioners but to provide innovation to effectively reduce contamination using washable low cost

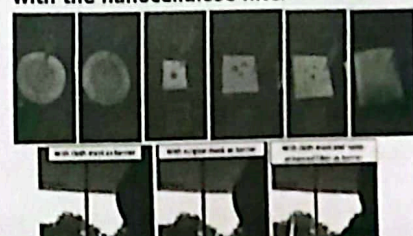
nanocellulose films.

For now, the laboratory is in need of raw materials and reagents to continue its production. The team of researchers is appealing for further assistance to manufacture more face masks. Interested parties who want to help contact DOST-Caraga the project leader, Dr. Capangpangan at Caraga State University, Buti City.

Incidentally, Capangpangan is an active member of National Research Council of the Philippines (NRC) of the Department of Science and Technology (Aliana Gene Sarmiento, S Promotions Unit)

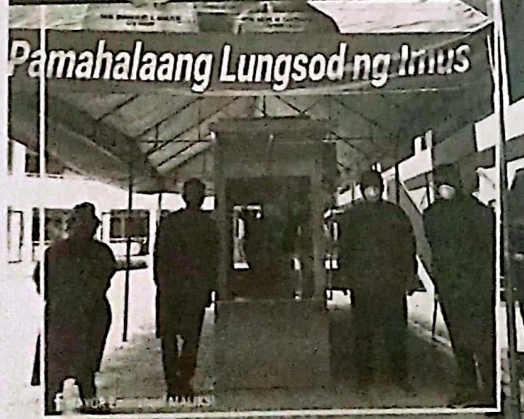

REMULLA: MIDDLE-CLASS ARE STRUGGLING THEY NEED ASSISTANCE FROM GOVERNMENT

CAVITE Governor Juanito Victor 'JonVic' C. Remulla appealed to President Rodrigo Roa Duterte to include the middle-class families in the national government's cash subsidy programs.

"They are barely struggling," Remulla said in his letter of appeal to the President posted in his Facebook account recently.

The governor said he wrote the letter to appeal for the middle class and should be part of the social amelioration programs (SAPs) which the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) which include cash subsidies to families greatly affected by the novel coronavirus disease-19 crisis.

The government has allotted P200 billion for the SAPs where 18

million families will be covered by the program in two months.

The DSWD will provide SAPs measures to families belonging to vulnerable sectors affected by the enhanced community quarantine (ECQ) amid the Covid-19 crisis as mandated by Republic Act No. 11469 (Bayanihan To Heal as One Act).

In his FB post, Remulla praised the national government's efforts to address the COVID-19 crisis in the Philippines.

"We finally have the leader we have been waiting for. Issues which only you had the authenticity to battle.

Despite the crisis, the country's economy is in resilient shape and promises to have a sharp rebound after," the governor wrote and added that the President's "economic advisers have served you well."

Remulla said that the middle-class people rely on their monthly pay and government loans and income taxes are deducted from it.

The Covid-19 crisis affected everyone, "not just the poorest of the poor, but also those who have built much but not enough," he said.

DOST-funded CSU lab develops innovative filter for face mask

The problem of the lack of effective face masks motivated the team of Dr. Rey Capangpangan from Caraga State University (CSU) to develop the nanocellulose filter material which is sourced from waste materials to produce face masks that are now very important for frontliners battling COVID-19.

Cloth face masks are especially in demand now. But are the ordinary face masks really effective against coronavirus? Sadly, no. These cannot filter larger droplets containing the virus because of the large pores in the material. However, with the shortage of commercial masks like surgical and N95 masks, people opted to use washable cloth face masks.

This problem motivated the team of Dr. Rey Capangpangan from Caraga State University to develop a filter material that can be inserted in the cloth face mask efficiently filter out contaminants – the nanocellulose film which ► DOST • 5
