President Rodrigo Roa Duterte has signed into law Monday the P4.5-trillion 2021 national budget that allocates money for the government's COVID-19 vaccine rollout and infrastructure development.

Attending the signing ceremony in Malacañang were select members of the Senate and the House of Representatives. "I stand before you today happy and proud to sign the 2021 General Appropriations Act," President Duterte said in his message. "This important piece of legislation attests to the importance of an active and fruitful collaboration between the Executive and the Legislative branches of government, especially at this time when the health and welfare of our people are at stake."

The ratification of the 2021 national budget manifests the commitment of all stakeholders to set aside divisive partisan politics for national good.

The President commended the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and civil society partners, which provided extensive knowledge and technical expertise in crafting the expenditure program that will enable the country to rebuild and push the economy forward.

With the signing of the 2021 national budget, the President said his administration could continue pursuing its flagship Build, Build, Build program, revitalize the industry and service sectors, and support much-needed social services projects.

"Let me stress, however, that one of the most important items in the 2021 budget is the allocation of 72.5 billion pesos for the purchase, storage, transportation, and distribution of COVID-19 vaccines," he said.

REMULLA KEEPS CAVITE UNDER MGCQ UNTIL JAN. 31, 2021

EFFECTIVE December 30, 2020, the whole province of Cavite was placed under the Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ) by virtue of an Executive Order issued and signed by Gov. Juanito Victor C. Remulla Jr.

The EO is numbered 47, series of 2020 which prohibited the use of firecrackers and other pyrotechnic devices, including community fireworks display due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Section 465(b) (1)(vii) of Republic Act No. 7160 — known as the local Government Code of 1991 — gives the provincial governor the power to issue executive orders "as may be necessary during and in the aftermath of man-made and natural disaster and calamities."

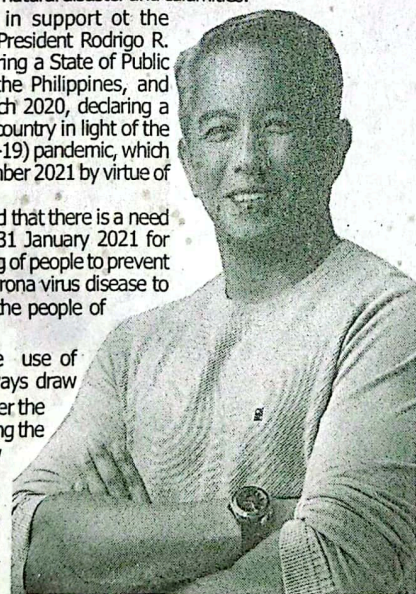
Remulla issued EO No. 47 in support of the Proclamation Order No. 922 of President Rodrigo R. Duterte on 08 March 2020, declaring a State of Public Health Emergency throughout the Philippines, and Proclamation No. 929 on 16 March 2020, declaring a State of Calamity throughout the country in light of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, which was later extended until 12 September 2021 by virtue of Proclamation No. 1021.

In his EO No. 47, Remulla stated that there is a need to put Cavite under MGCQ until 31 January 2021 for there is a need to limit the gathering of people to prevent the spread of the deadly novel corona virus disease to ensure the health and safety of the people of Cavite.

The reason of prohibiting the use of firecrackers and pyrotechnics always draw crowds and this will surely endanger the health and safety of Caviteños during the celebrations of Christmas and New Year.

