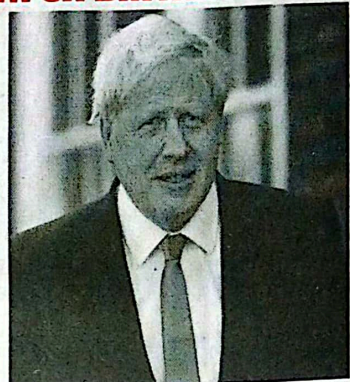

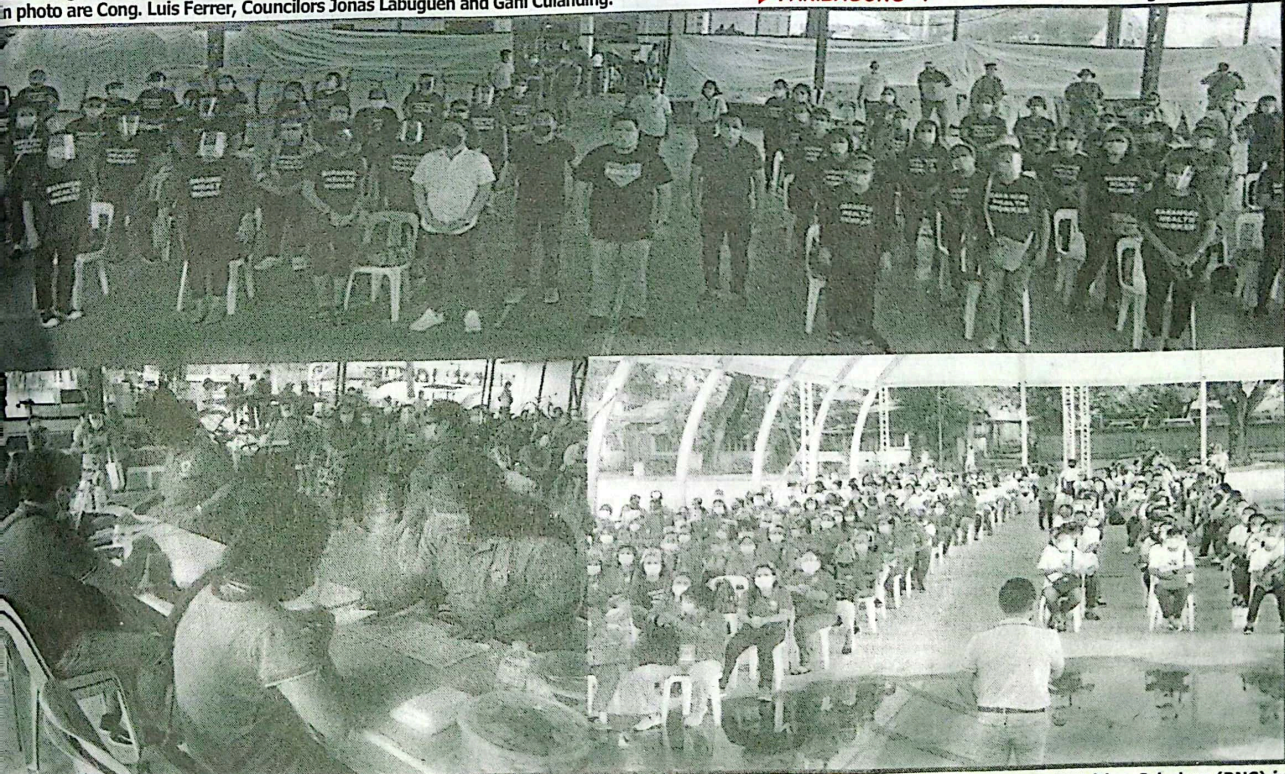
PANIBAGONG STRAIN NG VIRUS SANHI NG LOCKDOWN SA BRITANYA

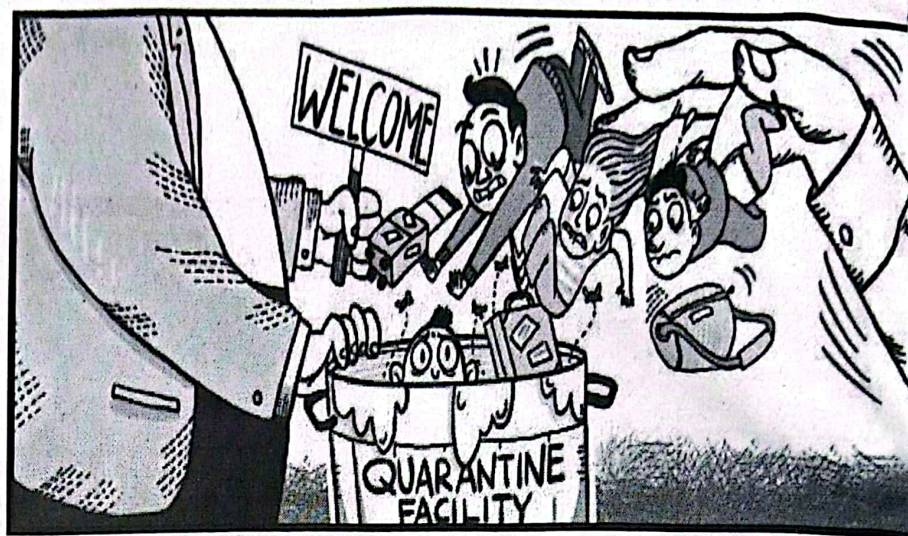
IMPLEMENTATION NG FACE TO FACE CLASSES BINAWI NI PANGULONG DUTERTE?

Priority na hindi dapat ipagsapalaran ang kalusugan at buhay ng mga bata sa pagkakataong ito. Dahil wala pang bakunang nakakaratang sa ating bansa. Na ayon pa sa karamihan, maghintay sa paghupa ng virus o kaya kung may epektibo ng bakuna bago hayaang pumasok sa school ang mga bata. Kaligtasan muna ang unahin bago edukasyon.



295 San Pablo City TUPAD beneficiaries receive pay out

SAN PABLO CITY, Laguna, Jan 7 --About 295 beneficiaries of the Tulon Panghanapbuhay sa Ating Displaced/Disadvantage (TUPAD) of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) in this city received their payout on December 29, 2020.

Lorie Gacosta of DOLE IV-A in coordination with the Public Employment Service Office (PESO)-San Pablo and the Barangay Affairs Office led the distribution of the pay-out held at the City Governance Bldg.

The TUPAD beneficiaries were residents of barangays San Marcos, Sto. Rosario, Sta. Maria, IV-C, V-A, V-B, VII-A, San Jose, Sta. Catalina, San Pedro, San Lucas II, VI-C, II-A and San Francisco.

Out of the 290 beneficiaries, 260 received P6,500 for the 16.25 working days of service rendered while 35 beneficiaries received P4,000 for the service rendered for 10 working days.

The temporary work for 10-16 days was the initiative of Laguna 3rd District Rep. Sol Aragones and San Pablo City Mayor

Loreto Amante.

In September 2020, about 224 unemployed individuals in the city had been also provided with temporary employment under TUPAD.

According to DOLE website, TUPAD is a community-based package of assistance that provides emergency employment for displaced workers, underemployed and seasonal workers, for a minimum period of 10 days, but not to exceed a maximum of 30 days, depending on the nature of work to be performed.

This assistance supports social community projects, such as repair, maintenance, and/or improvement of common public facilities and infrastructure such as schools and health centers, debris clearing, de-clogging of canals, debris segregation and materials recovery,



stockpiling and clearing.

In addition, economic community projects like repair, maintenance and/or rehabilitation of farm-to-market roads, bridges, post-harvest facilities, public markets and common service facilities such as production and display centers, fishports.

