OCD-X Kicks Off National Disaster Resilience Month 2026 with Regionwide DRRM Caravan

CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY — The Office of Civil Defense Regional Office X (OCD-X), in partnership with SM CDO Downtown, officially launched the observance of National Disaster Resilience Month (NDRM) 2026 on July 1 through a Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) Caravan and Static Display, highlighting the region's commitment to building safer and more disaster-resilient communities.

The event, which served as the official regional kick-off, gathered members of the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRMC)-X, local government units, development partners, uniformed services, civil society organizations, schools, volunteers, media representatives, and the public in a unified effort to promote disaster preparedness and resilience.

Representatives of the four thematic pillars of disaster risk reduction and management—Disaster Prevention and Mitigation, Disaster Preparedness, Disaster Response and Early Recovery, and Disaster Rehabilitation and Recovery—joined the opening ceremony, along with officials from various national government agencies and partner organizations.

In his keynote address, OCD-X Regional Director and RDRMC-X Chairperson Antonio B.

Sugarol underscored the significance of this year's theme, "Naghahanda at Kumikilos Tungo sa Panatag na Bagong Pilipinas." He said disaster resilience begins with sustained preparedness, active community participation, and strong partnerships among government agencies, local governments, the private sector, and the public. He urged every Filipino to make preparedness a daily habit rather than an annual activity.

One of the event's highlights was the DRRM Caravan and Static Display, where participating agencies showcased disaster preparedness programs, emergency response equipment, rescue capabilities, and public safety initiatives. Among the participating agencies were DSWD Field Office X, DOST - P H I V O L C S, PAGASA, the Philippine Coast Guard, Philippine National Police, Philippine



Army, Bureau of Fire Protection, Philippine Red Cross, DICT, and other RDRMC-X member agencies.

Local disaster risk reduction and management offices from Cagayan de Oro City, Iligan City, Misamis Oriental, and Camiguin also presented their disaster management programs, emphasizing the critical role of local governments in

strengthening community resilience.

Visitors, including students, families, and disaster risk reduction advocates, toured the exhibits, viewed emergency response vehicles and equipment, and participated in information sessions and demonstrations designed to improve public awareness and preparedness.

Simultaneous launch

activities were likewise held in the provinces of Bukidnon, Lanao del Norte, and Misamis Occidental, demonstrating Northern Mindanao's unified commitment to advancing disaster resilience across the region.

Director Sugarol expressed his gratitude to all participating agencies, local government units, partner organizations, volunteers, schools, civil society groups, media

partners, and SM CDO Downtown for helping make the regional launch a success. He noted that the kick-off marks the beginning of a month-long series of activities aimed at promoting disaster prevention, preparedness, response, recovery, and rehabilitation, while reinforcing the message that disaster resilience is a shared responsibility and a way of life.

DOST-CALABARZON explores collaboration opportunities with GATES Program

The Department of Science and Technology–CALABARZON (DOST-CALABARZON) welcomed representatives of the Geospatial Analytics and Technology Solutions (GATES) Program during a courtesy visit held on June 16, 2026, at the DOST-CALABARZON Regional Office.



Asec. Rodolfo P. Calzado, DOST Assistant Secretary for Development Cooperation, led the courtesy visit together with the GATES delegation from DOST Central Office. The visit aimed to strengthen collaboration on geospatial data initiatives and explore potential areas of partnership with DOST-CALABARZON.

The GATES program is a flagship research and development initiative of DOST that integrates geospatial, hazard, and climate datasets to support disaster risk reduction, climate resilience, and evidence-based governance.

The program is a collaborative platform across DOST offices and partner institutions that promotes inter-agency cooperation, strengthens collaboration, enhances evidence-based policymaking, and maximizes the use of geospatial information for strategic planning and decision-making. During the meeting, the GATES team presented an overview of the program and provided updates on its ongoing deployment efforts.

Asec. Calzado emphasized the program's long-term direction and sustainability. He emphasized efforts to

sustain the GATES Program beyond its project lifespan through various institutional and collaborative mechanisms.

"We are exerting a lot of effort to ensure that it will continue and persist beyond that through several means, including partnerships with external stakeholders," Asec. Calzado said, "I have seen the enthusiasm of DOST-CALABARZON in participating in the GATES Program, and we are now ready to start moving at the regional level."

DOST-CALABARZON also presented its DARIUS-IMPRESSION Project, a digital platform that centralizes the digital

repository of information on projects being implemented by the DOST regional offices. The presentation highlighted potential areas for collaboration between the project and the GATES Program, particularly in data integration, information management, and knowledge-sharing initiatives.

Through this engagement, DOST-CALABARZON continues to foster strategic partnerships that advance the use of science, technology, and innovation in addressing regional development challenges across CALABARZON. (By Harley G. Margallo)
