Editorial

Ensure that VAT refund for foreign tourists is hassle-free

The Value-Added Tax (VAT) Refund Program for foreign tourists, which was recently approved by President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr., is a welcome development.

The program, which is set for implementation in 2024, is among the proposals the Private Sector Advisory Council (PSAC) presented to Marcos to boost the tourism industry. PSAC also recommended the issuance of e-Visa upon arrival to Chinese and Indian nationals, improving airport infrastructure and operations, and promoting tourism investment.

The VAT Refund Program should also be extended to Filipinos living or working abroad as an incentive for them to come home more frequently.

Certainly, the program will be another incentive to attract tourists in order to help revive the tourism industry, which is among the hardest-hit sectors by the Covid-19 pandemic.

With at least 69 countries already implementing their own refund programs, whoever has been tasked to craft the implementing guidelines should carefully study how these countries are carrying out their respective measures. From there, they can pick the best practices and adopt these or even improve on it for seamless and hassle-free implementation.

Limiting the steps in securing VAT refund to a bare minimum would certainly be a good step to begin with. A tedious procedure for refund will defeat the objective of the program. Red tape should be cut.

If it is possible that the refund be given at the point of sale or the store where the item was purchased, then it would be a big boost for the program. There would be less hassle for the tourist who is in the country for a limited period of time. These tourists should be given the opportunity to maximize their stay in the country.



Or, why not waive the VAT to spare the tourist from going through the refund procedure? Through this, time spent for securing the refund may be put to better use, like shopping or visiting tourist spots that would certainly redound to more revenue for the country.

Too much red tape, like what is experienced in some agencies, might defeat the objective of the VAT Refund Program—to boost the tourism industry.

This year, the Department of Tourism aims to attract

4.8 million tourists and projects to generate ₱2.58 trillion in revenue.

This will be a great improvement from the 2.65 million visitors — 2.02 million foreign nationals and 628,445 Filipinos based abroad—recorded from February to December 2022, and the 163,879 arrivals recorded in 2021.

These figures, however, are still a far cry from the pre-pandemic level of 8.26 million tourist arrivals.

DOST, LGU PANGANTUCAN TO COLLABORATE ON FIRST DRONE-ASSISTED REFORESTATION IN MT. KALATUNGAN

To demonstrate the reforestation technology developed by a startup company, the Department of Science and Technology, in partnership with the Local Government Unit of Pangantucan, will conduct the first drone-assisted replanting effort in the mountain ranges of Mt. Kalatungan in Pangantucan, Bukidnon. Mt. Kalatungan's peak is the fifth highest in the country, with a height of 2,287 meters above sea level (masl). The mountain range is also a key biodiversity area.



Through the technology of Galansiyang, Inc., a startup based in Iligan City, dispersing seeds and fertilizer applications through drones will be implemented. Likewise, the monitoring of the seed growth and land cover improvement is via aerial and satellite images. This advanced forest restoration initiative was designed to address the difficulty in terms of remoteness and terrain of the identified four-hectare area — a steep, strenuous two-kilometer walk from the communities within Mt. Kalatungan, and nearing the upper catchment of the Muleta River, which plays an important role in mitigating flood risks.

This project is aimed to train 370 participants in

seed ball production — coating the seeds with soil and organic manure. Majority of the participants are from the Pangantucan Bukidnon Community College, where 300 students were encouraged to take part in this collaboration in order to increase awareness and engagement in environmental conservation. Other participants are from DOST, Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) - Kalatungan, LGU, and members of the IP communities nearby. The dispersing of the 12,000 seed balls and organic fertilizers will be done through a drone engineered by Galansiyang.

Among the seeds that

will be dispersed are Balansihan, Talingtingan, Bagalug, and Ulayan — all endemic tree species referred and approved by the PAMB-Mt. Kalatungan. Seeds will be bought from the IP communities in the area who regularly conduct seed collection straight from the source in the mountain.

For sustainability, Galansiyang Inc. will also be monitoring the seeds' germination for five years.

Aside from reforestation, DOST also aims that the project can contribute to preserving wildlife. Reforestation may restore several habitats and save lives. Currently, Mt. Kalatungan is home to at least 129 animal species and 342 plant species. Many endangered

or vulnerable species are also in the mountain range, such as the Philippine eagle, Philippine hawk eagle, and Philippine deer. Endemic tree species that dominate the area are the katmon, white lauan, red lauan, bagtikan, and bikal-boboi, as well as the threatened almasiga.