Also, agro-forestry community projects, such as tree planting, seedling

preparation, and reforestation.

TUPAD is an emergency employment assistance offered to workers displaced due to the implementation of the community quarantine last year as the government's precautionary measure against COVID-19. (CPG PIA-4A with report from CIO San Pablo)

are available.

This was the promise of Mayor Antonio 'Ony' Ferrer to the 30 leaders of the transport organizations that attended the meeting held Monday, December 28, 2020.

"The City Government plans to buy the vaccine kung hindi kayo i-consider as frontliners. We the LGU will provide to about 4,000 members of jeepney and tricycle drivers for them to continue transporting passengers safely," the local chief executive said.

"Para makalabas agad, para makapasada agad, hindi po kayo kayang sustentuhan ng pamahalaang lokal. Ang priority po natin ay kumita

ang bawat isa para mabuhay at para umusap ang ekonomiya."

(To be able to get out immediately, to get back to work immediately, the local government cannot support you. Our priority is for everyone to earn to live and for the economy to move forward.)

During the meeting, Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG)-Cavite Provincial Director Lionel Dalope elaborated about the COVID-19 situation in the country with news of a new variant of the virus discovered in the United Kingdom.

"Based on the study, there is a new variant of

COVID. Huaag po tayong pakampante or relax sa panahon ngayon. Ugaliin po natin sumunod sa guidelines, hindi po solusyon ang puro reklamo," Dalope said.

(We need not let our guards down or relax during this time. We should make it a habit to follow the guidelines, and complaining is not a solution.)

"Let us not abuse the loosening of the quarantine protocols, as President Rodrigo Duterte announced that Cavite will remain under Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ) until January 31, 2021," PD Dalope added.

The DILG recently recognized the LGU as Best LGU in the Conduct

of Contact Tracing in the Province for the diligent work and commendable performance in protecting its citizenry with the control of the transmission of the virus, and prevent the spread of the pandemic.

Meanwhile Congressman Luis 'Jonjon' Ferrer IV of the Lone District of General Trias continues to support the LGU through infrastructure projects particularly with the opening of new access roads or streets to help ease traffic flow in the area and the establishment of a decent jeepney and tricycle terminals in the city. 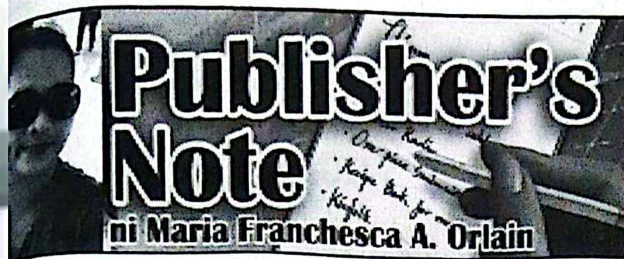

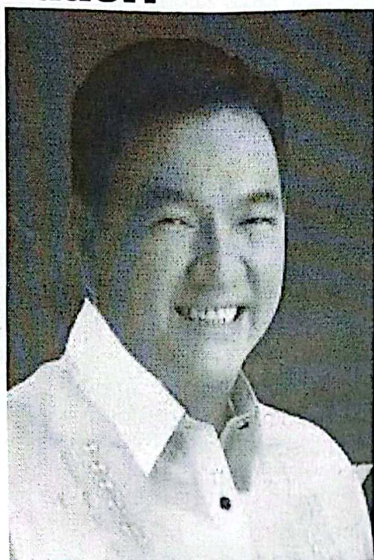

Ang ating average mobile internet speed 18.49 megabits per second (Mbps) at sa 139 countries, No. 110 tayo sa 139 bansa.

Makupad din sa Indonesia na ang "kupad" ay 17.45 Mbps.

Sa Asia, sabi ng Speedtest, No. 1 ang United Arab Emirates sa 170.30 Mbps at 6.31 Mbps ang "kupad" ng Afghanistan.

