

Three cities in Cavite launch eBOSS

GENERAL TRIAS CITY — This city and three other cities in Cavite formally launched their respective Business-One-Stop-Shop on Jan. 2 to afford the residents and investors some ease of tax payment.

Aside from General Trias, the city governments of Dasmarinñas, Imus and Bacoor have also launched their respective programs to encourage investors to pay taxes on time.

Imus City, under Mayor Alex Advincula, accelerated the Electronic Business One-Stop Shop (eBOSS) for Imus entrepreneurs applying for business permits from Jan. 2 to Jan. 20. The city also is offering the investors a discounted rate.

Taxpayers may visit the New Imus City Government Center, Imus Boulevard, Barangay Malagasang 1-G, here. It is open on Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., and every Saturday, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. ▶ **THREE CITIES • 5**

"Megawide Construction Corp. formally received the notice of award dated 26 December 2024 from the Office of the Provincial Governor of the Province of Cavite," Megawide told the stock exchange on Thursday.

The P1.87-billion Cavite BRT is a joint venture between Megawide and property development company Maplecrest Group, Inc.

The award is still pending the joint venture proponents' fulfillment of all necessary conditions

and submission of required documentation, Megawide said.

The Cavite BRT System project covers the development, operation, and maintenance of a bus rapid transit and P2P

DOST Quezon Delivered New Drying Equipment to Boost SICAP's Cacao Production

The Department of Science and Technology (DOST) Quezon enhanced the drying efficiency of cacao production by providing 20 units of multi-purpose solar speed drying trays, known as PORTASOL, to the Samahan sa Industriya ng Cacao na Pangkabuhayan (SICAP) Quezon Agriculture Cooperative. The distribution took place in Tayabas City on recently.

Each PORTASOL unit included 12 tiers of trays, a pyramid roof rack, a manual booklet, and a hood. This innovative technology features a ventilated design and a multi-level stacking system, which helps reduce mildew, rot, and pest infestations while optimizing storage capacity for dried crops. The equipment also allows farmers to dry cacao more efficiently, even during overcast weather.

SICAP Quezon Agricultural Cooperative, composed of farmer members from 38 municipalities and two cities in Quezon Province, envisions cacao production as a key driver for improving the

livelihood of local farmers.

With this new equipment, the cooperative has continued to enhance its production capacity, already achieving over 1,700 kilograms of dried fermented cacao beans. (By Unice Faith N. Cataquiz)

PhilHealth benefit for heart disease up by over fifteen - fold

As Filipinos celebrate the holiday season, the Department of Health (DOH) recently called on people to prioritize their well-being by practicing moderation in their food intake and maintaining an active lifestyle.

This is particularly important given that cardiovascular diseases, specifically ischemic heart disease (IHD), remain the leading cause of death in the Philippines.

To provide expanded financial coverage associated with heart disease treatment, the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) significantly increased its benefits coverage for Ischemic Heart Disease - Acute Myocardial Infarction (IHD - A MI) or "heart attack" for all inpatient admissions effective December 21, 2024.

PhilHealth Circular No. 2024 - 0032 published on

the same date provides coverage for (1) Percutaneous Coronary Intervention (PCI) at P524,000 from P30,300, an increase of 1,629 percent; (2) Fibrinolysis at P133,500 from P30,290 or a 900% increase; (3) Emergency Medical Services with Coordinated Referral and Interfacility Transfer at P21,900; and (4) Cardiac Rehabilitation after PCI at P66,140.

The expanded PhilHealth benefits packages for heart attack ensure that patients receive timely medical treatment by including emergency medical transport services to a capable health facility and all the medical

interventions needed to ensure survival and good patient outcomes.

We understand the significant financial burden that heart disease can place on families," said PhilHealth President and Chief Executive Officer Emmanuel R. (point-to-point) route with an alignment of 42 kilometers stretching through Imus, General Trias, Tanza, Kawit, Trece Martires, and its surrounding areas, while also providing a link to Metro Manila via the Parañaque Integrated Terminal Exchange (PITX), information from the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) Center's website showed.

