ISANG CAVITEÑANG GURO, MAGTUTURO NG WIKANG TAGALOG SA HARVARD UNIVERSITY

Sa panahon kung kailan patuloy na hinaharap ng wikang Filipino ang hamon ng globalisasyon at kolonyal na pananaw, isang makasaysayang tagumpay ang muling nagpaalab sa damdaming makabayan ng maraming Pilipino.

Si Lady Aileen Orsal, isang dating guro ng Filipino sa Cavite State University, ay naging kauna-unahang Pilipinong instruktur na magtuturo ng Tagalog sa Harvard University isa sa pinakamataanda, pinakaprestihyoso, at pinakamahigpit na pamantasan sa buong mundo.

Hindi lamang ito personal na tagumpay para kay Orsal; isa itong makapangyarihang simbolo ng pag-angat ng wikang Filipino sa pandaigdigang larangan ng edukasyon.

ISANG PANGARAP NA NAGING MAKASAYSAYAN

Lumaki si Lady Aileen Orsal bilang isang edukador na may malalim na pagmamahal sa wika at kulturang Pilipino.

Sa loob ng maraming taon, inialay niya ang kanyang propesyon sa pagtuturo ng Filipino, komunikasyon, at pamamahayag sa Cavite State University.

Hindi lamang niya itinuro ang teknikalidad ng wika, kundi pati ang kahalagahan nito bilang salamin ng identidad, kasaysayan, at kaluluwa ng sambayanang Pilipino.



Sa bawat aralin, dala niya ang paniniwalang ang wikang Filipino ay hindi lamang midyum ng komunikasyon kundi isang buhay na kasaysayan ng pakikibaka, pag-asa, at pagkakaisa ng bansa.

Ang kanyang dedikasyon ay nagbukas ng mas malawak na oportunidad nang siya ay mapiling maging Fulbright Foreign Language Teaching Assistant sa Estados Unidos.

Doon higit niyang naranasan kung paano pinahahalagahan ng ibang bansa ang pag-aaral ng mga katutubong wika at kultura.

At mula roon, nagsimula ang landas patungo sa isang makasaysayang yugto ng kanyang karera.

HARVARD AT ANG PAGKILALA SA WIKANG FILIPINO

Noong 2023, opisyal na inanunsyo ng Harvard University ang pagbubukas ng mga kursong Tagalog.

Ang hakbang na ito ay bunga ng lumalawak na pagkilala sa Filipino bilang isa sa mga pinakaginagamit na wika sa Estados Unidos, lalo na sa lumalaking komunidad ng mga Pilipino at Filipino-Americans.

Mahalaga ang desisyong ito ng Harvard sapagkat matagal nang nakikita ang mga wikang Asyano tulad ng Mandarin, Japanese, at Korean bilang pangunahing larangan ng pag-aaral, samantalang ang Filipino ay



nananatiling nasa gilid ng pandaigdigang akademya.

Ang pagbubukas ng kursong Tagalog ay tila pagsira sa matagal nang pader ng invisibility na bumabalot sa kulturang Pilipino sa Kanluran.

At sa sentro ng makasaysayang pagbabagong ito ay si Lady Aileen Orsal.

Sa ilalim ng Harvard University Asia Center at Department of South Asian Studies, itinatalaga siya upang magturo ng elementary at intermediate Tagalog courses habang ipinagpapatuloy ang kanyang graduate studies sa communication at Philippine Studies.

HIGIT PANG PAGTUTURO NG WIKA

Para kay Orsal, ang pagtuturo ng Tagalog sa Harvard ay hindi lamang simpleng pagtuturo ng bokabularyo o gramatika.

Ito ay isang anyo ng cultural diplomacy, isang paraan upang ipakilala sa mundo ang lalim ng kulturang Pilipino, ang kasaysayan ng kolonyalismo, ang yaman ng panitikan, at ang

pagkakakilanlan ng mga Pilipino.