According to Speedtest, ang karaniwang bilis ng internet connection sa mundo, ay 45.69 Mbps, at 30.94 MBps ang average speed of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN).

Sa average speed na 28.69 Mbps, ang Pilipinas ay No.103 sa 176 bansa, kumpara sa Singapore, sa Asia, No. 1 sa 241.10 Mbps na speed nito, at kulelat ang Turkmenistan na may 3.47 MBPs.

Sa Southeast Asia, tanging ang Cambodia (25.31 Mbps) at Indonesia (23.32 Mbps) ang may slower fixed broadband speeds.

PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 313-2020

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 280-2020, "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF BEER, LIQUOR, AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OF ANY KIND IN THE PROVINCE OF CAVITE DURING THE STATE OF PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY AND STATE OF CALAMITY DUE TO THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) PANDEMIC"

WHEREAS, President Rodrigo R. Duterte issued Proclamation No. 922 on 8 March 2020, declaring a State of Public Health Emergency throughout the Philippines, and Proclamation No. 929 on 16 March 2020, declaring a State of Calamity throughout the country in light of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic;

WHEREAS, Proclamation No. 1021 issued by President Duterte extended the period of the State of Calamity throughout the Philippines due to the COVID-19 pandemic until 12 September 2021;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan passed Provincial Ordinance No. 271-2020, prohibiting the sale and consumption of beer, liquor, and alcoholic beverages of any kind in the Province of Cavite during the Enhanced Community Quarantine, while Provincial Ordinance No. 278-2020 extended the said prohibition through the General Community Quarantine;

WHEREAS, Provincial Ordinance No. 280-2020 lifted the liquor ban in the Province of Cavite during the State of Public Health Emergency and State of Calamity declared due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but imposed conditions on the sale and consumption of beer, liquor or alcoholic beverage of any kind;

WHEREAS, the Province of Cavite has been placed under the more lenient Modified General Community Quarantine since 1 September 2020;

WHEREAS, the prohibition and later regulation on the sale of alcoholic beverages in the Province, which have spanned a period of eight (8) months, have brought about significant adverse impact on the domestic liquor industry as well as to retail establishments in the Province;

WHEREAS, there is a need to balance the health and safety of the people of Cavite and the recovery of the local economy;

WHEREAS, lifting the regulations on the sale of alcoholic beverages as provided under Provincial Ordinance No. 280-2020 will help restimulate liquor industry and contribute to the recovery of the local economy;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Ambion, duly seconded by Hon. Grepo and Hon. Gawaran and all the members present, be it ordained the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in session assembled that:

SECTION 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as "An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 280-2020, 'An Ordinance Regulating the Sale and Consumption of Beer, Liquor, and Alcoholic Beverages of Any Kind in the Province of Cavite During the State of Public Health Emergency and State of Calamity due to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Pandemic.'"

SECTION 2. Section 2 of Provincial Ordinance No. 280-2020 is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 2. Lifting of Liquor Ban. The sale and consumption of beer, liquor, or alcoholic beverage of any kind within the territorial jurisdiction of the Province of Cavite shall be allowed during the State of Public Health Emergency and State of Calamity declared due to COVID-19, subject to the following condition:

The consumption of beer, liquor, or alcoholic beverage of any kind shall only be allowed within private residences.

SECTION 3. Section 3 of Provincial Ordinance No. 280-2020 is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 3. Penal Clause. Persons who shall consume beer, liquor, or other alcoholic beverage in violation of this Ordinance shall suffer the following penalties:

First offense – a fine not exceeding Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00) and/or imprisonment for a period not exceeding five (5) days;

Second offense – a fine not exceeding Three Thousand Pesos (P3,000.00) and/or imprisonment for a period not exceeding ten (10) days;

Third and succeeding offenses – a fine not exceeding Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) and/or imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days.