PPP Center said previously that the Cavite BRT System had a deadline of Dec. 23 last year for the project's

comparative challenge. The joint venture submitted its unsolicited proposal in April 2023.

The project is divided into two phases. The first phase of the project is expected to commence operations by 2026; the project's Phase 1 includes the construction of terminals 1 and 2, construction and operations, and maintenance of 27 stations, BRT alignment, and P2P alignment.

The second phase of the project involves the BRT alignment of 13.79

kilometers from station 27 to the New Capitol Building of Cavite and the P2P alignment of over 34 kilometers from PITX to Terminal 3.

In 2015, Megawide's unit MWM Terminals, Inc. bagged the 35-year contract to construct and operate the PITX, which is an integrated and multimodal terminal.

Megawide's other unsolicited proposal, the P1.19-billion Baguio City Integrated Terminal, is set to undergo a Swiss challenge this year.

P2M-worth of illegal firecrackers seized in CALABARZON

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) – Around 43,000 assorted illegal firecrackers in the Calabarzon region, with an estimated value of P2 million were seized during the Holiday season, the Police Regional Office-4A reported.



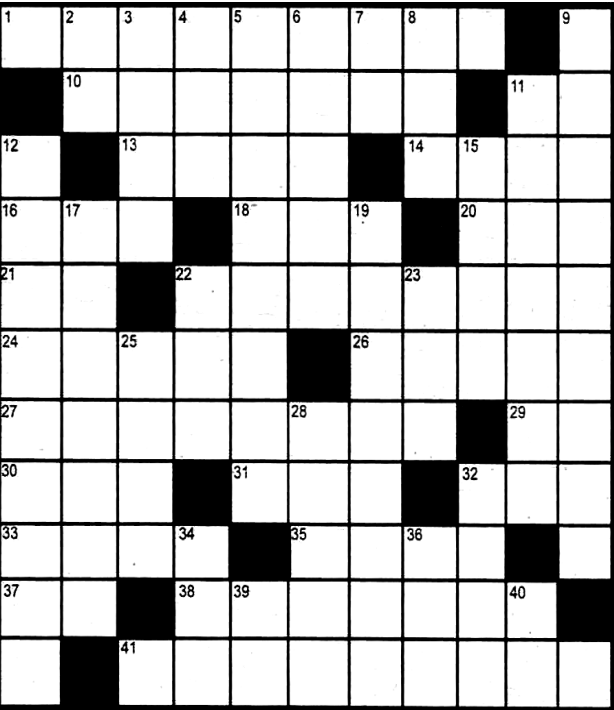
In a statement posted on Facebook, PRO-4A Regional Director, Police Brig. Gen. Paul Kenneth Lucas attributed the confiscation to its anti-firecracker drive and the public's cooperation. "Our heightened vigilance during this yuletide season, public information campaigns, and strict enforcement of firecracker regulations contributed to this remarkable achievement, and I thank our personnel

and the public for their cooperation," Lucas stated. Meanwhile, firecracker-related injuries recorded at 271 from December 1, 2023 to January 1 2024 dropped compared to only 160 injuries during the same period from December 1, 2024 to January 1, 2025. In Laguna, an executive order was released to support the anti-illegal firecracker campaign and directed police forces to tighten security and

ensure public safety. In an interview with the Philippine Information Agency – Laguna, Vice Governor Karen Agapay said they collaborated with the PNP to curb the use of illegal firecrackers to prevent accidents and injuries. "This is a reiteration on the strict implementation of prohibition on firecrackers, especially the use of boga here in Laguna," Agapay said. However, nine cases of illegal discharge of

firearms were recorded by PRO-4A covering the period December 18, 2024 to January 1, 2025. Those behind the illegal discharge will face criminal charges under Republic Act No. 10591 or the Comprehensive Firearms and Ammunition Regulations Act. The PNP said administrative cases will likewise be filed against law enforcement or military personnel involved in the illegal act. (CO/PIA-4A)