Sa bawat salitang itinuturo niya, kasabay nitong ipinapakilala ang diwa ng "kapwa," "bayanihan," at "pagkamakabayan" mga konseptong hindi madaling maisalin ngunit malalim na nakaugat sa kulturang Pilipino.

Sa isang institusyong gaya ng Harvard, ang pagkakaroon ng kursong Filipino ay nangangahulugang kinikilala na rin ang boses ng mga Pilipino sa pandaigdigang usapin ng kultura, akademya, at kasaysayan.

TAGUMPAY NG BAWAT GURONG PILIPINO

Sa kanyang pahayag, sinabi ni Orsal na hindi lamang ito pansariling tagumpay kundi tagumpay rin ng lahat ng gurong Pilipinong walang sawang nagsusulong ng wikang Filipino sa iba't ibang bahagi ng mundo.

Tunay ngang maraming guro sa Pilipinas ang nagtuturo sa ilalim ng mababang sahod, kakulangan ng suporta, at limitadong pagkilala.

Ngunit ipinakita ng kwento ni Orsal na ang dedikasyon sa edukasyon at kultura ay maaaring magbunga ng pandaigdigang impluwensya.

Ang kanyang tagumpay ay nagsisilbing inspirasyon hindi lamang sa mga guro kundi maging sa kabataang Pilipino na minsang nahihiyang gamitin o ipagmalaki ang sariling wika.

ISANG PAALALA SA HALAGA NG SARILING WIKA

Sa mundong mabilis yumuyuko sa impluwensya ng banyagang kultura, mahalagang paalala ang kwento ni Lady Aileen Orsal: hindi kailanman maliit ang wikang Filipino.

Ang isang wikang minsang minamaliit at tinatawag na "pangkaranian lamang" ay ngayon ay itinuturo na sa isa sa pinakadakilang unibersidad sa mundo.

Mula sa mga silid-aralan ng Cavite hanggang sa makasaysayang bulwagan ng Harvard, pinatunayan ni Lady Aileen Orsal na ang wikang Filipino ay may lugar sa pandaigdigang entablado at karapat-dapat itong marinig, pag-aralan, at ipagmalaki.

Sa kanyang tagumpay, muling nabuhay ang isang mahalagang katotohanan: kapag ipinaglaban ng Pilipino ang sariling wika at kultura, walang hangganan ang maaaring marating nito.

Ang Casa Hacienda de Tejeros ay isa sa mga kilalang makasaysayang lugar sa Cavite na may kaugnayan sa Tejeros Convention noong 1897.

Itinuturing itong mahalagang bahagi ng

kasaysayan dahil dito isinagawa ang kauna-unahang halalang pampanguluhan sa bansa at kinikilala rin bilang pinagmulan ng Philippine Army.

Ayon sa RESCOM, PA, ang pagbisita ay nagsilbing isang Lakbay-Aral na naglalayong palawakin ang kaalaman ng mga kawani tungkol sa pambansang kasaysayan, habang pinatitibay ang diwa ng patriotismo, pamumuno, pagkakaisa, at paglilingkod sa bayan.

Bukod sa pagpapahalaga sa mga sakripisyo ng mga bayaning Pilipino, naging daan din ang aktibidad upang higit na mapalakas ang samahan at pagkakaisa ng mga kalahok.

Itinampok din nito ang kahalagahan ng pangangalaga sa mga pamana ng pangkasaysayan bilang bahagi ng pagpapatuloy ng mga adhikain ng hukbong sandatahan sa paghubog ng mga lingkod-bayan at pagtataguyod ng nation-building.

Sa pamamagitan ng naturang programa, muling ipinakita ng RESCOM, PA ang kanilang dedikasyon sa pagpapanatili ng makasaysayang kamalayan at pagpapalakas ng pagpapahalaga ng kanilang mga tauhan sa mahalagang papel ng Philippine Army sa kasaysayan at pag-unlad ng bansa. **(ni Sid Samaniego)**

Metro Manila and nearby provinces," said MPTC Chief Tollways Development and Engineering Officer Gil F. Amilbangsa.