The Department of Environment and Natural Resource (DENR) through PAMB - Kalatungan and the IP communities in the area have expressed their full support to the project.

Ayon pa kay Acosta, umaabot lamang sa P2,445.30 ang hulog kada buwan sa bahay na halagang P580,000 na babayaran sa loob ng 30 taon.

Ang maganda pa, walang kailangang ibigay na cash ang mabibigyan ng home loan, sabi pa ni Acosta.

The activity aimed to deploy e-SENTRY to aid in the monitoring of lakewater quality for the people of Tadalac. Through DOST-CALABARZON's support, the said system will now be led and implemented by the LSPU College of Computer Science under the project, "Integration of Predictive Environmental Models Using Deep Learning Analytics in the Systems Implementation-Design" and is set to be further deployed in other areas.

Key officials were present to give their messages of support including Ms. Emelita P. Bagsit, Regional Director of DOST-CALABARZON; Engr. Francisco R. Barquilla III, Assistant Regional Director for Technical Operations of DOST-CALABARZON; Dr. Bobby

Agatep, Vice President for Research and Development to represent Dr. Mario R. Briones, University President of the LSPU System; Engr. Manuel Luis R. Alvares, Campus Director of LSPU-LB; and Mr. Jonardo R. Asor, Project Leader of e-SENTRY.

A ribbon cutting was conducted after each message. Hon. Ambito L. Meneses also gave their Closing Remarks.

In his message, Hon. Meneses expressed the need to look for alternative sources of drinking water for the community of Tadalac. The e-SENTRY, through its various water quality parameters and meteorological datasets, is built to estimate the ecological carrying capacity (ECC) of lakes which can help in strategizing approaches in lake

management, aquaculture development, and ecotourism.

For 2023, the e-SENTRY project targets to gather water quality (through the SENTRY stations) and meteorological datasets (from DOST-PAGASA) to construct robust predictive simulation models based on deep learning algorithms to estimate ECC of lakes. The project is also developing an application software for end-users, such as water monitoring and regulatory agencies, including Local Government Units, to monitor the data gathered by SENTRY stations.

To date, the project has already developed an information system prototype, and has been slowly building an online lake database. The project is anticipated to be completed in August 2023. (By Halyn Lunel Gamboa)

In 2022, the agriculture department listed ten municipalities as beneficiaries of the said grant.