Crowds of people watching firecrackers and pyrotechnics displays is considered "mass gathering" which is banned under the Omnibus Guidelines on

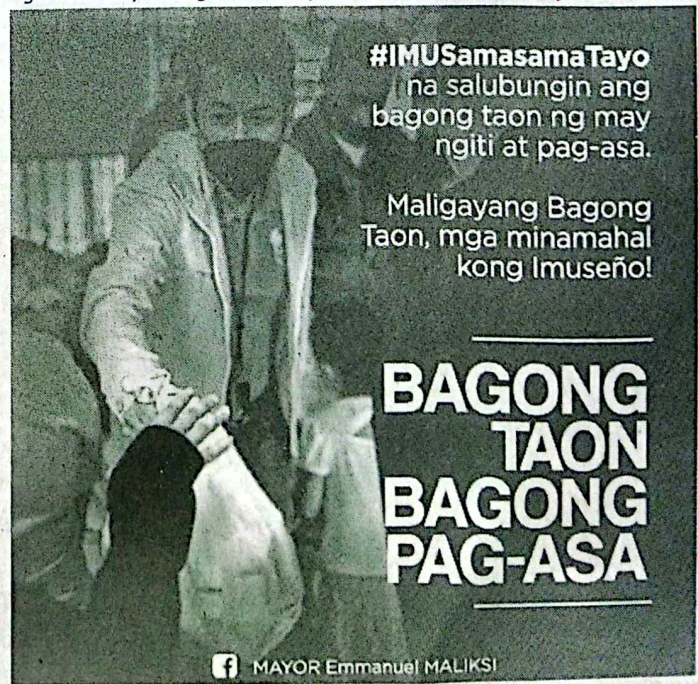

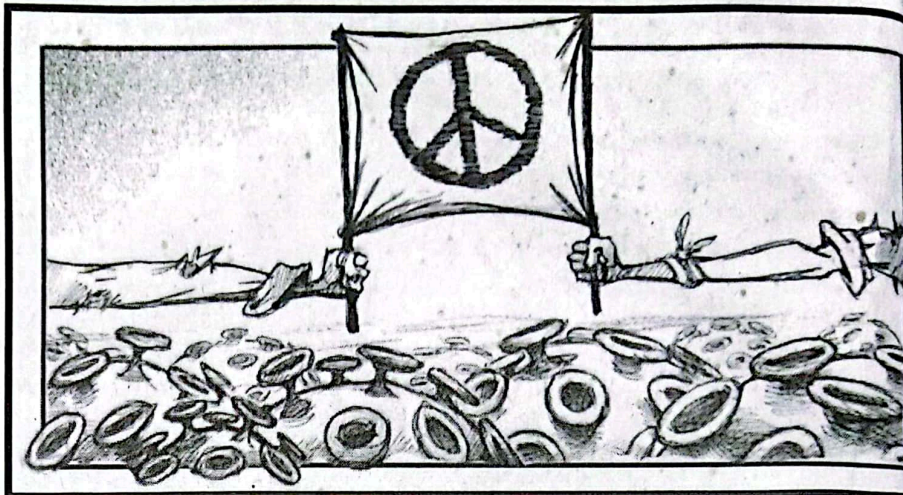

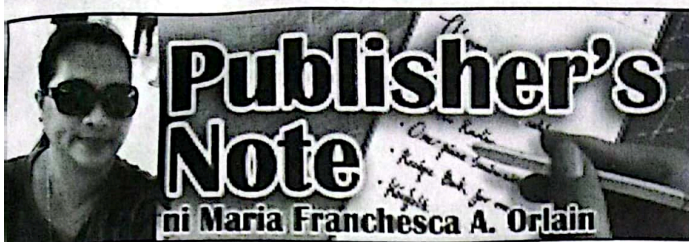

our resources through a sound fiscal policy that will enable us to overcome the debilitating effects of the pandemic on public health and our economy," he added.

President Duterte assured the Filipino public that every centavo contained in next year's spending measure would be spent to ensure the nation's recovery, resilience, and sustainability.

Under the 2021 national budget, the education sector received the lion's share with P708 billion.

The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) came second with P694 billion while the country's health sector got the third highest allocation with P287 billion. PND

Gov't adopts measures to slow the spread of COVID-19 mutated variant

The government has adopted measures to mitigate the spread of a new coronavirus disease (COVID-19) variant first detected in the United Kingdom and already has presence in a handful of countries.

