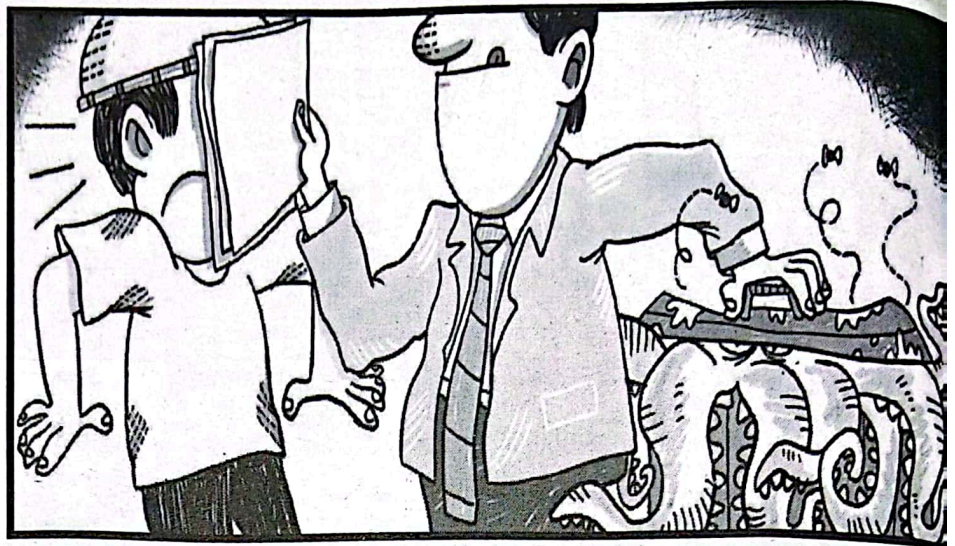
# Editorial

## MAHABANG PANAHON ANG GUGULIN BAGO MAKAGAWA NG SAPAT NA DOSIS NG BAKUNA - W.H.O.

**N**itong nakarang Linggo nagbigay babala naman ang World Health Organization (WHO) Chief Scientist Soumya Swaminathan na mahabang panahon ang gugulin bago makagawa ng dosis ng bakuna upang mapahinto ang pagkalat ng virus. Kahit pa na may mga bakuna ng inilunsad sa maraming bansa, hindi pa rin makakami ang herd immunity ngayong taon ayon sa WHO.

Ang pandemya ay umabot na sa 90 milyong katao ang nahawahan at lagpas naman 1.94 milyon ang bilang ng mga namatay. Mula ng kumpirmahin ng China ang unang pagkamatay sa gitnang Lungsod ng Wuhan may isang taon na ang nakalipas. Ang isang tanging paraan na nakikita ng WHO ay bigyang diin ang pangangailang pangseguridad para sa kalusugan, ang panatilihin ang pisikal na distansya, paghuhugas ng kamay at pagsuot ng face mask upang marendahan ang pandemya.

Samantalang dito sa ating bansa ang pinakahuling tala nitong Enero 10, 2021 ay umabot sa 487,690 kaso, samantalang ang mga namatay naman ay 9,405 na maliit lang na bilang kung ikumpara sa ibang bansa. Pero sa datos pumapagalawa ang Pilipinas sa dami ng mga COVID-19 cases sa Southeast Asia, na ayon pa sa pinakahuling ulat may 42 bansa na ang nabakunahan ang kanilang mamamayan. Na katulad nating mga Pilipino ay naghihintay din sa pagdating ng bakuna, na sana'y huwag naman tayong mahuli global vaccination program.



## Bacoor LGU prepares for COVID-19 vaccination, allots P100M

**Bacoor City, Cavite** – Last January 13 The local chief executive of the city government here Mayor Lani Mercado-Revilla joined the meeting of the League of Cities in the Philippines (LCP) along with other heads of local government units (LGU) and National Task Force Vaccine Czar Carlito Galvez, Jr. via Zoom.



According to the letter presented by the LGU to the league, the city has a projected population of 707,604 for 2021 with 70% of the total population targeted to be vaccinated.

Mayor Revilla disclosed that the City Government had earmarked about P50M to P100M for the procurement of the COVID-19 vaccine once a vaccine is available.

The distribution of the vaccine according to the Mayor will prioritize the

2,200 city Frontline Health Workers, 312 uniformed personnel, 469 Social Workers, 44,471 Senior Citizens, 12,953 Persons with Disability (PWDs), 1,388 Persons Deprived of Liberty (PDL) in the city's jail facilities, 1,813 other Frontline Government Workers, 2,618 teachers, 92,525 students, and 85,000 of the indigent population.

