120 families left homeless by Cavite fire to spend Christmas in evacuation centers

Around 120 families in Cavite will spend Christmas in evacuation centers after a fire razed a residential area at the boundary of Imus and Kawit early morning in Monday.



According to Dano Tingcungco's report in 24 Oras, no one was injured or died from the incident. However, many residents lost their possessions to the fire.

"Hindi ko pa iniisip yung bukas...wala pa akong naisip na plano kasi walang natira sa amin. Zero talaga."

Lahat ng pinaghirapan ko, lahat ng pinaghirapan ng asawa ko, ubos na ubos talaga," said Anna, one of the residents, as she cries about their situation two days before the Christmas.

(I'm not thinking about tomorrow...I have yet to make any plans because we lost everything. It's really zero. Everything that I and my husband worked hard for were lost.)

In Tinabunan Elementary School, one of the three designated evacuation centers, Margie Gersalia was able to save not only the documents of her children but also the pink teddy bear of her daughter.

"Ang nasa utak ko na lang talaga ay nakaligtas po kaming lahat, buhay po kaming lahat," said

Gersalia.

(I'm just thinking that at least we are safe and everyone in my family is still alive.)

Fire authorities are still investigating the cause of the blaze, but this is not the first time it happened in the area.

"Yung area na 'yun, hindi po first time na nasunog. May history na po sila. Kadalasan po ay unattended candle po," said FO3 James Luther Nones, Imus Fire Station Investigator, noting that the last fire incident was in 2019.

(It's not the first time that a fire happened in that area. There was already a history of fire in that area. The usual cause of fire is an unattended candle.)

Meanwhile, the local government of Imus has already provided financial assistance and other necessities to the victims. It will also replace the noche buena packages that were already distributed but were also destroyed by the fire. — **Vince Angelo Ferreras/RF, GMA Integrated News**

Samsung reveals grand winners of Solve for Tomorrow 2024

Manila, Philippines – Samsung Electronics Philippines Corporation (SEPCO) has revealed the winners of its second Solve for Tomorrow competition, a global initiative designed to inspire young innovators to develop solutions for societal issues and become drivers of positive change in their communities.

In its sophomore year, Solve for Tomorrow received almost 300 entries from teams across the country composed of Grades 8-10 students of government-managed Science High Schools, which were narrowed down to 10 finalists. This year's competition focuses on empowering students as the next generation of heroes, using technology to shape a better future.

Present during the awarding ceremony in New World Makat Hotel was SEPCO President Min Su Chu, Chief Financial Officer Taekyun Kim, Department of Education Assistant Secretary Georgina H. Yang and Embassy of South Korea Counselor Kwon Soon Hyun.

It was a close battle among the finalists, but three teams rose above the rest with their design solution's innovativeness, creativity, and potential to create a positive and sustainable impact.

Championing Next Gen Heroes

This year's Grand Prize winner hails from Lipa City Science Integrated National High School with members Celine Harriette A. Almarez, Margaret S. Bautista, and Marcus Miguel Q. Mojares and their adviser, Francis Darril A. Albo. Their entry, "Hi-LoWall: A Solar-Powered Rice Husk Fog Wall Utilizing Evaporative Cooling," presents a water-efficient solution using rice husk biochar fog walls to combat rising heat indices caused by El Niño, which disrupts public schools

through class suspensions, schedule changes, and altered learning modalities.

They will receive PHP 500,000 worth of Samsung devices for the school, PHP 100,000 cash prize for the team members, PHP 20,000 for the teacher, and Samsung phones and tablets for team members and their teachers.

The second prize winners are from Philippine Science High School-Main Campus with members Chael Matthew Sze, Alden Julian Gonzales, and Janine Yrah Tolentino, with their adviser, Book Kristoffer Lauw. Their entry, "Croprotech," aims to boost crop production and revenue for Philippine farmers through a network of modules that prevent soil degradation and enhance land quality control.

They will receive PHP 320,000 worth of Samsung devices for the school, PHP 70,000 for team members, PHP 15,000 cash prize for the teacher, and Samsung phones and tablets for team members and their teacher.

The third prize winners were from Calamba City Science Integrated School with members "Ysabella Genesis Maderazo, Danise Ann Mariele S. Casilao, Frances Kylie A. Montano, and Wesley Aviv M. Macatangay, with their adviser, Marinel A. Degoma. Their entry, "SIMS: A Smart Infrastructure Monitoring System," uses sound and thermal sensors to analyze structural integrity, enhancing public safety, reducing maintenance costs, and helping communities better withstand natural disasters.

They will receive PHP 500,000 worth of Samsung devices for the school, PHP 100,000 cash prize for the team members, PHP 20,000 for the teacher, and Samsung phones and tablets for team members and their teachers.