President Rodrigo Roa Duterte, who presided a meeting Saturday of government officials and health experts, approved a two-week extension of travel ban on UK that expires December 31.

"As a matter of fact, I'm telling you there is no way of knowing how this thing would evolve. It is evolving itong new strain but how far, how fast is the progression, wala pa tayong alam," the President said during the televised meeting.

"So the best way is really

to play safe. You put a stop sa travel nila. That is a good. Kasali na man siguro iyan diyari."

Other measures include strict mandatory quarantine for travelers coming from countries with reports on the new COVID-19 variant — Hong Kong, Singapore, Australia.

Travelers from those countries will undergo mandatory completion of 14-day quarantine regardless of their reverse transcription polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) test results, Health Secretary Francisco Duque III said.

Also, countries with local community transmission will consider travel restriction but only when transmission of new variant is at the community level, he said, adding the World Health Organization (WHO) could provide information for Philippine authorities' guidance.

The President also highlighted the importance of enhanced surveillance to detect the presence of the new strain in the country, in which local government officials will play a major role.

He warned mayors and barangay captains that they will be sanctioned if there are lapses on their part particularly in mitigating the spread of COVID-19 cases in their localities.

"Alam mo ang pinaka ano diyari is the mayor and the barangay captains. So make it an obligation for them to really strictly follow also the whatever direction that we take in this fight against COVID," President Duterte said.

"So mayors must exert

efforts na sa kanilang munisipyo at barangay is working and they can push hard also the barangay captains. Iyong mga barangay captains na hindi tumatrabaho and the surveillance in Manila would just notice that there is a spike in your barangay, then we will investigate why na may spike," he added.

The national government should make the most out of the country's existing structure of governance to make sure that local government units will do the best they can to protect citizens from the deadly coronavirus disease.

"This time, lahat tayo. I said it behooves upon everybody who is with government to contribute. Dapat lang gawin ninyo, nakikinig kayo sa sinasabi ng ano. Iyong surveillance talaga importante. And well, if there's a lot of people who are sick then maybe the national government would also contribute something to control the pandemic in your place," he said.

Last week, the UK reported more than 1,000 cases of new coronavirus variant, which experts said, is 70 percent more infectious.

To prevent the new COVID-19 variant from entering the country, the Philippines has temporarily banned flights from UK and intensified travel health protocols for travelers.

The Department of Health (DOH) recorded 1,406 new COVID-19 cases on December 26, bringing the total number of infections in the country to 469,005

with 431,005 recoveries and 9,067 deaths. PND

DOH CONDUCTS EXTENSIVE BIDA PROMOTION CAMPAIGN IN CALABARZON

The Department of Health (DOH) – CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, Quezon) together with the local government officials of the municipality of Tanza yesterday conducted "BIDA Solusyon sa Covid-19 Campaign" in Barangay Bagtas, Tanza, Cavite.

The activity is one of the health department's strategy for behavioral change to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 in the community.

Its objective is to spread word about the minimum health standards to follow and to practice the four steps to COVID-free life which includes - B- Bawal Malang Mask, I- Isanitize ang mga Kamay, Iwas Lawak sa mga Bagay, D- Dumitansya ng isang metro, A - Alamin ang Totoong Impormasyon.

"Itong mga impormasyon kailangang alamatin at ugaliing gawin pang tayo ay maging gatas hindi lamang sa ovid kundi sa lahat ng uri ng mga virus na maaring magiging sanhi upang tayo ay magkasakit," Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo stated in his message.

"Kailangan nating undin ito, bigyang halaga ng ating kalusugan at sa ilalim ng ating lokal na amahalaan ay kaya natin

itong gawin. Sa suportang ating mga barangay officials at municipal officials, ang pagkakatagapag ng Covid sa ating komunidad ay makakayang nating sugpuin," he emphasized.