Meanwhile, the LGU prefers vaccines developed by companies such as AstraZeneca with

its vaccine approved for emergency use and now being administered to healthcare workers in the UK; Jansen COVID-19 vaccine from Johnson & Johnson which was approved by the Food and Drug Authority (FDA) for clinical trials in the county around the end of last year; developed vaccine from the US Drug maker Novavax from where the Philippines had secured 30 million doses; Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine the first vaccine for which

the US-FDA had first issued the emergency use authorization (EUA), and Moderna COVID-19 vaccine the second vaccine which was issued EUA by the US-FDA.

With regards to the private companies in the city, there is no commitment given yet for the procurement of the vaccines for their employees according to the LGU officials. (Ruel Francisco with reports from the Bacoor Public Information Office)

Mas mabusisi ang assessment & evaluation ng mga korte para sa mga publishing organization ng dyaryo, kagaya ng Operation EXPOSE (dating Cavite EXPOSE), Cavite Times Journal, North South Journal at iba pa." sabi sa kolum ni Sir Fabros.

Ang pagtutugis na Kon. Atty. Vejerano ay pinanigan ng konseho at nagkasundo na "iitsa - pwera na ang nasabing privilege speech (ni Kon. Buryo).

Sa kolum ni Sir Dan, binanggit na nag-usap sila ni Billy Sadik ng Dyaryong Journalism noong Nob. 16, 2020 at inamin na hindi sila naabisuhan na magsumite ng "proposal of publication."

Hindi rin pala, sabi ni Sir. Dan na siya bilang taga-Cavite Expose ay hindi rin naabisuhan na mag-bid para sa nasabing ordinansa, sabi niya: "WHOA! "Balak ni Sadik na maghain ng reklamo, kung saan at kanino siya dudulog ay di po natin alam. Kaya ating abangan ang susunod na kabanata, ehem."

"(Pahabol; Meron reklamo si Sadik: totoo bang pinagbawalan siyang pumasok sa munisipyo? Meron bang deklarasyon na siya ay persona non-grata? Sino ang nagbabawal?"

## Cavite LGUs anticipate arrival of COVID-19 vaccine

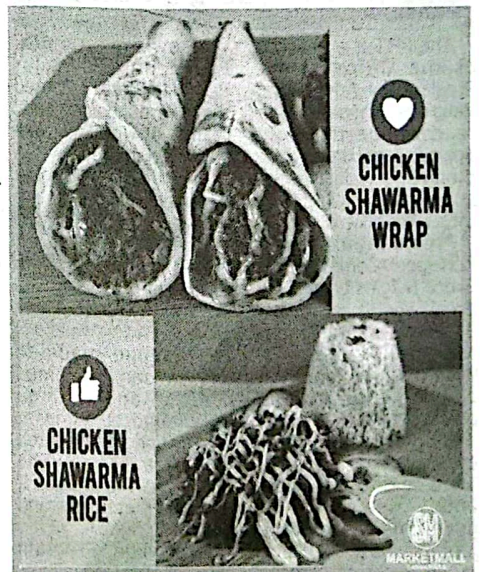
**ce Martires, Cavite Jan. 21** — In anticipation of the arrival of the COVID-19 vaccine, several local government units (LGUs) in the province made plans to prepare for their vaccination program. They had allocated portions of their funds for the procurement of the vaccine that will be made available for purchase.

The City Government of Marikina was the first to announce their intent to purchase COVID-19 vaccines. An allocation of P50M to P100M of their LGU funds targets to vaccinate 70% of the total population of the city. Marikina is the city's health workers, formed personnel, and city frontliners. Likewise Noveleta, the smallest town in the province headed by Mayor to Reyes-Chua declared that they had allocated P100M (P50M from the annual Investment Program and P50M from the Disaster Preparedness Fund) to the LGU and targets to vaccinate 50,000 residents of the municipality. Similarly, Cavite City allocated P50M as the LGU

anticipates for the early purchase of the COVID-19 to keep its constituents safe while the Municipality of Tanza declared an allocation of P20M for the same purpose. Early this week, Imus City Mayor Emmanuel L. Maliksi announced on his ELM FB Live episode on allocating a budget close to P100M for the procurement of the COVID-19 with the LGU favoring the vaccine developed by the drug manufacturer AstraZeneca. Meanwhile, total Recoveries of 2,239 were recorded by the General Trias CESU as of 4pm January 20 as the city LGU awaits the arrival of COVID-19 vaccines.