SECTION 4. Repealing Clause. All ordinances, resolutions and executive orders inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. If any part or portion of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions not affected hereby shall remain in full force and effect.


SECTION 6. Effectivity Clause. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.







Petitioners-spouses Randy C. Dugay and Rhea Aguilar Dugay filed this petition for the adoption of the minor child Maria Chrizela Cabrera Gonzales and with application to change the minor's name to Maria Chrizela Cabrera Gonzales to Maria Chrizela Gonzales.

Petitioner-spouses alleged, in their Petition, that:

1. Petitioners are Filipino spouses of legal age, and residents of 39 Gen. Bautista St., Imus City, Cavite. DPWH opens another infra project for South Luzon's further development

Tagaytay City, Cavite – The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) held the ceremonial opening of Kaykulot Bridge recently.

DPWH Secretary Mark Villar led the simple ceremony together with Tagaytay City Administrator Gregorio Monreal, DPWH Region 4A OIC Director Jovel G. Mendoza and Cavite Second District Engineer Adilbert Rosete.

The bridge is a 90 lineal meter bridge that connects Tagaytay-Calamba Road to Sta. Rosa-Ulat-Tagaytay Road in the province.

According to Sec. Villar, the bridge was built with construction cost of P65.7M and is

seen to benefit some 2,000 motorists daily.

Kaykulot Bridge is a key component of the Kaykulot Road which provide an alternative route and easy access to tourist destinations in the city such as the Tagaytay Picnic Grove and People's Park in the Sky.

The Kaykulot Road Project has a total length of 2.367 kilometers, and comprises of 1.863 kilometer concrete pavement road with 13.40 meters width, curb and sidewalk on both sides; the completed 90 lineal meter Kaykulot

concrete bridge; and 504 lineal meter underpass including bridge proposed for funding in the CY2021 program, explained DPWH 4A OIC Director Mendoza.

"With better accessibility, Tagaytay City is gearing up for more visitors with this new route," added Secretary Villar.

Aside from an increase in tourism for the city, the road is also expected to bring product market opportunities for communities that will boost the local economy. (DPWH Regional Office No. 4A)

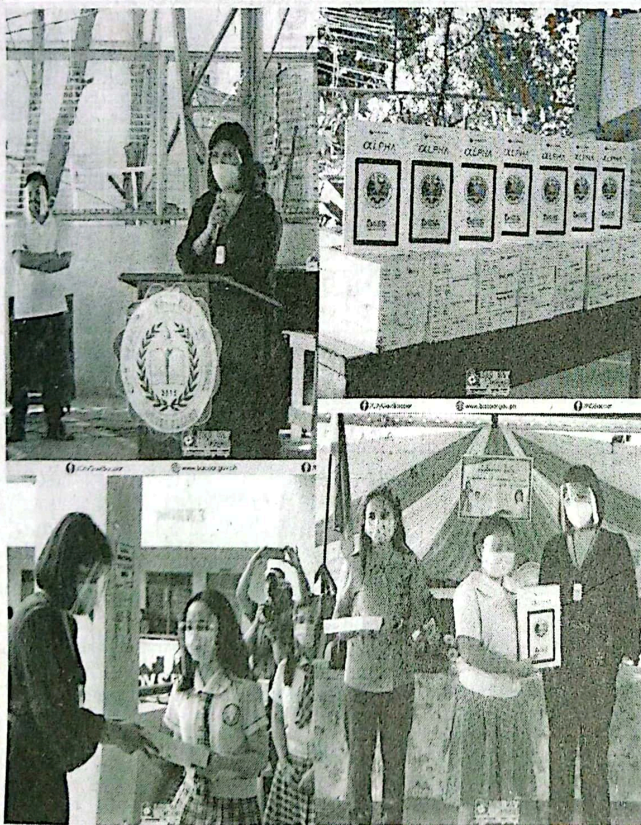