Janairo also acknowledged the importance of Barangay Health Workers (BHWs) in the BIDA Campaign. "Kayo po ang pinakamahalagang at ating health care system dahil kayo ang nasa community-level. Kaya makakaasa po kayong ang regional office ay kaagapay ninyo at suportahan namin kayo sa mga pangangailangan ng inyong mga barangay."

"Kaya't huwag po nating kakalimutan, walang maiwan, walang magsoosol, lahat samasama tayo sa pagtaguyod ng isang kalusugan sa ating bayan," he stressed.

The regional office distributed BIDA Solusyon Campaign IEC materials to

BHWs including washable face masks, alcohol, brochures and posters containing information on new normal or rules on the minimum health standards against Covid-19.

The BHWs will be the one to conduct house-to-house distribution and promotion of the BIDA campaign to 41 barangays covering 53,692 households in Tanza, Cavite.

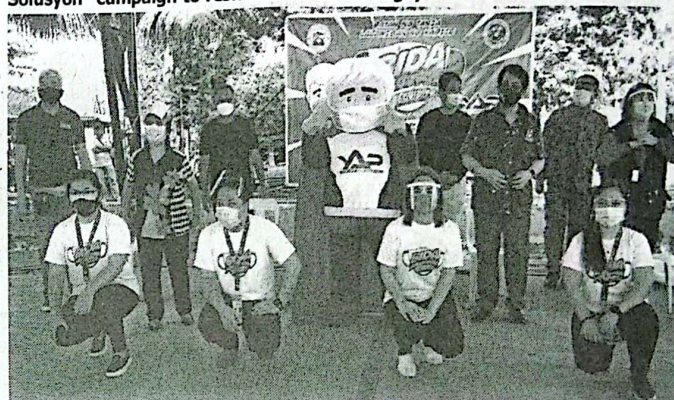
According to the December 22, 2020 DOH-CALABARZON Covid-19 tracker, there are 78 cases recorded in Barangay Bagtas, Tanza with 26 active case and 1 death.

The promotion and distribution of BIDA Solusyon IEC Materials began in November 24, 2020, with a total of 53 health facilities and offices visited to date which includes 17 in Cavite, 17 in Rizal, 8 in Quezon and 11 in Laguna.

ORDER

The petitioner's Compliance and Manifestation, filed on October 14, 2020, anent the proof of service of copies of the petition to the Office of the Solicitor General, is hereby NOTED.

Petitioners-spouses Randy C. Dugay and Rhea Aguilar Dugay filed this petition for the adoption of the minor child Maria Chrizela Cabrera Gonzales and with application to change the minor's name from Maria Chrizela Cabrera Gonzales to Maria Chrizela Gonzales Lopez.

Petitioner-spouses alleged, in their Petition, that:

1. Petitioners are Filipino spouses of legal age, and residents of 139 Gen. Bautista St., Imus City, Cavite. For purposes of this petition, they may be served with notices and other processes of this Honorable Court through the office of the undersigned counsel at BUENA AND REYES LAW OFFICES, Lower Ground Floor, Dionets Commercial Place, Trece-Indang Road, Trece Martines City, Cavite;

2. MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES is a minor, having been born on 23 June 2008, at Las Piñas Doctors Hospital, Las Piñas City, evidenced by her Certificate of Live Birth, attached hereto and made an integral part hereof as Annex "A";

3. Petitioner HAZEL ANN G. LOPEZ is the biological mother of minor MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES, having conceived said child out of wedlock years prior to meeting her husband, petitioner KEREN T. LOPEZ. The minor's biological father has abandoned petitioner HAZEL ANN G. LOPEZ after knowing of the child's conception;

4. Petitioner HAZEL ANN G. LOPEZ has raised the child by herself until her marriage with petitioner KEREN T. LOPEZ on 22 July 2017. Their marriage certificate is attached hereto and made an integral part hereof as Annex "B";

5. Since their marriage, they have jointly supported MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES who is living with them, showering her with love and affection and proving for her financial, physical and spiritual needs. Subsequently, on 31 July 2018, petitioners were blessed with a child – Lucas Emmanuel Gonzales Lopez and MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES welcomed her half-brother with love and joy;