"We are still waiting on the National Government and Provincial Government how many COVID-19 vaccines they can provide for each locality especially here in GenTri, before we can take action," Mayor Antonio 'Ony' Ferrer said in an interview. Mayor Ferrer declared that, "General Trias has enough funds and savings and we have no debts, we can afford to procure Covax if needed for the safety of my constituents." According to the Mayor unless the number of COVID-19 vaccines to be provided by the national and provincial government is determined, it is difficult

to come up with the correct amount of budget. "Let's wait and see, madali naman magpa-supplemental budget if needed," Ferrer said (Let's wait and see, it is easy to request for a supplemental budget if the need arises.) Pursuant to the directive of the national government, the purchase of COVID-19 vaccines by the LGUs would be under a Tripartite agreement with most LGUs in the province favoring the vaccine developed by AstraZeneca Pharmaceuticals because of its affordable price. MPTC personnel made rounds to distribute the donations aimed at sharing the spirit of Christmas with the frontliners and their families. Among the areas covered include the cities of Quezon,

Caloocan, Malabon, Navotas, Valenzuela, Parañaque, Pasay, Taguig, Pasig, and Las Piñas in Metro Manila; several LGUs in Bulacan, Pampanga, Tarlac, Bataan, Cavite and Laguna; Nasugbu, Batangas as well as Cordova and Cebu City in the province of Cebu.

Recognizing our role in Luzon's supply chain, MPTC expressways remained open during the early months of the lockdown, following the IATF guidelines, to assure the unhampered movement of cargoes and goods, as well as the efficient commuting of medical frontliners and other essential workers.

MPTC personnel rendered 24/7 service to ensure continued operations of NLEX, SCTEX, CAVITEX, and CALAX. Last Christmas and New Year, motorists also enjoyed a toll free travel as toll fees were not collected on all MPTC expressways from 10:00 p.m. of December 24 to 6:00 a.m. of December 25 and from 10:00 p.m. of December 31 to 6:00 a.m. of January 1, 2021.

MPTC, through its business units, also provided free shuttle and free toll to doctors, nurses, and other healthcare professionals to support the mobility needs of frontliners in the COVID-19 efforts. MPTC companies distributed food donations to 220 barangays within the MPTC expressway network. They also launched a donation drive to purchase 4,500 personal protective equipment for frontliners in eight North and South Luzon hospitals.



Noche Buena packs were given to medical frontliners in 45 cities and municipalities from the North and South Luzon including the Visayas region. Instead of sending out gifts to various stakeholders, MPTC used its Christmas gifts budget to give back and bring cheer to the real-life heroes in the battle over the global health crisis. 4. Petitioner HAZEL ANN G. LOPEZ has raised the child by herself until her marriage with petitioner KAREN T. LOPEZ on 22 July 2017. Their marriage certificate in attached hereto and made an integral part hereof as Annex "B";

5. Since their marriage, they have jointly supported MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES who is living with them, showering her with love and affection and proving for her financial, physical and spiritual needs. Subsequently, on 31 July 2018, petitioners were blessed with a child – Lucas Emmanuel Gonzales Lopez and MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES welcomed her half-brother with love and joy;

6. Petitioners desire to adopt MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES to give her the status of legitimacy and change her name to MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES LOPEZ so she could live her life in a happy and loving family without the social stigma of being an illegitimate child;

7. Petitioners are employees of Metropolitan Bank and Trust Company (METROBANK) and are financially capable of maintaining the support and care of said minor, should this petition for adoption be granted by this Honorable Court. Copies of their certificate of employment with disclosure of their annual salary are attached hereto and made integral parts hereto as Annexes "C" and "D";

8. The mother of petitioner HAZEL ANN G. LOPEZ also lives with them and takes care of her grandchildren when both parents are at work;

9. Petitioners have never been charged or convicted of any crime involving moral turpitude in the Philippines and are in a position to support the child in keeping with the means of the family. Copies of their Clearance from the Regional Trial Court, Municipal Trial Court In Cities, Office of the City Prosecutor, NBI

Petitioners have not suffered or are suffering from any disqualification provided for by law on the contrary, they possess all the qualifications for the adoption of the herein minor and have attended Pre-adoption Services in compliance with Article III Sec. 4 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 8552 (Domestic Adoption Act of 1993). The certification by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) is attached hereto and made an integral part hereof as Annex "O";