The MPTC Flood Mitigation Forum 2026 gathered key representatives from the Office of Civil Defense (OCD), Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA), and Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Office (PENRO). Participants from the Toll Regulatory Board (TRB), Philippine Reclamation Authority (PRA), and PEA Tollway Corporation (PEATC) also took part in the discussions and the

sharing of initiatives.

LGU representatives from Las Piñas, Parañaque, Pasay, Taguig, Cavite, and Laguna provided valuable insights during the forum, along with key leaders including Cavite Governor Francisco Gabriel "Abeng" Diaz Remulla, Office of Civil Defense Director Jose Harry M. Barber, Biñan City Councilor Titus Bautista, and Former Senator Cynthia Villar of Villar SIPAG Foundation.

Flood risk area data and assessments were provided by AMH Philippines, which was engaged by MPT South, to support evidence-based identification of critical flood-prone areas and inform mitigation planning.

Discussions highlighted the impact of improper waste disposal on flooding, particularly in low-lying communities.

LGUs reiterated efforts to strengthen enforcement of anti-littering and solid waste management ordinances, alongside regular declogging of drainage systems and monitoring of critical waterways.

"Effective flood mitigation depends heavily on good governance, which is a core principle in Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) implementation. Participation is essential, as community involvement strengthens ownership and improves the relevance of mitigation measures," said Office of Civil Defense Director Jose Harry M. Barber.

In partnership with barangays and volunteer groups, LGUs continue community-based environmental education campaigns in promoting proper waste segregation, infrastructure planning, and disaster risk reduction initiatives.

"We recognize that multi-sectoral collaboration creates a ripple of hope for communities in the South, especially during typhoon season. We, at MPT South, will continue to work closely with LGUs and national government agencies to translate discussions into action," said MPT South President and General Manager Andrew B. Pangilinan.

The forum concluded with commitments from stakeholders to improve drainage systems, strengthen flood control management, enhance disaster resilience, and reinforce inter-agency coordination.

The Flood Mitigation Forum 2026 underscores the Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation Group's commitment to providing a platform for collaboration and sustained action to address flooding challenges in surrounding communities.

The caravan supports the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to bring public services faster and closer to the people, particularly in underserved and hard-to-reach communities.

"For many pensioners, informal workers, and members in underserved communities, even a single branch visit can mean transportation expenses, lost income, and hours spent in line," SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Joseph M. De Claro said.

"Through the SSS e-Wheels / Palengke Caravan, we are bringing government services directly to communities so

people can access assistance and complete transactions closer to where they live and work," he added.

He explained that the SSS is holding a caravan in public markets to bring its services directly to market vendors and ambulant sellers who are unable to visit branch offices because they cannot leave their small businesses unattended.

The SSS e-Wheels will be deployed in Metro Manila starting on May 25, which targets to serve around 21,500 clients. It will be followed by caravan activities in Calapan, Oriental Mindoro; Legazpi, Albay; Silay City, Negros

Occidental; and Siargao Island, Surigao del Norte on May 27. The nationwide caravan will conclude on May 28 in Virac, Catanduanes.

The mobile caravan will offer services including employer registration, inquiries and verification, Annual Confirmation of Pensioners or ACOP, updating of member data records, issuance of SSS numbers and forms, and online-related transactions such as My.SSS registration, password resetting, Payment Reference Number generation, pension loan applications, and benefit claim applications.

SSS will also deploy for the first time the newly launched facial authentication with liveness

check for ACOP verification during mobile service operations, allowing eligible pensioners to complete verification faster and more conveniently without visiting branches.

From January to April 2026, the SSS conducted a total of 3,294 e-Wheels activities nationwide, serving 239,367 members and residents in last-mile communities. In 2024, the SSS e-Wheels Program received the ASEAN Social Security Association Recognition Award in the innovation category.

"By bringing services closer to the people, we are making SSS more accessible, more responsive and convenient for workers, pensioners, and their families," De Claro said.