The other seven teams to make it to the finals and will receive Php 15,000 for their team and Php 5,000 for their teacher include "PAROLA: Utilizing Rain and Floodwater to

LEE DEMANDS IMPROVED PH HEALTHCARE SERVICES BY 2025

The first to expose the billions of available funds of the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) in 2023, Manoy Wilbert "Wise" Lee said that the recently approved benefit increases by the state health insurer's Board are still lacking.

The Bicolano lawmaker who has persistently fought for additional benefit increases for more than a year now pointed out that amid controversies surrounding the "unused" funds of PhilHealth, the Department of Health (DOH) should waste no time in providing better medical care services that every Filipino deserve.

"Kahit para na tayong sirang plaka sa paulit-ulit na panawagan na gamitin ang pondo ng kalusugan para sa kalusugan, di tayo titigil dahil ito ang talagang makakabawas sa pangamba ng ating mga kababayan, lalo na sa pagkakasakit dahil sa mahal na gamot at pagpapagamot," Lee lamented.

"Maganda sanang Pamasko sa ating mga kababayan kung sumunod lang ang DOH sa ipinaglaban at naikasa nating commitment na nilagdaan mismo ng pinuno nito para

mapababa ang gastos ng bawat Pilipino sa pagpapa-ospital. Pero ang inaprubahan na mga dagdag benepisyo kamakailan ay kulang-kulang sa napagkasunduan," he added.

Last Dec. 16, the PhilHealth Board of Directors approved a 50% increase in selected case rates, in addition to emergency care benefit, glasses and optometric services for children, open-heart surgery benefits and pediatric cataract extractions.

Lee said that the DOH, which leads the PhilHealth Board and the Benefits Committee (BenCom) must put as its New Year's Resolution to be more proactive in increasing the health benefit packages of Filipinos, especially with its more than P500 billion or half a trillion available funds.

The solon from Bicol then reiterated his sentiment during the Dec.

17 House Committee on Good Government and Public Accountability hearing on zero subsidy for PhilHealth, saying "Nasaan ang hustisya kung milyon-milyong Pilipino pa rin ang papasan sa mga pagdurusa at mapagkakaitan ng mga dagdag na benepisyong pangkalusugan dahil sa pagka-manhid at kapalpakan ng ilang namumuno?"

"Napakalaking insulto at kalokohan na gamitin ang pondong kailangang-kailangan para sa mga dagdag na serbisyong pangkulusugan sa mararangyang okasyon o ilipat ito sa mga proyekto na hindi naman ikamamatay ng mga Pilipino kung hindi maipagawa," Lee reiterated.

"Paano naatim ng ilan na maging makupad sa pagtupad ng kanilang tungkulin at ipagkait ang mga dagdag na benepisyo sa gamot at

pagpapagamot na pwedeng magligtas sa buhay ng milyon-milyon nating kababayan?"

"The focus should remain on addressing the gaps in the country's healthcare system. Napakalaking kasalanan na hindi ibigay ang pondo at suporta na kaya namang ibigay, at sa halip ay gamitin lang ito kung saan iilan lang ang makikibanang," he added.

A staunch health advocate, Lee successfully fought for the 30% increase in PhilHealth benefits implemented last February 2024, after more than a decade that PhilHealth case rates were not reviewed and adjusted, making its coverage no longer responsive to the hospitalization cost of beneficiaries.

The solon from Bicol constantly called on the DOH and PhilHealth leadership to implement more benefit increases, which resulted to securing



their commitments during the House Budget Deliberations last September 25, to provide a comprehensive plan to lower the out-of-pocket medical expenses of Filipinos.

It can be recalled that the 2025 DOH budget deliberations ended in a mic scuffle as Lee would like to put on record the said health commitments he secured from DOH and PhilHealth.

He also recently filed a measure to investigate the P11 billion worth of expired medicines and vaccines in DOH warehouses and health facilities flagged by the Commission on Audit (COA), stressing that this kind of inefficiency is a big disservice to millions of Filipinos who are dying because they cannot

afford to buy medicines. "Hinding-hindi natin titigilan ang paniningil sa mga ipinangako sa ating mga dagdag na benepisyong pangkalusugan. Hindi rin natin tatantanan ang pagpapanagot sa mga manhid at walang pakialam, hanggang masiguro natin na ito na ang huli nilang Pasko at Bagong Taon sa posisyon dahil wala silang malasakit at hindi nila ginagawa ang kanilang trabaho," Lee stressed.

"Hindi na dapat paabutin ng panibagong Pasko o Bagong Taon ang pagpapatupad ng mga dagdag na benepisyong pangkalusugan. Ang gamot at pagpapagamot, dapat libre na ng gobyerno. Ang layunin ko: Gamot Mo, Sagot Ko!" Lee said.


experiences with everyone.