11. Petitioners are physically and psychologically fit to adopt the said child, evidenced by their psychological examinations and joint medical certificates which are attached hereto and made integral parts hereof as Annex "P", "Q", and "R";

12. Petitioners are also respectable members of the community shown by affidavits of disinterested persons and Clearance from their Barangay respectively attached hereto and made integral parts hereof as Annexes "S", "T", and "U";

13. The minor MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES is now a healthy eleven (11) years-old, has no known estate or property and is not disqualified by law to be adopted. A copy of her medical certificate and affidavit of consent to the adoption are attached hereto and made integral parts hereof as Annexes "V", and "W";

14. The adoption by the petitioners of the minor MARIA CHRIZELA CABRERA GONZALES will serve her best interest, well-being and security if she would be considered as true and legal child of herein petitioners and it will make her life normal and productive, thus becoming a respectable member of the community.

The petitioner-spouses pray that this Court grant their petition for the adoption of Maria Chrizela Cabrera Gonzales and for the change of the child's name to Maria Chrizela Gonzales Lopez.

WHEREFORE, finding the petition to be sufficient in form and substance, the Court hereby sets it for hearing on APRIL 15, 2021, at 8:30 a.m. Any interested party may appear and show the cause why the petition should not be granted.

The Court NOTES the submission of Ms. Glenda M. Obligation, RSW, Social Welfare Officer II, CSWD, Imus City, Cavite of the Comprehensive Child and Home Study Report, dated June 25, 2020.

The CSWD, Imus City, Cavite is directed to conduct counseling sessions with the biological parent(s) on the matter of adoption of the adoptee and submit her report before the date of hearing.

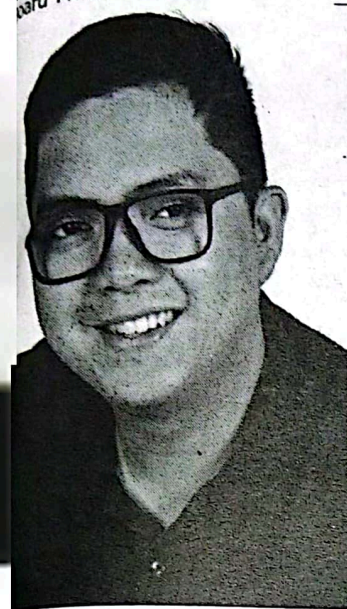

AstraZeneca mainly because it is not costly, disclosed Maliksi.

Also, according to the Mayor, the Chief of Hospital, and the City Health Office led by Dr. Randy Calingasan wrote to the Department of Health to coordinate for the provision of the vaccine for the city once vaccines were made available.

"The City Government has allotted an amount close to P100M for the procurement of the COVID-19 vaccines to

augment the supply of the vaccines that will be provided by the national government to the city," Maliksi said.

"Wala pang abiso kung anong vaccine ang maibibigay sa Imus," added the Mayor. (There is no advice on what kind of vaccine will be given to the City of Imus.)

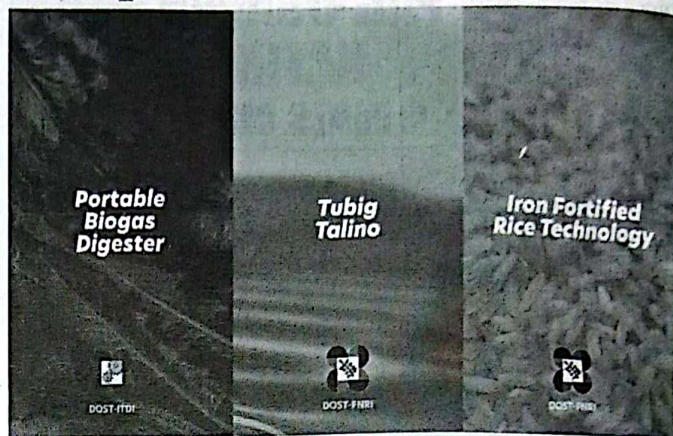
## DOST PSTC-Cavite partners with local groups for the use of DOST-developed technologies

The Department of Science and Technology-CALABARZON (DOST-CALABARZON) through its Provincial Science and Technology Center (PSTC) in Cavite partnered with the local government unit (LGU) of Noveleta, Cavite and with two Cavite-based cooperatives for the use of DOST-developed technologies. The LGU of Noveleta adopted the DOST-ITDI Portable Biogas Digester, while the Maitim II East Water Service Cooperative (M2EWC) and the Palangue Agrarian Reform Cooperative (PARC) adopted the DOST-FNRI Food and Nutrition Research Institute (FNRI) Tubig Talino and Iron Fortified Rice Technology, respectively.