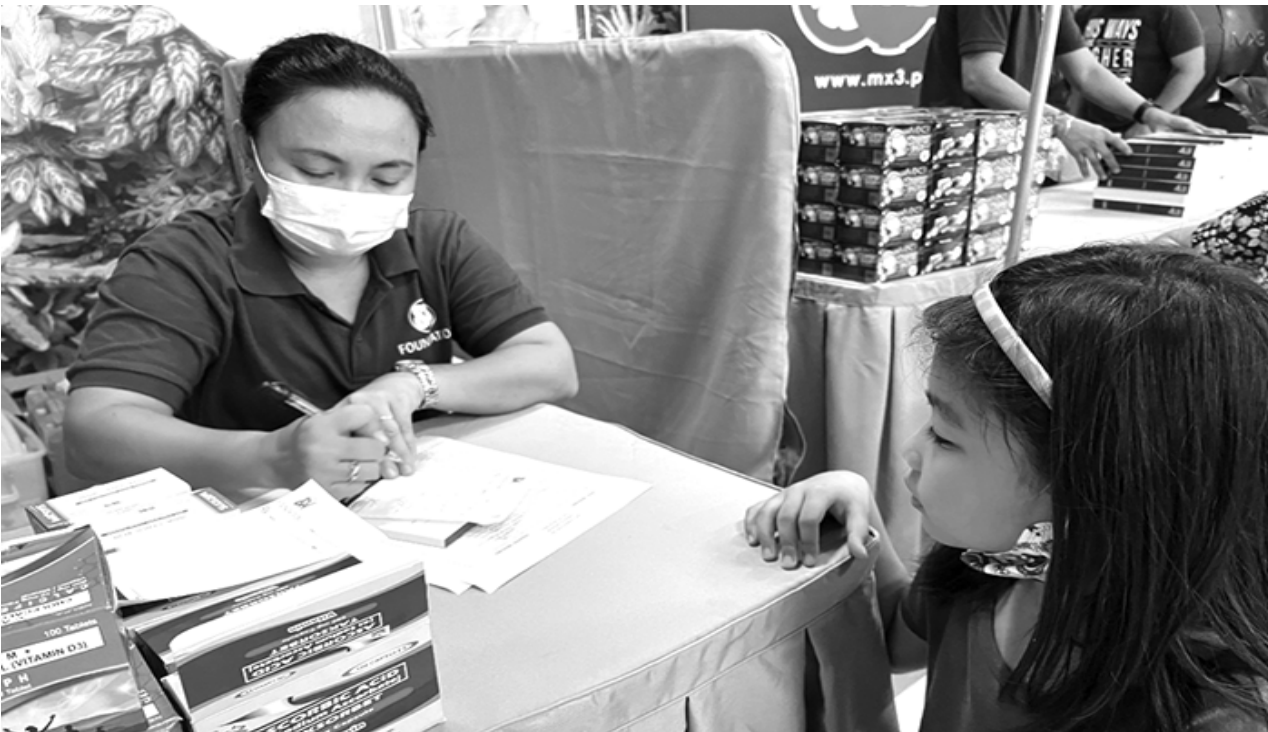

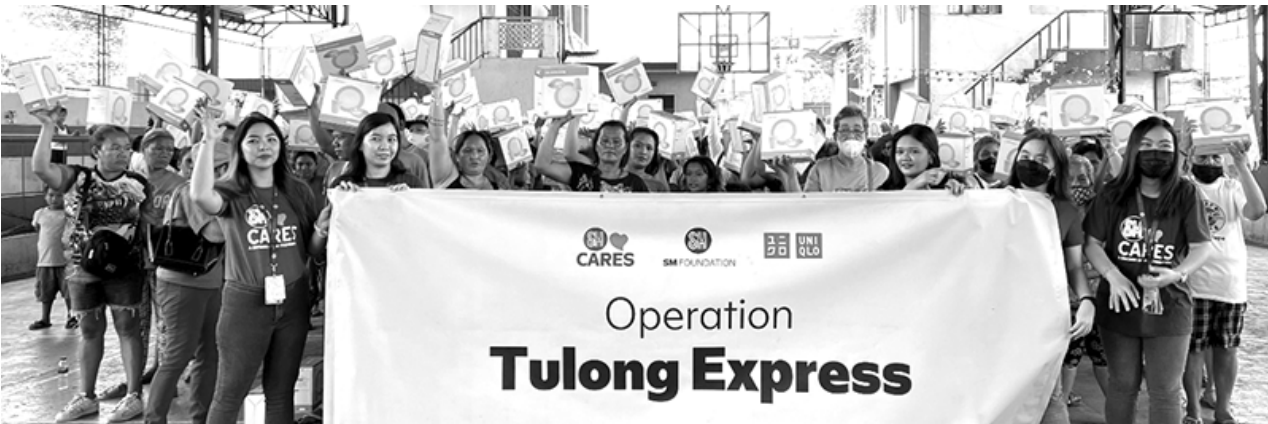
January 25, 2023 is being looked into by the DA.