6. Petitioners desire to adopt MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES to give her the status of legitimacy and change her name to MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES LOPEZ so she could live her life in a happy and loving family without the social stigma of being an illegitimate child;

7. Petitioners are employees of Metropolitan Bank and Trust Company (METROBANK) and are financially capable of maintaining the support and care of said minor, should this petition for adoption be granted by this Honorable Court. Copies of their certificate of employment with disclosure of their annual salary are attached

hereto and made integral parts hereto as Annexes "C" and "D";

8. The mother of petitioner HAZEL ANN G. LOPEZ also lives with them and takes care of her grandchildren when both parents are at work;

9. Petitioners have never been charged or convicted of any crime involving moral turpitude in the Philippines and are in a position to support the child in keeping with the means of the family. Copies of their Clearance from the Regional Trial Court, Municipal Trial Court in Cities, Office of the City Prosecutor, NBI and PNP are attached hereto and made integral parts hereof respectively as Annexes "E", "F", "G", "H", "I", "J", "K", "L", "M", "N";

10. Petitioners have not suffered or are suffering from any disqualification provided for by law on the contrary, they possess all the qualifications for the adoption of the herein minor and have attended Pre-adoption Services in compliance with Article III Sec. 4 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 8552 (Domestic Adoption Act of 1993). community Quarantine used by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF), the EO said.

The prohibition will minimize the risk of injuries and casualties during the celebrations of Christmas and New Year.

The EO No. 47 also stated the following: "xxx Republic

Act No. 7183 ("An Act Regulating the Sale, Manufactures, Distribution and use of Firecrackers and Other Pyrotechnic Devices") gives local chief executives the authority to promulgate the necessary rules and regulations relative to the use of firecrackers and pyrotechnic devices within their territorial jurisdiction in conformity with the national

standards, rules and regulations." To ensure the safety of the people, Gov. Remulla directed the Philippines National Police Cavite to enforce and strictly monitor compliance of his Executive Order.

Earlier, Remulla in his official Facebook social media account praised the Caviteños for being disciplined in the observance of the health guidelines and protocol during the holidays season.

In his post Dec. 23, 2020, the governor said "ipinagmamalaki ko ang mga Caviteño", saying the discipline has lowered the number of Covid cases in the province.

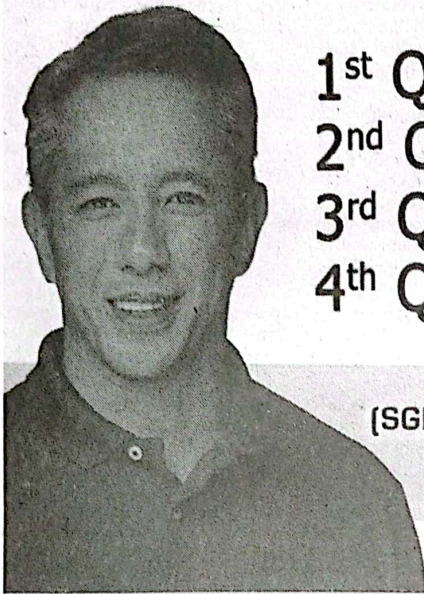

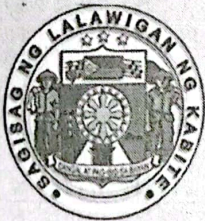

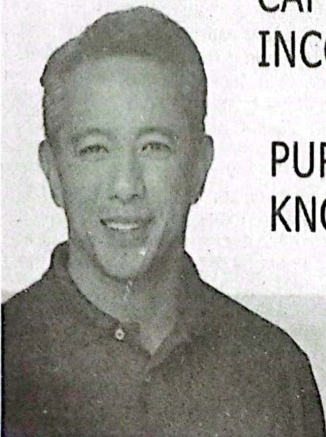