Through the DOST Community-Based Program (CBP), the LGU of Noveleta received 17 units of Portable Biogas Digester from the DOST PSTC-Cavite. The DOST-ITDI designed and developed the adopted Portable Biogas Digester, which converts household waste materials into gas for cooking. The LGU of Noveleta, in adopting the named technology, seeks to establish improved biodegradable waste processing facilities for the 16 barangays of the municipality of Noveleta. Aside from providing better waste management of household and agricultural wastes, this DOST-ITDI technology also supplements the energy needs of small households and produces sludge, reusable as soil conditioner.

On the other hand, the M2EWC sought the use of the DOST-FNRI Iodine Rich Drinking Water, Tubig Talino. The DOST PSTC-Cavite pledges the provision of water refilling equipment and other



tools needed for iodine fortification. The DOST-FNRI developed Tubig Talino to control and prevent Iodine Deficiency Disorders (IDD) among Filipinos. According to DOST-FNRI studies, drinking five glasses of Tubig Talino, a mix of purified water and Water Plus I2, meets 33% of the daily recommended energy and nutrient intake (RENI) of iodine in adults.

Online Technology Needs Assessment (TNA) meeting with Ms. Jeanina Rogador, Science

Research Specialist II, and Ms. Anna Marie Daigan, Science Research Specialist II of DOST PSTC-Cavite, and Ms. Teresita S. Tatlonghari, General Manager of M2EWC.

Further, the PARC also adopted the DOST-FNRI Iron Fortified Rice Technology. True to its commitment to secure safe and nutritious food for Barangay Palangue and the entire municipality of Naic, Cavite, the adoption of the technology supplies rice, a staple food in the

country, and responds to the continued prevalence of Iron Deficiency Anemia (IDA).

The above-mentioned DOST-developed technologies, the DOST-ITDI Portable Biogas Digester, the DOST-FNRI Tubig Talino and Iron Fortified Rice Technology, among other technologies, are available for adoption in Cavite (email: pstccavitedost@gmail.com) and in other provinces in CALABARZON (email: dost4a.ord@gmail.com). ## Taliba Soap Manufacturing, PHP Noodle House Inspire SIMCO with their S&T-based enterprises

**SAN LUIS, BATANGAS --** The Science and Technology (S&T)-based enterprises of both Taliba Soap Manufacturing and People Helping People (PHP) Noodle House have left an inspiration to members of San Luis Multipurpose Cooperative (SIMCO) who conducted a benchmarking activity last January 13.

General Manager, Ms. Marites Mirez expressed her admiration on how both organizations continuously employ their enterprise despite certain limitations in workforce and operations. On her message during the briefing meeting, she stressed how inspiring the members are who at their early ages still manage to run these enterprises.

"Kakahanga po na kahit kami sa kanila ay senior citizens ay napapatakbo sa ng maayos ang ilang negosyo," she said.

The discussion of both enterprises' success stories is the root of Ms. Mirez's admiration. At Taliba Soap Manufacturing's production facility, Ms. Luzviminda S. Bonsol, Organization Manager, mentioned how they all worked hard to establish and sustain the enterprises of their enterprise. She shared to members of SIMCO how they looked for market channels when it was too difficult to introduce their product at the very beginning. "Lahat kami natin after magproduce, glalako pa ng product sa mai-dispose. Kanyangyung lako kami. Hiwalay para lang makilala ang aming produkto," she mentioned.

In terms of workforce and individual income, Ms. Bonsol highlighted how they are still able to perform their individual functions and benefit from considering their ages. To her, their age has never

been an issue in carrying out their functions and in running their enterprise. Although majority of them are senior citizens, Ms. Bonsol took pride in sharing to members of SIMCO that they are all in good health.

At PHP Noodle House's production facility, a different set of women unfolded their success story. Ms. Aurea Addun, President, shared how they strived to form the enterprise with the help of PHP and revived it after a downfall despite financial challenges. Similar to Taliba Soap Manufacturing, PHP Noodle House has also experienced looking for distribution channels in different parts of Batangas province before having established markets, as Ms. Addun mentioned.