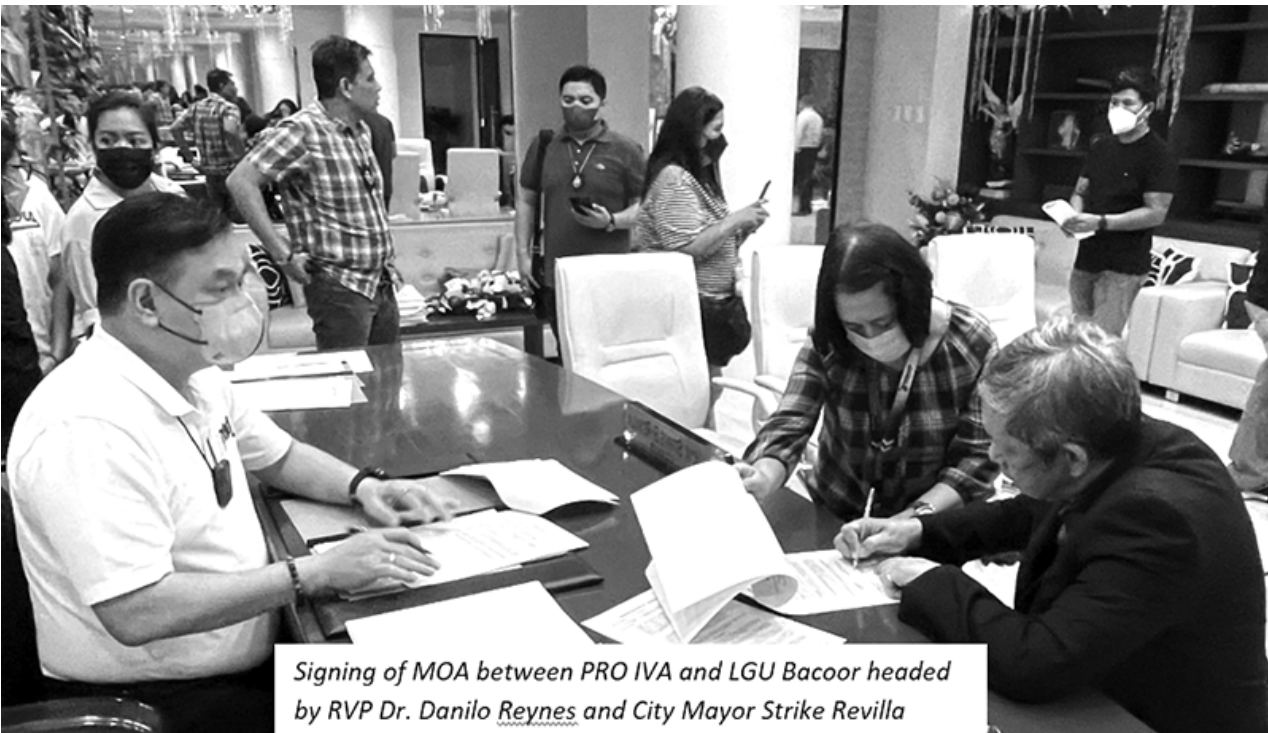

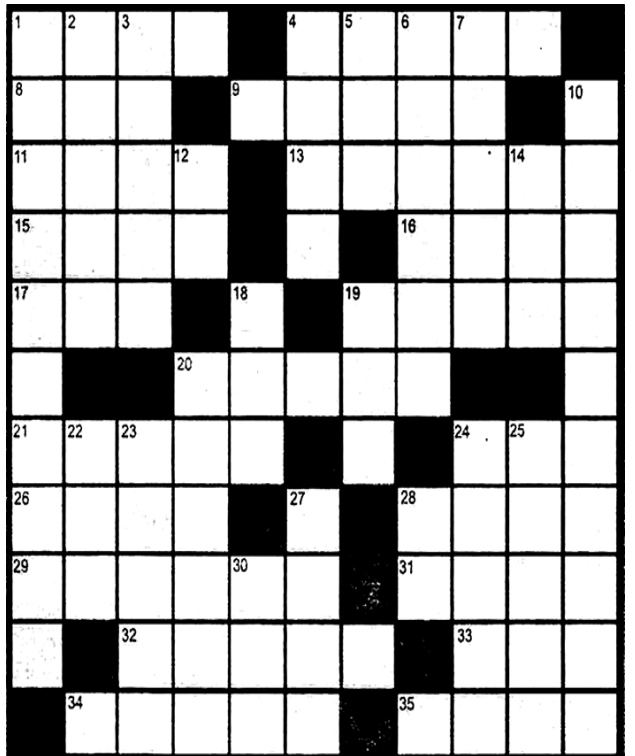

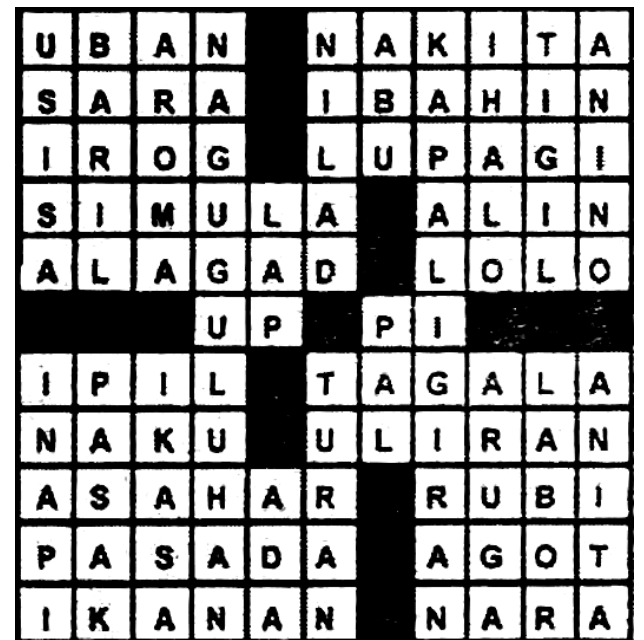