During the interview, both Ms. Bonsol and Ms. Addun underscored the assistance that a private couple in their barangay offer. To them, their enterprises would have not been possible if not because of the couple who offer them support and financial assistance, aside from being advisers, without expecting anything in return. According to Ms. Bonsol, the primary objective of the couple was to make women in their barangay productive by providing them with a sustainable livelihood so they can avoid gambling. "Ayaw nila na may makikitang miyembro na nasa sugalan. Mahigpit nilang ipinagbabawal yun. Hinihikayat din nila na magsimba ang miyembro

kung makakasimba," she added.

Ms. Mila Achico, member of SIMCO's Board of Directors, articulated her regard to both the organizations after hearing their stories. Since she's also working for Batangas City's Office of Senior Citizen, she also conveyed her idea of bringing some senior citizens to both enterprises to inspire them of the maximum they can do as aged group of individuals. Likewise, she reiterated how they can adopt the strategies that the group executed in introducing their products, looking for markets, and sustaining their enterprises.

A tour in both facilities was also conducted. Ms. Rufina Salvador, former President of Taliba Soap Manufacturing, explained how the production process takes place. She also showed the different processing areas in the facility and provided some insights and practices they observe during production. Meanwhile, Ms. Aurea Addun facilitated the tour at PHP Noodle House.

There was an on-going production at the time of visit and members of SIMCO were able to witness how they function with strict compliance to food safety.

# Imus LCE prepares the city for the arrival of COVID-19 vaccines

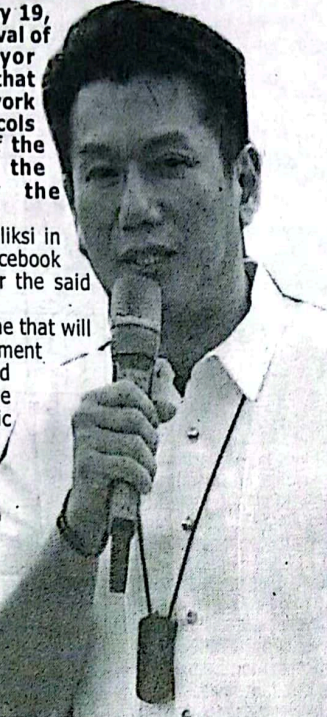

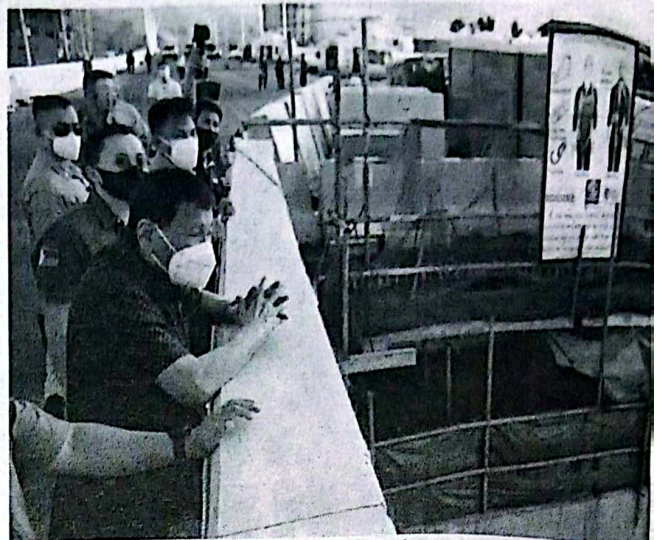

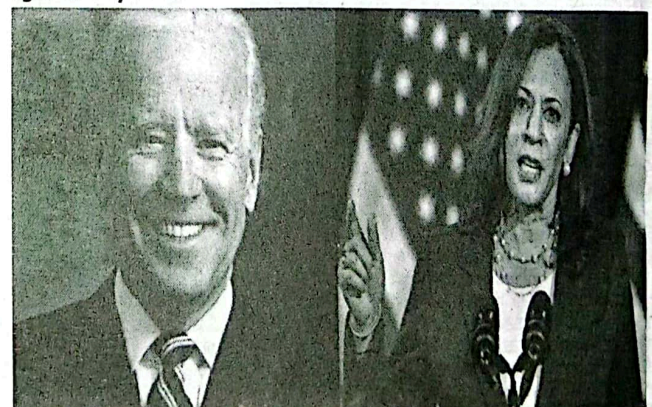
